ADDITIONS TO MSU HOME ECONOMICS FACULTY ANNOUNCED

Mrs. Vanetta Lewis and Mrs. Jessica Krier will be instructors in the Montana State University Home Economics Dept., Missoula, during the coming school year, President Carl McFarland announced.

Mrs. Krier taught home economics at Missoula County High School in 1953-54, and at MSU in 1952-53. She has also taught in Texas and Connecticut. During World War II she worked in communications and public relations with the Women's Reserve of the U. S. Marine Corps in Quantico, Va.; and before that, she was buyer for merchandisers in Aberdeen, S. D., Chicago, Ill., and Seattle, Wash. She has a bachelor's degree from the University of Connecticut and a master's degree from Yale University.

Mrs. Lewis taught in the high schools in Moccasin and Thompson Falls and, from 1949-56, at ,CHS. For the past year she has been Gallatin County home demonstration agent. She holds a B. S. degree from Montana State College, Bozeman, and has done advanced work at both MSC and MSU. In her new post at the University, she will serve as home economics teacher-trainer.
