Dr. Alfred M. Tao and Dr. Clyde E. Noble have been appointed to the staff at Montana State University, Missoula, President Carl McFarland announced today.

Dr. Tao will be an associate professor in the School of Business Administration, teaching finance and statistics. He has been teaching at the University of Hawaii since 1956. He was a visiting professor of statistics at Northwestern University in the summer of 1956. He has been special analyst in statistics and finance for the Libbey-Owens-Ford Glass Co., visiting professor at the University of Toledo, and has taught at St. Bonaventure, Carleton College, and National Tsinghua University. He received his B.A. in Hautes Etudes Industrielles et Commerciales, and was awarded his M.A., M.B.A., and Ph.D. from Harvard.

Dr. Noble will be an associate professor in the Psychology Dept., teaching general and theoretical courses in psychology and directing graduate research.

He has been an assistant professor at Louisiana State University since 1953. His experience includes project director and research psychologist, Human Resources

Research Center; graduate assistant, State University of Iowa; instructor at Tulane, and research fellow at the U. S. Naval Air Station. He received his B.A. and M.S. from Tulane, and Ph. D. from the State University of Iowa. He has had numerous articles in professional journals.
