MICROBIOLOGISTS WILL MEET IN MISSOULA

"Hypersensitivity" will be the topic of the first conference of Montana microbiologists, slated for Saturday, March 1, at Montana State University, Missoula, according to Dr. John J. Munoz, chairman of the MSU Bacteriology Dept.

All microbiologists in the area are urged to attend the meeting, which will become an annual event if sufficient interest is shown in this first conference, Dr. Munoz said.

The program will include talks on various aspects of hypersensitivity by Dr. S. Salvin of the Rocky Mountain Laboratory, Hamilton; Dr. E. J. Eichwald of Deaconess Hospital, Great Falls; Dr. Robert Stier, Jr., of Spokane, Wash., and Dr. Munoz.

Dr. L. D. (sic) Smith of Montana State College, Bozeman, who suggested the meeting, will be chairman of the sessions, which will begin at 1:10 p.m. He will also preside at a business meeting scheduled for 3 p.m.
