KRIEGER ACCEPTS MSU POSITION

Frederick W. Krieger, president of a Seattle contracting and manufacturing firm for the past six years, has accepted an appointment as superintendent of buildings and grounds at Montana State University, Acting President Gordon B. Castle announced.

Krieger, a native of Columbus and a former MSU track star, will arrive in Missoula the latter part of May to take up his duties at the University. He will succeed Marcus J. Bourke.

As superintendent of buildings and grounds, Krieger will be responsible for the maintenance and operation of the University's physical plant, Dr. Castle said.

After attending MSU from 1939 - 42, Krieger transferred to the University of Colorado, where he took a B. S. degree in architectural engineering. He was associated with Peter Kiewit and Sons Co., national engineering firm, for more than two years. For the past six years he has been president of United Vinyl Products, Inc., Seattle, Wash.

Krieger held the MSU javelin throw record for 14 years, and he also starred in track events as a student at Park City High School. He is married to the former Adele Hemingway of Bigfork, a 1942 graduate of MSU. They have three children.
