MISSOULA----Montana University golfers will be seeking their first triumphs of the season this week when they play two matches with the Montana State College linksmen. The Grizzly and Bobcat par-busters meet Thursday in Bozeman, then journey to Missoula for a match Saturday afternoon on the MSU course.

Grizzly mentor Ed Chinske had high words of praise for his three and four men-- Jim Bryngelson and Ray Maidment--following last weekend's 12-6 loss to Utah at Missoula. Bryngelson fired a par 72 on the MSU course, the first Grizzly to break even with par in competition since last season. Maidment had a 76 and showed improvement. The Hodges cousins, Bill and Ted, both had poor afternoons with 80s.

"If all four show some improvement this week, we stand a good chance of winning our first matches this year," the mentor summarized. The golfers are 0-5 in Skyline play this season.

MSU tennis players are idle this week, following a stronger-than-expected showing against the Skyline's best net squad, Utah, last Saturday in Missoula. The Grizzlies lost a 4-3 match to the Utes, but MSU sophomores Mike Hogarty and Don Hubbard continued to show the form that should stamp them as two of the best netters in the conference. Hogarty stopped Steve Morgan of Utah in three sets, and then Hubbard scored a real upset in beating Hi Saunders in three sets. Hogarty and Hubbard also upset the dope bucket by beating the two Ute stars in their doubles match.
