MISSOULA, MONTANA---- Bob Gilluly, sports news editor for the Montana University

News Service the past two and one-half years, has resigned his position at MSU to

take an assignment with the Great Falls Tribune, according to an announcement this

week from News Service director Jack Ryan.


Gilluly, who has held the University athletic publicity job since the summer of 1958, will report to work in Great Falls shortly after the first of the year.

No replacement has yet been secured, Ryan said.

"I have fully enjoyed my association with the University, but feel that my new position offers a much greater opportunity," Gilluly commented in his letter of resignation. He also expressed appreciation to the Grizzly coaches Ray Jenkins and Frosty Cox, as well as other athletic staff members, for their cooperation.

Gilluly, a third-generation Montana newspaperman, graduated in journalism from MSU in 1957. He served as editor of the Ravalli Republican in Hamilton prior to his work at MSU.

SILVERTIP SLANTS . .

Friday and Saturday marks renewal of four-games-a-season cage competition with Montana State College. The Grizzlies and Bobcats have split two games a season since 1955. Montana State holds an overall 89-69 edge over Montana in basketball, a marked contrast to the football record of the two schools. The 'Cats completely dominated the sport in the late 20's when the Golden Bobcats were in their prime, while the Grizzlies have had an edge in postwar competition.

It took Grizzly guard Bob O'Billovich just 10 days to complete the transition from an outstanding football quarterback to a highly-capable basketball performer. Bobby-O had a one-day "vacation" after the grid sport concluded, largely to allow him to attend a final team meeting, then the 5-9 junior reported to coach Frosty Cox on Nov. 22. Last Saturday O'Billovich led Grizzly scorers with 15 points against Idaho. "O'Billovich must take pleasure in beating Idaho," was the comment of Vandal athletic director Skip Stahley last Saturday. O'Billovich, it will be remembered, led the Silvertips to an 18-14 win over Stahley's grid Vandals earlier this fall.

Grizzly forward Duane Ruegsegger and Bobcat center Gordon Haugen played together for Billings high school four years ago. Both will be starters for their respective clubs this weekend.
