Alpha Omicron Pi, social sorority, has been invited to organize a collegiate chapter at Montana State University in Missoula, according to Miss Maurine Clow, associate dean of students.

Mrs. Mahlon Leichtamer of Toledo, Ohio, national president, and Mrs. Grant Larned of Milwaukee, Wis., first vice president, will be in Missoula during rush week at the beginning of autumn quarter to help organize the chapter. Alpha Omicron Pi will be the seventh sorority at MSU.

Mrs. Richard Faust of Missoula will be supervisor of the colony.

Members of the sorority will live in University residence halls during the 1964-1965 school year. Plans for future housing will be made when the group has been established, Miss Clow said.

Alpha Omicron Pi was founded at Barnard College, Columbia University, New York, on January 2, 1897. A chapter was organized at Montana State College in Bozeman in 1917.

The social organization will take part in local philanthropy as well as work for its national project, the maintenance of the Social Service Department of the Frontier Nursing Service.
