ONE OF NATION'S TOP JC QUARTERBACKS
COMING TO U OF MONTANA THIS FALL

MISSOULA--

Pete Mullins, a two-year veteran in football at the City College of San Francisco and one of the outstanding junior college quarterbacks in the United States, has decided to attend the University of Montana this fall as a junior.

Jack Swarthout, athletic director and head football coach at the Missoula school, made the announcement Monday.

"We've been after Pete for about three or four months," Swarthout said, "and we're extremely proud that he has chosen to attend the University of Montana."

Mullins, 6-3, 190 pounds, was an All-Golden Gate Conference selection at the signal calling spot last season. A tremendous passer, he completed 76 of 141 passes (54 per cent) for 1,295 yards and 16 touchdowns.

One of his teammates in the backfield was halfback O.J. Simpson, now at the University of Southern California, who is rated by some grid experts as a sure bet for All-American honors this fall.

City College of San Francisco, with Mullins at quarterback, raced to a 9-1 season record in 1966. The team's only loss came in the junior college Prune Bowl.
