### 150 HOME ECONOMISTS EXPECTED TO ATTEND ANNUAL MEET AT MISSOULA

MISSOULA--

"Consumer Credit in Family Management" will be the topic of the 1968 Montana Home Economics Association convention in Missoula Feb. 9-10, according to Mrs. Eli Milodragovich, program chairman for the convention.

The members attending the conference will hear lawyers, economists, credit counselors and home economists talk about various aspects of credit and how it relates to homemaking and home economists.

Mrs. Dorothy Gallup, president of the Montana association and extension research civil defense specialist at Montana State University will open the meeting Thursday evening at a board meeting on the campus of the University of Montana.

General registration will begin at 8:30 Friday, Feb. 9, in the Florence Hotel.

Dr. Sam Chase, UM professor of economics, Dr. William Curtis, asst. professor of economics, Dean Robert Sullivan of the UM law school, and Mr. Ewing H. Heisel, asst. vice president of the Western Montana National Bank of Missoula, will be the main speakers of the conference.

Mrs. Milodragovich said she expects about 150 people, including college chapter members from Bozeman and Missoula, to attend.
