AROTC PROGRAM

MISSOULA--

Selection of 70 men for enrollment in the first year of the advanced Army ROTC at the University of Montana has been announced by Lt. Col. Keith Angwin, UM professor of military science.

The 71 AROTC cadets will be juniors during the 1968-69 academic year and will comprise approximately half of the total number of men in the advanced program. Others in the program are seniors.

Col. Angwin said those selected were from a group of 127 sophomore applicants. Selection was based on physical examinations, a written qualifying exam, academic standing at the University and screening by officers.
