### THE JUSTIN MILLER PRIZE

The Board of Editors takes pleasure in announcing that the Justin Miller prize will be awarded again this year—a \$100 U. S. War Bond to the author of the best student comment published in this issue. Last year's winner was J. Chan. Ettien, writing on the subject, "Prescriptive Right to the Use of Water in Montana."

Justin Miller, Associate Justice of the United States Court of Appeals, Washington, D. C., was a member of the first graduating class of the Montana State University Law School in 1913. The University conferred upon him the honorary degree of Doctorate of Laws in 1941 and his article, "Uniform Criminal Law Administration," appears in the 1941 issue of the Montana Law Review.
