LOCAL MAN HAS LEADERSHIP ROLE
IN UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA CAMPAIGN

Nels E. Turnquist, Sioux Falls resident and retired chairman of the First Bank of South Dakota, is serving in the Office of the Chairman of the University of Montana Campaign.

The Office of the Chairman comprises 23 prominent business and community figures from throughout the nation and provides the leadership to UM's \$6-million Capital Campaign, announced Oct. 26 with \$2 million in hand.

The campaign is a project of the University of Montana Foundation, the non-profit organization that raises private funds for the University of Montana. Turnquist serves as president of the UM Foundation. UM's campaign seeks to endow university professorships, merit scholarships and the operation of the UM Foundation. It will also provide funds for research centers, a new football stadium and expanded public service through broadcasting.
