

Lady Griz Insurance Classic Brings International Flavor to Missoula

Three different American conferences and a foreign country are being represented in the fourth-annual Lady Griz Insurance Classic.


Colorado State (High Country Athletic Conference), San Jose State (NorPac) and the University of Calgary (Canada West University Athletic Association) join the host University of Montana (Mountain West) in the event.

Montana and Calgary both bring winning records into the tournament. UM is 7-3 on the year and Calgary was 6-2 at press time. San Jose State is just below .500 at 4-6 and Colorado State is off to a disappointing 1-5 start.

Montana, coming off a sixth-place finish in the prestigious eight-team Giusti Tournament of Champions, has four players averaging in double figures. Leading the way is senior guard-forward Cheri Bratt who is averaging 12.2 points a game. Junior forward Anita Novak is next with a 10.3 average. Senior center Doris Deden Haquet and sophomore center Sharla Muralt are averaging 10 points apiece.

Hasquet is UM's leading rebounder with a 7.9 average. Bratt and Novak are averaging 7.4 and 6.5 rebounds respectively.

Starting guards Barb Kavanagh and Margaret Williams are the team's assist leaders, averaging 4.4 and 4.3 respectively.

UM is outscoring its opponents by an average of 13.5 points (71.0-57.5) a game. The Lady Griz also hold a 45.7-40.6 rebounding advantage.

"We're coming off three tough games in the Giusti Tournament. I think it was a very good experience for us because we had a chance to win all three games, but we came up short twice," Lady Griz coach Robin Selvig said. "We definitely learned some things in that tournament and we should be a better team because of that."

"This tournament (LGIC) is one of our final preparations for the conference season so it's especially important for us to have a strong performance," the sixth-year coach added.

Calgary returns all five starters from the team that finished the 1982-83 season with a 17-10 record. UC finished second in regionals and was ranked ninth in the country at the end of the season. The Dinnies' top players include Jane Adolphe, a senior guard who averaged 17.9 points and 3.3 rebounds last season and Brenda Abbott, a senior forward who averaged 10.8 points and 6.8 rebounds.

"Calgary is the unknown commodity in the tournament," Selvig said. "They have a good team based on past performances as well as this season's record. It will be interesting to see how they match up with American teams."

San Jose State has been led by junior center Rhoda Chew who averages 17.1 points and 11.7 rebounds on the season. She is joined in double figures by senior guard Shelia Brown who is averaging 13 points a game. Junior forward Sharon Turner adds 8.4 points and 6.2 rebounds. Sophomore guard Dana Foster is the Spartans' leader in assists with a 3.4 average.

San Jose is averaging 71.8 points a game and giving up just 67. The Spartans have also been strong on the boards and are outrebounding their opponents by 11.4 rebounds (51.4-40.0) a game.

SJSU has lost four games in a row after getting off to a 4-2 start.

"San Jose is a very good team," Selvig said. "They've been in a little bit of a slump, but I know they're a better team than their record indicates."

Colorado State boasts three players who are scoring in double figures. Junior forward Karen Hosek leads the Lady Rams with a 19.8 point average. Junior center Sherry Neely and senior forward Elaine Psenicka are adding 15.7 and 13.7 points respectively. Neely is the leading rebounder with an 8.7 average and sophomore guard Mary Jo Berenato leads the team in assists with 5.5 a game. Berenato suffered a dislocated knee cap in the fourth game of the season and has missed the last two games. Her status is uncertain for the LGIC.

Colorado State comes into the tournament with the highest offensive average at 75.3. However, CSU is giving up 82 points a game. The Lady Rams are also being outrebounded by 1.3 boards (42.0-40.7) a game.

"Colorado State has gotten off to a disappointing start, but they've lost some close games," said Selvig. "Their record could be 3-3 if they'd won the close ones.

"Even though the teams' records aren't as impressive as they have been in recent years, I think this is a very good field," he added. "We have teams from four different areas that all play different styles. I expect some close, exciting games throughout the tournament."
