# The Coaches

## Head Coach Robin Selvig



**Robin Selvig**  
Head Coach

Robin Selvig took over a struggling University of Montana women's basketball program in 1978 and immediately turned it around. He is the only basketball coach (men's or women's) in the school's history to win 100 games in his first five seasons.

Selvig's career record is 129-44 (6 seasons) and his winning percentage (74.6%) is also the best of any UM basketball coach ever. The 1983-84 squad's 27-4 record is the best in the program's history.

Selvig has been selected as conference Coach of the Year for three straight seasons. He was the 1983-84 WBCA (Women's Basketball Coaches Association) District VII Coach of the Year.

The emphasis is on defense on Selvig's teams. The Lady Griz have led the nation's Division I teams in scoring defense two of the last three seasons. In addition to winning the scoring defense title (54.9 ppg), UM was sixth in winning percentage (86.7%), seventh in field goal percentage defense (38.5%) and 14th in scoring margin (+14.7 ppg) in 1983-84.

Defense was also important to Selvig when he played guard for the University of Montana in the early 70's. In 1974, as a senior, he was named the best defensive player on the team. He was also an all-Big Sky second-team selection and won the university's top athletic award, the Grizzly Cup.

Before taking over the Lady Griz basketball program, Selvig was head coach of the girl's basketball team at Plentywood High School from 1975 to 1978.

## Assistant Coach Annette Whitaker

Whitaker is in her fourth season as an assistant women's basketball coach at UM. She served as the head coach of the JV program her first two seasons. She assists Selvig with all coaching duties.

Prior to joining the coaching ranks, Whitaker was a two-year starter at the guard position for the Lady Griz.

She received her bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education from UM in 1982. She is currently working on her master's degree in HPE.

## Student Assistant Coach Doris Hasquet

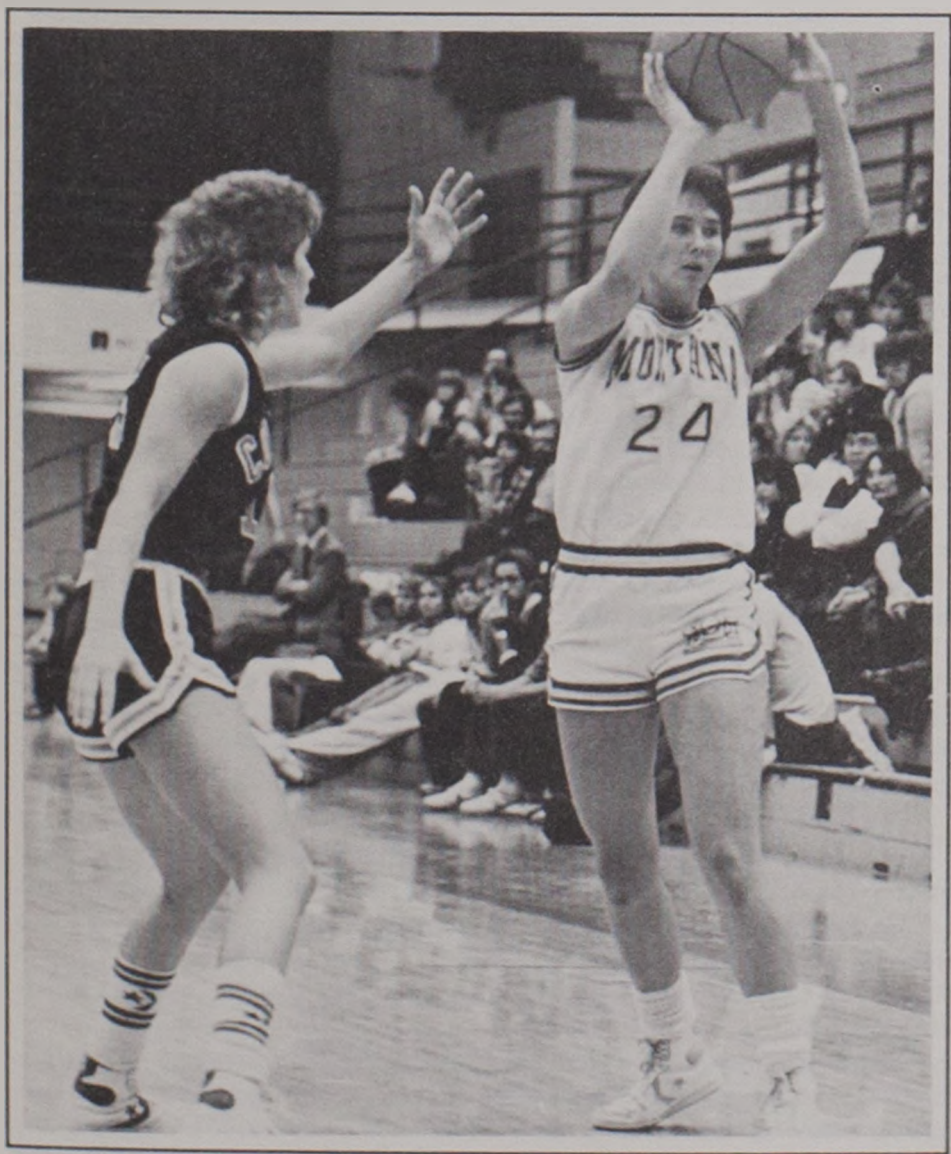
Doris Hasquet joins the coaching ranks after closing out a sterling career with the Lady Griz last season. She is UM's all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 1,248 points and 856 rebounds.

Hasquet was a second team all-conference selection last season as she averaged 11 points and 8.3 rebounds. She was also a Kodak All-District VII selection and a CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) District VII all-academic pick in 1983-84.

Doris is completing her bachelor's degree in mathematics and education at UM.

# The Outlook

Despite the loss of two all-conference players to graduation and one other starter injury, University of Montana women's basketball coach Robin Selvig is optimistic about the 1984-85 season.

Center Doris Deden Hasquet and guard-forward Cheri Bratt, who are ranked first and second in career scoring and rebounding at UM, both graduated last spring. The Lady Griz will also be without the services of last season's starting point guard, Margaret Williams, who suffered internal injuries in a bicycle accident this fall. Williams will be redshirted this season.

"We lost three key players from last year's team, but we have some good players back and an outstanding freshman class," the seventh-year coach said. "We have some big question marks in terms of depth and we have one starting spot that's wide open. But, if we can solve these problems, we can be a very good basketball team."

One reason for optimism is the return of eight letterwinners, including two starters, from the team that posted a 27-4 record last season.

The returning starters are seniors Anita Novak and Barb Kavanagh.

Novak, a 6-foot-2½ forward from Minot, N.D., averaged 10.5 points and 6.5 rebounds a game last year. She was an honorable mention all-conference choice and was selected as the team's Outstanding Defensive Player. She has started at forward for the past two seasons, but could also play center.

Kavanagh, a 5-9 guard from Fort Collins, Colo., averaged 10.8 points and 2.7 rebounds a game in 1983-84. She has won the Shannon Green Inspirational Award each of the past two seasons.

The other returnees are juniors Sharla Muralt and Mary Koehler and sophomore Natalie Streeter, Laurie Strube, Mo Patrick and Stacey Edwards.

Muralt will inherit the starting center position from the graduated Hasquet. She averaged 9.6 points and 4.8 rebounds in a reserve role last season. The 6-1 Missoula native scored a career high 31 points against Montana State in the opening game of the Mountain West Conference tournament.

Streeter, a 5-9 guard from Great Falls, averaged 4.1 points and 2.4 rebounds last season. She was bothered by injuries all season. Natalie had arthroscopic surgery on her left knee during the off-season and seems to be recuperating well. She is expected to take over one of the starting guard spots this year.

Koehler, a 5-8½ guard from Aberdeen, Md., averaged 2.6 points and 0.9 rebounds. She has good speed and quickness and is a streak shooter. Patrick, a 5-10½ forward from Darby, averaged 2.3 points and 2.3 rebounds. She has good strength and a nice outside shot.

Strube, a 6-2½ center from Minot, N.D., averaged 2.1 points and 1.5 rebounds in limited action last year. The Lady Griz are thin at center and Strube's development this season could be a key to the team's success. Edwards, a 5-11 forward from Highland Park, Ill., averaged 1.8 points and 1.6 rebounds in 1983-84.

"We have good experience in four starting spots with a sophomore, a junior and two seniors," Selvig said. "That other starting job is wide open. We'll have to see who takes charge in fall practices."

The four newcomers all had impressive high school careers. The freshmen are 6-foot forward Dawn Silliker, 5-11 guard Cheryl Brandell, 5-9½ guard Kris Moede and 6-foot guard-forward Marti Leibenguth.

Silliker averaged 21 points and 14 rebounds in leading Whitefish to a second-place finish in the state Class A ranks last year. She earned first team all-state recognition and was an honorable mention Converse High School All-American as a senior. She is also the only female athlete in the school's history to have her jersey retired.



Brandell was considered by some as the top prospect in Washington after her junior year at Olympia High. However, she injured her knee and did not play her senior year. She averaged 18.5 points and 12.3 rebounds as a junior.

Moede was the leading scorer and rebounder at Missoula's Big Sky High for four years. She averaged 18.2 points and 10.2 rebounds as she earned first team all-state honors last season. An excellent outside shooter, Moede scored 42 points in a state tournament game against C.M. Russell her senior year.

Leibenguth averaged 12.1 points and 5.6 rebounds from the point guard position at Big Sky High last season. She has outstanding size and good hands. She also excelled in volleyball and track. She set a state record in the javelin last spring.

"All four of the freshmen are good all-around athletes," Selvig said. "They are also very versatile players. They could all play two or three different positions. I expect them all to be competitive right away."

UM won the national scoring defense title for the second time in three seasons last year. The Lady Grizzlies yielded just 54.9 points a game. Defense should once again be a strong suit, according to Selvig.

"I anticipate us being strong on defense again because of our experience," Selvig said. "I think all the veterans will improve on defense and the newcomers are good athletes so they should become good defenders."

The Lady Grizzlies faced their toughest schedule ever last season and Selvig said the 1984-85 schedule might be even more competitive.

"I would say this season's schedule is better overall. We don't have any eye-catchers like Kansas State and Penn State, but we play some very good teams like the University of Washington, the University of California and Washington State during the non-conference season. We also have Colorado and Minnesota here for the Lady Griz Insurance Classic."

Montana is the only basketball champion the Mountain West Conference has ever known in its two-year existence, but Selvig said the entire league should be better this year.

"As a whole, I think the Mountain West will be much tougher this year. Eastern Washington and Idaho both have almost everyone back and some of the teams that didn't do well last season will be much better," Selvig said. "I think it will be a more balanced league this season. It will be hard for anyone to go 14-0 (like UM did in 1983-84) this year."

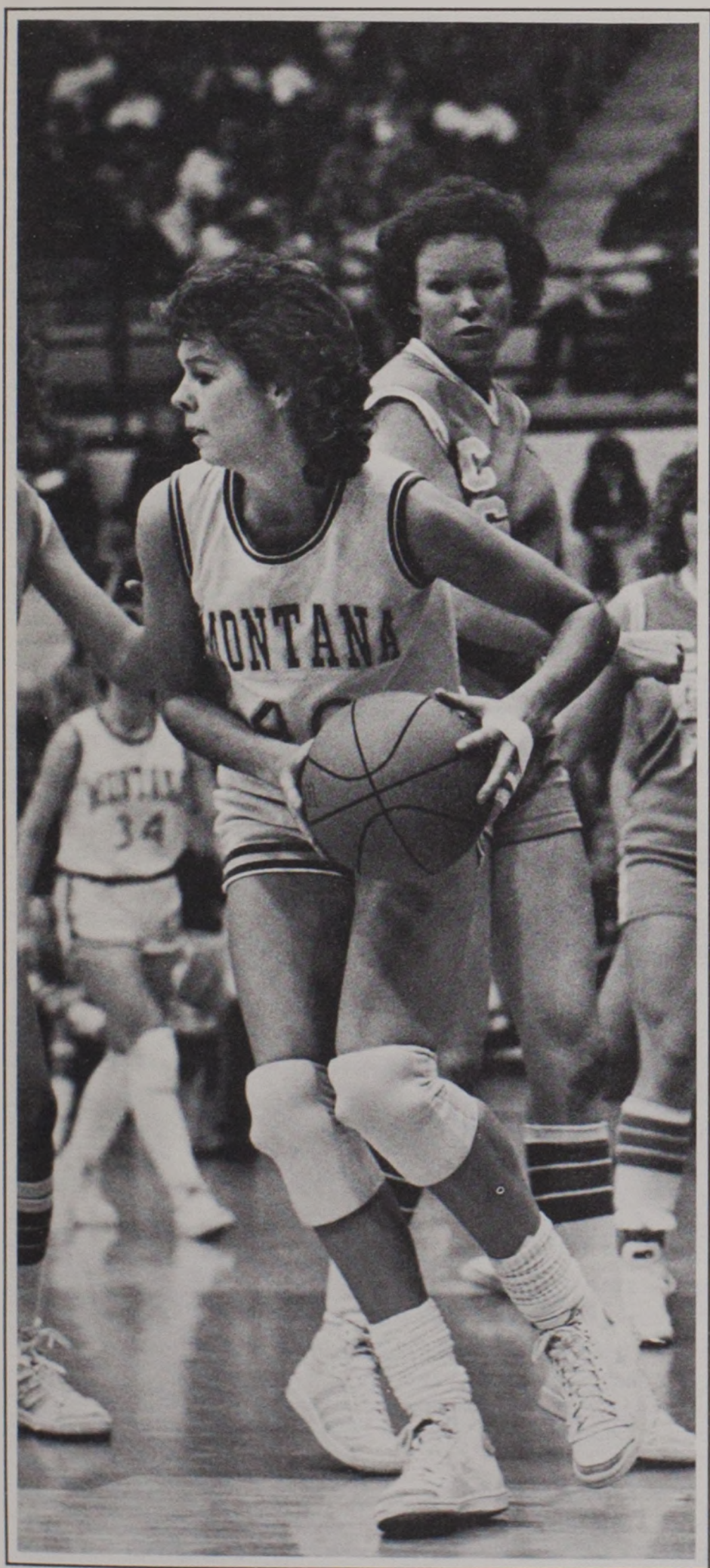

# The Returnees

## Barb Kavanagh



**Guard . . . 5-9 . . . Senior . . . Rocky Mountain High . . . Fort Collins, Colorado . . .** One of the team's best outside shooters, Kavanagh has the ability to play either guard position. She was the team's third-leading scorer last season, averaging 10.8 points last season. She was also second in assists with a 3.9 assist average.

Barb won a starting job in the fourth game of her freshman season and went on to average 8.5 points that season. She was the starting point guard at the beginning of her sophomore year but missed almost half of the season because of a stress fracture. She is eighth in career scoring with 606 points.

An outstanding leader, Kavanagh has received the Shannon Green Inspirational Award each of the past two seasons. She was also a District VII all-academic selection in 1983-84.

"Barb is a great leader and we will really count on her for leadership this season," Coach Selvig said. "She's a very intelligent player. She understands the game well and doesn't make a lot of stupid mistakes. Barb is one of our best outside shooters and is a very good scorer."

Kavanagh was a two-time all-conference and all-state pick at Rocky Mountain High. She was the MVP of the conference tournament her senior year. Barb played her sophomore year at Missoula's Hellgate High.

Barb has a double major in mathematics and health and physical education. Her parents are John Kavanagh of Shelby, Mont. and Georgianna Taylor of Fort Collins, Colo. Birthdate: 9-30-63.

## Anita Novak

**Forward . . . 6-2½ . . . Senior . . . Magic City Campus . . . Minot, North Dakota . . .** A two-year starter at forward, Novak averaged 10.5 points and 6.5 rebounds last season. She was an honorable mention all-conference selection and was named the team's Outstanding Defensive Player in 1983-84.

Novak has played in every game in her three seasons at UM and has started 54 straight. Although she has played forward most of her collegiate career, she could play center if needed.



Anita is UM's sixth-leading career scorer with 784 points and fifth-leading career rebounder with 550 boards. She has a good chance of becoming only the third Lady Griz player ever to break the 1,000-point plateau.

"Anita is definitely one of the premier players in our conference," said Selvig. "She is a very versatile player who could play anywhere from small forward to center. She's a great defender and has the ability to dominate offensively. She just needs to become more consistent offensively."

One of the most sought-after athletes in North Dakota history, Novak was a two-time all-conference and all-state choice at Magic City Campus. She was a Converse High School All-American as a senior.

Anita's parent are Donald and Shirley Novak of Minot, N.D. She is majoring in health and physical education. Birthdate: 12-26-62.

# Mary Koehler

**Guard . . . 5-8½ . . . Junior . . . Aberdeen High . . . Aberdeen, Maryland . . .** Koehler played in 20 games last season and averaged 2.6 points and 0.9 rebounds. She had a career high 8 points against Wyoming.

Koehler was the leading scorer on the 1981-82 JV squad with a 14 point average. She played in 6 varsity games that season. She sat out the 1982-83 season.

"Mary has gained some valuable experience over the past couple of seasons," according to Selvig. "She has good speed and quickness and also has the ability to shoot very well at times. I expect her to be battling for playing time at one of the guard spots."

Koehler was a first team all-conference pick her junior and senior years at Aberdeen High. She also excelled in cross country and track.

The daughter of John and Zenovia Koehler of Aberdeen, Md., Mary is majoring in elementary education. Birthdate: 8-18-63.

## Sharla Muralt



**Center . . . 6-1 . . . Junior . . . Sentinel High . . . Missoula, Montana**

. . . After two seasons as a key reserve, Muralt is almost assured of the starting center position this season. She averaged 9.6 points and 4.8 rebounds while playing only 20 minutes a game in 1983-84.

She scored a career-high 31 points against Montana State in the opening game of the 1984 Mountain West Tournament. That was just one point short of Jill Greenfield's single game record.

Muralt is tied for 10th in career rebounding with 283 rebounds. She needs just 143 points to move into the top 10 in career scoring.

"Sharla is probably the best scorer on the team," Selvig said. "She is almost unstoppable in the low post. If you get the ball to her there, she will usually score or get fouled. She needs to work on her defense, but I think she will become a good defender with added experience."

Muralt led Sentinel High to a second-place finish in the state Class AA tournament her senior year. She was a two-time all-conference and all-state selection and was the MVP of the divisional tournament as a senior. She was also a Converse High School All-American her senior year.

Sharla is a business management major. Her parents are Gary and Susan Muralt of Missoula. Her younger brother, Walt, is a member of the Grizzly football team. Birthdate: 12-10-63.

. . . The fastest and quickest player on the team, Williams started all 30 games at point guard last season. She averaged 5.5 points, 2.2 rebounds and 3.5 assists. She was second on the team in steals with 59.

However, she will miss the 1984-85 season because of internal injuries suffered in a bicycle accident this fall.

"Margaret had a great season at lead guard," Selvig said. "She's an outstanding defensive player and has good offensive skills. We will definitely miss her this season."

Williams was the Player of the Year in the Black Hills League as a senior at Olympia High. She was her team's MVP her junior and senior years.

Margaret's parents are Bill and Ruth Williams of Olympia, Wash. She is a political science major. Birthdate: 5-15-64.

Stacey averaged 21 points and 10 rebounds as a senior at Deerfield High. She was named the Northern Chicago Suburbs Player of the Year that season. She was a three-time first team all-conference and all-country pick. She was also a second team all-state choice and an honorable mention All-America selection by USA Today her senior year.

"Stacey played extremely well during the spring," according to Selvig. "With increased confidence from her freshman year, she should battle for playing time. She has good scoring ability, but needs to become more comfortable facing the basket."

"Mo has outstanding athletic ability," said Selvig. "She's strong and is a good jumper, shooter and rebounder. She just needs to be more confident facing the basket."

Patrick was a Class B all-state player her senior year at Darby High. She averaged 21 points, 10 rebounds and 3.5 assists as a high school senior. She was an honorable mention Converse High School All-American her senior year.

## Natalie Streeter



**Guard . . . 5-9 . . . Sophomore . . . Great Falls High . . . Great Falls, Montana . . .** One of the team's top reserves last season, Streeter was bothered by injuries all year. She had arthroscopic surgery on her left knee during the off-season and seems to be recuperating well.

Streeter averaged 4.1 points and 2.4 rebounds in 1983-84. She also had 43 assists and 18 steals in 27 games last season. Natalie had career highs of 12 points and 7 rebounds last season.

"Natalie has great potential at this level," Selvig said. "She wasn't healthy all last year and she still had a good freshman season. If she can stay healthy, she has all the tools to be an outstanding player. She has great offensive skills. She's a good passer and ballhandler and can score from the inside or the outside."

Streeter came to UM after winning Converse High School All-America honors at Great Falls High. She averaged 18.5 points, 8.4 rebounds, 5.5 steals and 3.6 assists her senior year in high school. She won the 1983 Little Sullivan Award which is given to the top female amateur athlete in the state.

Streeter's teams never lost a game during her varsity career at Great Falls. GFHS won 71 consecutive games (a state record at that time) while Natalie was on the team.

Strube was an all-conference selection as a senior at Magic City Campus. She averaged 14 points and 9 rebounds and connected on 68.5 percent of her field goal attempts her senior year.

She averaged 18.5 points and 12.3 rebounds, earning league MVP honors as a junior. She was an all-conference and all-state tournament pick her sophomore year.

Brandell was considered by some to be the best college prospect in Washington after her junior season.

"Cheryl has good all-around offensive skills," said Selvig. "She can shoot, pass and handle the ball well. She is moving very well and I think her knee operation was a complete success."

Brandell and junior Margaret Williams were high school teammates.

Cheryl won two letters in basketball and volleyball and three in softball at Olympia High.

## Marti Leibenguth



**Guard-Forward . . . 6-0 . . . Freshman . . . Big Sky High . . . Missoula, Montana . . .** An excellent all-around athlete, Leibenguth won all-state honors in basketball, volleyball and track last year.

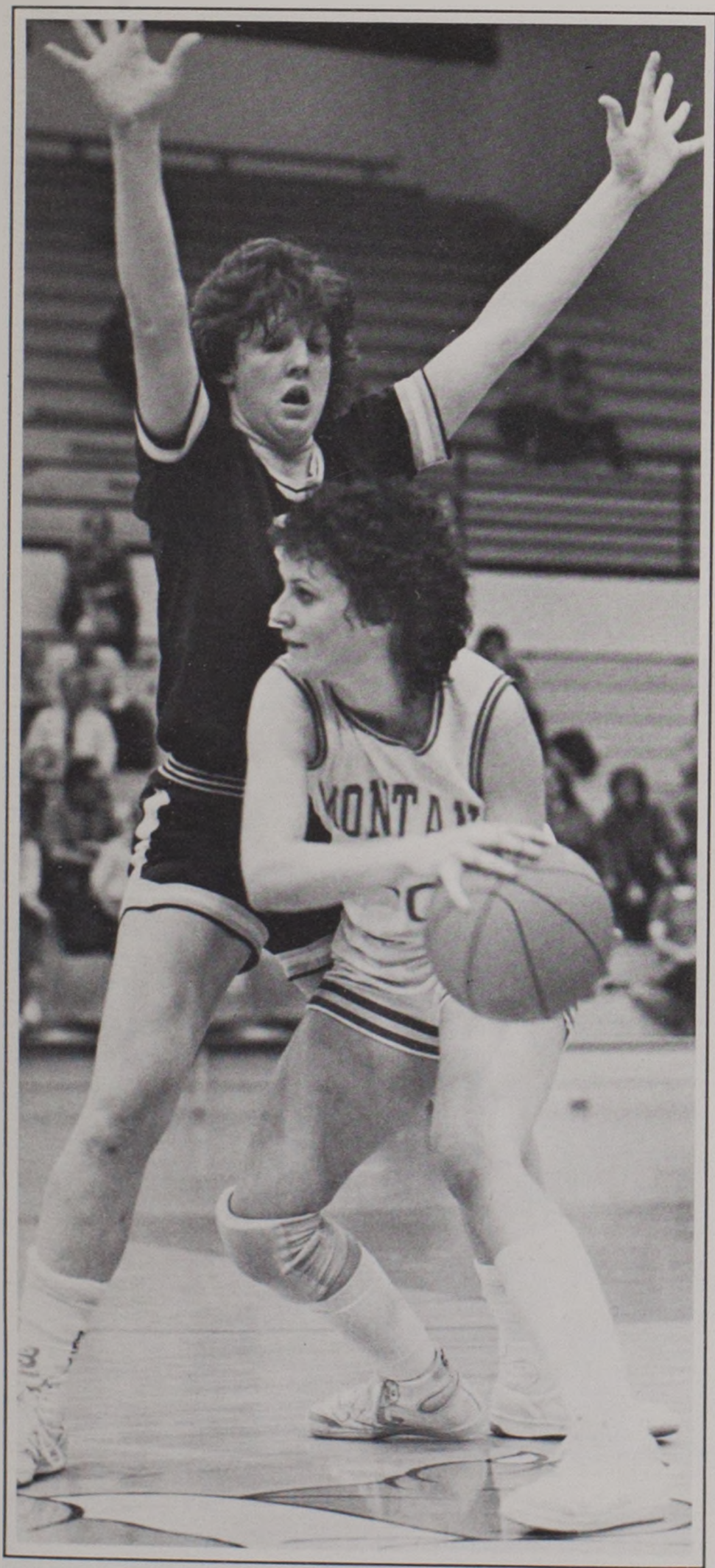
She averaged 21 points and 14 rebounds in leading Whitefish to the Western Class A title and a second-place finish in the state last year.

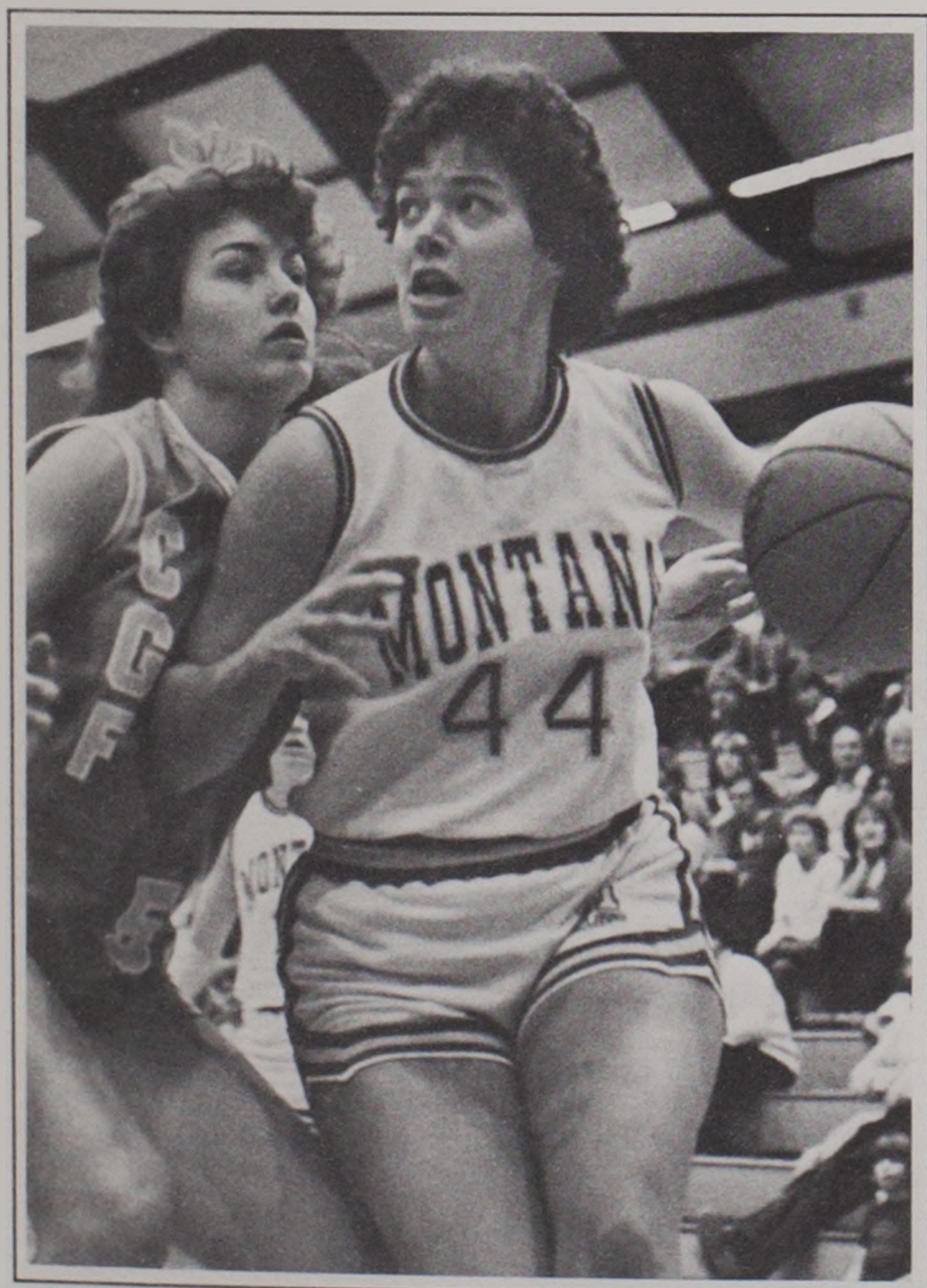

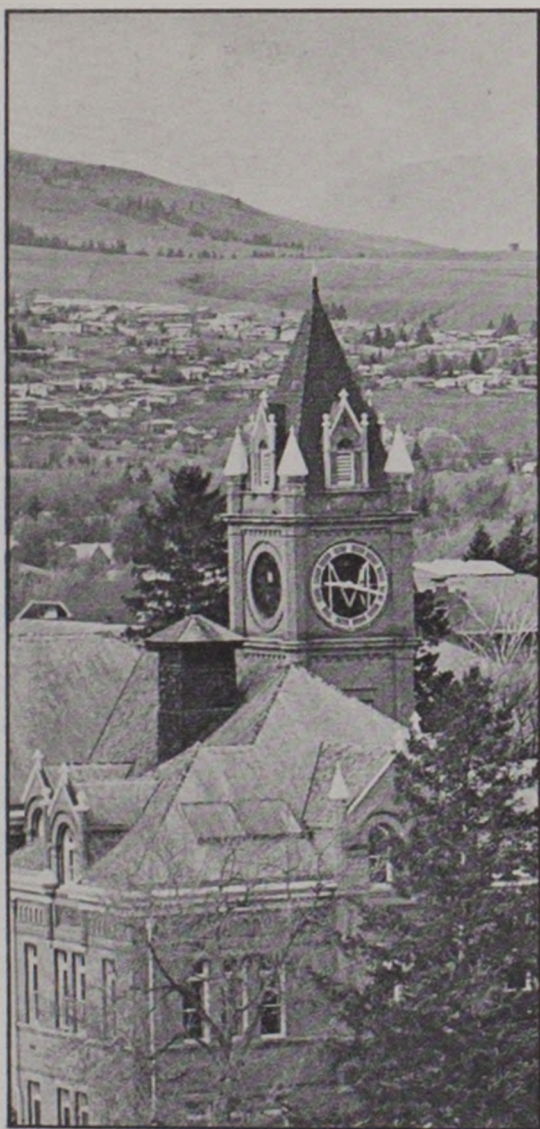

# University of Montana

The University of Montana boasts a proud tradition of academic excellence in teaching, research and service. Located in Missoula on 201 acres at the base of Mount Sentinel, UM was chartered February 17, 1893. Since then, it has grown from 50 students and seven faculty members to a present enrollment of 9,400 and about 450 full-time state supported faculty positions.



Bachelor's degrees are available in 58 fields, and associate of arts degrees may be obtained in two areas. UM offers master's degrees in 54 programs and doctoral degrees in 13.

The College of Arts and Sciences is the core of the University. It includes a full range of programs and courses in the life sciences, physical sciences, social sciences and humanities.

Seven professional schools complete the academic program—Business Administration, Fine Arts, Journalism, Education, Forestry, Law and Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences.

Missoula is in the midst of an area noted for its spectacular scenery and recreational opportunities. It is within easy driving distance of four wilderness areas and Glacier and Yellowstone National Parks. The natural surroundings offer excellent opportunities for hunting, fishing, backpacking, river floating, camping and other recreational pursuits. Two winter ski areas are within minutes of the University, and several others are only a couple of hours away by car. UM owns and operates a golf course near the campus.

Downtown Missoula is within blocks of the University and is easily accessible. Other parts of the city can be reached by using Mountain Line, the city's mass transit system.
