



HEAD COACH DICK SCOTT



Dick Scott is in his 11th year as head coach of the University of Montana volleyball team.

In 10 seasons at UM, he has posted a 207-177 record. The Lady Grizzlies finished second in the Mountain West Conference three times in the league's six-year history.

Before taking the UM position, Scott was head volleyball coach at

Santa Monica Junior College from 1972 to 1978. His record was 110-20 overall and 52-1 in conference play. During that time, he was also the head scout for UCLA.

Originally from Denton, Mont., Scott was the head coach of the Maccabi Volleyball Club for two years and taught physical education and general science at a junior high in Santa Monica.

Scott has considerable international coaching experience. He served as an assistant coach for the United States Olympic men's volleyball team when it participated in the U.S.A. Championship Series three summers ago. Previously, he had served as an assistant coach for the men's national team in the 1981 World University Games and was the head coach of the U.S.A. Junior National Team for three years.

Scott, 45, attended Montana State on a basketball and track scholarship. He graduated in 1965 with a B.S. in physical education. After serving in the Air Force from 1965-69, he earned his master's degree in physical education at UCLA in 1971.

Dick and his wife, Mary, have three children: Jean, 17, Patty, 12 and Jack, 5.

ASSISTANT COACH JERRY WAGNER

Wagner is new to the Lady Griz volleyball staff, but not to collegiate coaching. He coached at Northern Montana for four seasons three years as an assistant and one as head coach. The team posted a 22-14 record in his year at the helm. Jerry also coached at Havre High for four seasons, compiling a 74-54 record. His 1987 team finished fourth in the state Class "A" tournament.



Wagner is working on his graduate degree in athletic administration.

ANGIE BELLINGER Outside Hitter 5-9, Freshman from Spokane, WA

Angie will battle for the starting leftside hitter position next to Mari Brown. She was a two-time All-Greater Spokane League selection and was the league's MVP in 1987. Bellinger is the third GSL MVP (along with Allison Yarnell and

Brown) to join the Lady Griz program in the past five years. Her Ferris High team was the league's co-champion in 1986.

Scott's Thoughts: "Angie has a lot of volleyball experience and is a good athlete and that might give her an edge for the starting spot in the left side."

Health/physical education major. Birthdate: 6-16-70. She is the daughter of Gary and Gail Bellinger of Spokane.

DAWN BJORKLUND Outside Hitter 5-8, Freshman from Electric City, WA

Dawn is one of the three freshmen (along with Bellinger and Kathy Young) in contention for the starting left-side hitter position. She was a two-time all-conference performer in volleyball and also earned honors in basketball and track

where she was the state long jump champ.

Scott's Thoughts: "Dawn is probably the best athlete among the new recruits which may make up for the fact that she has limited volleyball experience."

A member of the National Honor Society, Dawn plans to major in physical therapy. Birthdate: 5-19-70. Her parents are Ronald and Susan Bjorklund of Electric City.



MARI BROWN
Outside Hitter
5-8, Junior
from Spokane, WA

Mari's transition back to left-side hitter after spending a year as the starting setter will be a key to UM's success this season. She is leading returnee in assists, service aces and digs and ranks fourth in career digs and assists. She set a school

record for digs in a single match with 35 against Montana State last year. Brown was chosen as the team's Most Inspirational Player as a freshman and sophomore and is the only UM athlete to receive that honor her first two years in the program.

Mari (pronounced Marree) was the Greater Spokane League MVP as a junior and senior at Shadle Park High. She led her prep teams to Class "AAA" state titles in 1984 and 1985, those teams each going 24-0.

Scott's Thoughts: "Mari was a captain last year and will have to assume even more leadership this season. We are also looking for her to fill in at Allison's (Yarnell) old spot on the left side."

Majoring in elementary education. Birthdate: 2-22-68. Man is the daughter of William and Trudi Brown.



JULIE HOFFMAN Outside Hitter 5-10, Junior from Missoula. MT

Julie is a likely starter at right outside hitter. She has been a role player in her first two seasons at UM and contributed 41 kills last year.

Hoffman was an all-state player as a senior at Big Sky High and was a member

of the Montana team that toured China in 1986. Scott's Thoughts: "She is one of two juniors on a team with no seniors so she will have to shoulder some of the leadership responsibility on and off the court this year. She is blessed with excellent athletic ability and could be a real contributor to the program."

Julie is an elementary education major. Birthdate: 2-2-68. Her parents are Glenn and Sally Hoffman of Missoula.

COLLEEN JANTZ Middle Blocker 6-2. Freshman from Coeur d'Alene. ID

Jantz is expected to back up Pinkerton and Tarleton in the middle. At 6-2, her size makes her a real plus. She earned all-state honors last season as a member of Coeur d'Alene's state championship team. Her high school teammate Anne

Schwenke will be a freshman setter at UM this year. In addition to her volleyball honors, Colleen was all-state in basketball and was highly recruited in that sport.

Scott's Thoughts: "Colleen is an excellent blocker and will see lots of playing time, being our first middle player off the bench. She has great hands for a big player."

Plans to major in business or education. Birthdate: 7-3-70. She is the daughter of Cliff Jantz and Joyce Jantz, both of Coeur d'Alene



CYNDEE JONES Outside Hitter 6-½, Sophomore from Gresham, OR

Cyndee should battle Hoffman for the starting right outside hitter position. She saw limited playing time last season because of an injury but came on to have an outstanding conference tournament. She finished the season with 45 kills, 7

blocks and 12 service aces. A left-hander, Jones has the team's most powerful serve.

Cyndee was an all-metro, all-conference and honorable mention all-state pick at Gresham High.

Scott's Thoughts: "Cyndee has really improved her strength during the off-season. She is an aggressive and intense player who could start for us."

Majoring in business administration. Birthdate: 1-12-69. Her parents are Monte and Judy Stowell of Gresham.



ERIN PARKS Setter 5-8, Sophomore from Missoula, MT

Erin is the leading contender for the starting setter position. She saw limited action at setter last year, but gained valuable experience in backcourt and defensive situations.

Parks was one of the top prep athletes in Montana, earning all-state honors twice in volleyball and four times in tennis. She was Hellgate High's volleyball MVP as a senior and Outstanding Offensive Player as a junior.

Scott's Thoughts: "Erin is our number one setter at this point, but she will have to work to keep that spot. She is a hardworking player and gifted with good hands."

General studies major. Birthdate: 7-24-69. Erin is the daughter of Marilyn and Sam Lemaich of Missoula.

JENNIFER PINKERTON Middle Blocker 6-½, Sophomore from Canyon, CA

One of two returning starters, Pinkerton was the team's second-leading blocker last season with 86. That is the second-highest blocking total ever recorded by a UM freshman. Jennifer is also the leading returnee in kills with 138. She



started most of the first half of the season before being slowed by shin problems. She should be fully recovered from shin surgery last spring.

Jennifer was a first-team All-CIF choice and also won allvalley and all-league honors at Canyon High.

Scott's Thoughts: "Should be a real blocking force for us. Has proven to be a team leader which is always a plus."

Majoring in telecommunications. Birthdate: 7-20-69. She is the daughter of Linda Pinkerton of Canyon.



NICOLE PRUIM Middle Blocker/Hitter 5-10½, Freshman from Castle Rock, CO

Nicole was redshirted last season to build up her strength. She will back up Hoffman and Jones at right-side hitter and could see some time at middle blocker if injuries hit that position.

Pruim (pronounced Primm) was an

honorable mention all-state choice her junior and senior years at Douglas County High.

Scott's Thoughts: "Nicole is a good athlete who has a good sense of the game. She could be an important role player if she works on some aspects of her game."

Psychology major. Birthdate: 8-6-69. Her parents are Rick and Judy Pruim of Castle Rock.



ANNE SCHWENKE Setter 5-6, Freshman from Coeur d'Alene, ID

One of the top setter prospects in the Northwest last year, Schwenke will contend for a starting job right away. She led her Coeur d'Alene High team to the state championships in 1987 and was a two-time all-state pick.

Scott's Thoughts: "Ann has real good court sense; she has shown great court leadership. She is a consistent setter who has good hitter selection. She has run the 5-1 offense which is what we run so that's a plus."

Ann plans to major in business. Birthdate: 11-14-69. She is the daughter of Larry and Laurie Schwenke.

ANNE TARLETON Middle Blocker 6-1, Sophomore from Littleton, CO

One of the projected starters at middle blocker, Anne ranks second among the returnees in kills with 89 last season. She started most of the second half of the season and had a high of 13 kills against Idaho State. She and Brown are the team's best jumpers.



Anne was redshirted her first year in the program after earning all-state honors at Heritage High.

Scott's Thoughts: "Anne has made the most improvement of any of our returning players during the off-season; she has improved her hitting, jumping and strength. She will be counted on as a team leader since she is now one of the older players on the team."

Majoring in health/physical education. Birthdate: 8-7-68. Her parents are Tim and Mary Tarleton of Littleton.



KATHY YOUNG Outside Hitter 5-7½, Freshman from Missoula, MT

Kathy will be part of the battle for the starting job at left outside hitter. She earned all-state honors last season at Hellgate High despite missing the early part of the season due to a knee injury suffered during basketball season. Young was also a

track standout and plans to compete in the heptathlon at UM. Scott's Thoughts: "Kathy really sold herself to us with the

hard work she put in to rehab the knee after her injury. She is an outstanding athlete and a tough competitor."

Kathy plans to major in either health/physical education or pharmacy. Birthdate: 1-9-70. She is the daughter of Phillip and Sharon Young of Missoula.

1988 OUTLOOK

The Lady Griz volleyball team enters the 1988 season with a new conference affiliation, a revamped schedule and five new faces from a year ago. Head coach Dick Scott calls this a rebuilding year, but with six returning letterwinners, one redshirt and a talented group of newcomers, UM should be a contender for the conference playoffs

This marks the first season for the Montana women's athletic program in the Big Sky Conference. The name has changed but the nine schools were all members of the now defunct

Mountain West Conference.

The early favorites for the first Big Sky volleyball title look to be Weber State, led by Kim Benesh who was nationally ranked in kills in 1987, and Boise State, led by all-around star Kelly Baker. Northern Arizona, with a young but experienced group, should also be a factor. Montana joins 1987 MWC champion Idaho State and Eastern Washington as darkhorse contenders for the conference tournament which features the top four teams and will be held at the site of the regular season winner.

Montana faces a shortened pre-season schedule since conference play begins Sept. 15. In past years, conference play has begun around Oct. 1. The Lady Griz' pre-season schedule is highlighted by appearances in tournaments at Gonzaga, to open the season Sept. 2-3, and at Long Beach State where the Lady Griz will face a nationally-ranked field which includes USC, Texas Tech, Utah and host Long Beach. UM's first home appearance is Sept. 13 against Gonzaga.

The Lady Griz have some big gaps to fill this season as allconference performers Cindy Pitzinger and Allison Yarnell and fellow starters Cheryl Hanson and Mary McManigal are

all gone from the 1987 squad.

A key to the team's success will be how well last year's starting setter, Man Brown, makes the transition to left outside hitter. That's the position Brown played two years ago and all through high school. Mari was among the league leaders in digs with 374 in 1987 and is also the top returnee in service aces with 37. The second left-side hitter will be one of a trio of freshmen. The newcomers are Angie Bellinger, the Greater Spokane League MVP from Ferris High (the school that produced Yarnell and Hanson), Dawn Bjorklund, a three-sport star from Lake Roosevelt High in Electric City, WA and Kathy Young, an all-conference and all-state performer at Missoula Hellgate.

Taking Brown's spot as the starting setter will be either sophomore Erin Parks or freshman Ann Schwenke. Parks, the backup last season, saw limited time at setter but was used as a defensive specialist. Schwenke was one of the top setter prospects in the Northwest as she led Coeur d'Alene High to

the state championship.

One of Montana's strengths will be in the middle where both projected starters saw considerable action last year. Holding down the middle will be sophomores Jennifer Pinkerton and Anne Tarleton. Blocking should be a strong area as Pinkerton and Tarleton had 86 and 45 blocks respectively in 1987. The duo's backup will be 6-2 freshman Colleen Jantz who was an all-state pick at Coeur d'Alene High.

A pair of veterans will battle for the starting nod at right outside hitter. Julie Hoffman, one of two juniors on the squad, has been a role player the past two seasons. Sophomore Cyndee Jones came off a nagging ankle injury to turn in a 12-kill performance in the conference semi-finals. Redshirt freshman Nicole Pruim will be available as a backup.

he University of Montana boasts a proud tradition of academic excellence in teaching, research and service. Located in Missoula on 201 acres at the base of Mount Sentinel, UM was chartered February 17, 1893. Since then, it has grown from 50 students and seven faculty members to a present enrollment of 8,500 and about 450 full-time state supported faculty positions.

Bachelor's degrees are available in 58 fields, and associate of arts degrees may be obtained in two areas. UM offers master's degrees in 54 programs and doctoral degrees in 13.

The College of Arts and Sciences is the core of the University. It includes a full range of programs and courses in the life sciences, physical sciences, social sciences and humanities.

Seven professional schools complete the academic program-Business Administration, Fine Arts, Journalism, Education, Forestry, Law and Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences.

Missoula is in the midst of an area noted for its spectacular scenery and recreational opportunities. It is within easy driving distance of four wilderness areas and Glacier and Yellowstone National Parks The natural surroundings offer excellent opportunities for hunting, fishing, backpacking, river floating, camping and other recreational pursuits. Two winter ski areas are within minutes of the University, and several others are only a couple of hours away by car. UM owns and operates a golf course near the campus.

Downtown Missoula is within blocks of the University and is easily accessible to UM students. Other parts of the city can be reached by using Mountain Line, the

city's mass transit system.
