

Head Coach Robin Selvig



Robin Selvig took over a struggling University of Montana women's basketball program and immediately turned it around. He is the only basketball coach in the school's history to win 100 games in his first five season. His five-year record was 102-40.

Selvig's career record is 151-54 (7 seasons) and that gives him a 73.7 winning percentage which is the best of any UM basketball coach ever.

Selvig has won two straight WBCA (Women's Basketball Coaches' Association) District VII Coach of the Year awards. He was also selected as Conference Coach of the Year for three consecutive seasons (1982-84).

The emphasis is on defense on Selvig's teams. The Lady Griz led the nation's Division I teams in scoring defense during the 1981-82 and 1983-84 seasons. UM was also nationally-ranked in defense in 1982-83 and 1984-85.

Defense was also important to Selvig when he played guard for UM in the early 1970's. His senior year (1974), he was selected as the team's outstanding defensive player. He was also a second-team All-Big Sky Conference choice and won the University's top athletic award, the Grizzly Cup.

He received his bachelor's degree in health and physical education from UM in 1974. Before taking over the Lady Griz basketball program, Selvig was the head girls' basket-

ball coach at Plentywood High from 1975 to 1978.

Robin and his wife Jane have two sons: Jeff, 5, and Dan, 2.

Assistant Coach Annette Whitaker

Whitaker is in her fifth season as an assistant coach with the Lady Griz basketball program. She served as junior varsity coach her first two seasons. She assists Selvig with all coaching duties—game strategy, scouting, recruiting, etc.

Prior to joining the coaching ranks, Whitaker was a two-year starting at the point guard position for UM.

Annette was also a basketball standout at Cashmere High and Wenatchee Valley College.

She received her bachelor's degree in health and physical education from UM in 1982.



Student Assistant Coach Anita Novak Selvig



After finishing up an outstanding Lady Griz career last spring, Anita Novak Selvig is in her first season as a student assistant coach.

Anita is UM's third-leading career scorer (1,158) and second-leading career rebounder (791).

She is finishing her bachelor's degree in health and physical education.

Her husband, Doug, is a former Grizzly basketball standout and a graduate assistant coach with UM men's basketball team.

The Outlook

When asked what to expect from his 1985-86 team, University of Montana women's basketball coach Robin Selvig just shakes his head and says "that's a good question."

Selvig, who is 151-54 in his seven seasons with the Lady Griz, said he has a lot of questions in his mind because of the team's youth. There are five freshmen, five sophomores, three juniors and just one senior on the roster.

"With a team this young, you have to wonder how things are going to come together. We have a lot of good, young talent but we'll have to wait to see how we gel," Selvig said. "The returning sophomores all got quite a bit of playing time last year so that should be a big plus. And the newcomers are the type of players that I think will be able to contribute right away.

"We also have three proven veterans in Sharla (Muralt), Margaret (Williams) and Natalie (Streeter). We'll be counting heavily

on their leadership with all the young players we have," he added.

UM lost two all-conference players—Barb Kavanagh and Anita Novak—from last season's 22-10 squad, but has seven letterwinners returning and six talented newcomers. Also, Williams will be back after missing last season with internal injuries.

"Our depth should be much better this year. We only played seven players in some games last year, but this year we should go at least 10 deep," Selvig said. "Also, the competition for starting spots and playing time will be as intense as it's ever been. Coming into practice, I have more questions about starting jobs and who will play where than I have before."

One starting position that really isn't in question is at center where Muralt, an allconference and all-district selection, returns. The 6-foot-1 senior was UM's leading scorer and rebounder last season, averaging 13.8 points and 8.6 rebounds. The battle for the backup spot will probably be between 6-foot-2¹/₂ junior Laurie Strube and 6-foot-1 freshman Linda Mendel. Strube averaged 3.3 points and 1.4 rebounds in limited time last year. Mendel was a first team all-state selection as she averaged 16.2 points and 14 rebounds her senior year at Malta High. Kris Haasl, a 6-foot-2¹/₂ freshman from Florence, joins the team as a walk-on. She was an all-state selection last year at Florence High.

The forward positions will probably be the most competitive on the team with six players vying for time. The three returning sophomores—6-foot Dawn Silliker, 5-foot-11 Cheryl Brandell and 6-foot-1 Marti Leibenguth—all played a lot last season. Silliker was the starting small forward and averaged 9.1 points and 5.4 rebounds in her initial Lady Griz campaign. Brandell averaged 5.9 points and 4 rebounds while Leibenguth added 4.4 points and 3.5 rebounds a game. Both Brandell and Leibenguth could also see action at guard.

Three incoming players should push the veterans forwards. They are 6-foot freshman Jean McNulty, 6-foot-1 freshman Lisa McLeod and 6-foot sophomore Karyn Ridgeway. McNulty, a three-time all-state selection, averaged 25.5 points and 13.5 rebounds

a game last season at Whitehall High. McLeod averaged 20.5 points and 13.5 rebounds as a senior at C.M. Russell High in Great Falls and was an all-state pick her junior and senior years. A former all-stater from Missoula's Hellgate High, Ridgeway is joining the Lady Griz after being away from basketball for two years.

The guard situation was strengthened by the return of Williams at the point. The 5-foot-8 junior averaged 5.5 points and 2.2 rebounds as a starter during the 1983-84 season. Streeter, a 5-foot-9 junior, is the returning starter at the other guard spot. She averaged 7.2 points and 2.7 rebounds despite battling injuries and illnesses much of last season. The other returning guard is Kris Moede, a 5-foot-9¹/₂ sophomore who averaged 4 points and 1.3 rebounds last year. She won the Grace Geil Most Improved Player Award. Anji Price, a freshman from Missoula Sentinel, will give the Lady Griz added speed and quickness at point guard. She averaged 12.5 points and 6 rebounds, earning all-state honors last year.

UM has been renowned for its defense over the past few seasons, but suffered an off year, giving up 61.4 points a game last year (compared to 54.9 in 1983-84). However, Selvig expects the team's defense to return to the forefront.

"We weren't quite as good defensively (last season) as we had been. But this year, I think we'll be much better (defensively)," Selvig said. "Having Margaret back will make a big difference because of her speed and quickness. Also, last year's freshmen all got quite a bit of experience and I think they'll be better defenders."

Offensively, the Lady Griz set a school scoring record last season, averaging 70.8 points a game. Selvig said the 1985-86 team should also be strong offensively, especially on the front line. He added that UM might run a little more this season with Williams at point guard.

The schedule features three tournament appearances and single games against several good non-conference teams as well as a double round-robin within the Mountain West Conference. UM will play in its own Lady Griz Invitational, the Washington State Dial Classic and the San Francisco Sourdough Classic. Among the top non-conference foes are Washington, San Jose State, Colorado State and Wyoming.

UM posted an 11-3 conference record to tie Eastern Washington for second place in the Mountain West behind 13-1 Idaho last year. Idaho lost just one player from the team that finished with an impressive 28-2 overall record in 1984-85 and Selvig says they are the team to beat.

"Idaho has to be the favorite. They were great last year and almost everyone is back," he said. "Eastern should also be very good again. They're especially strong on the front line, and if their guards come along, they could be even better than last year. And, I think we'll be right in the hunt. We have the talent to contend. It just depends on how the younger players do.

"Last season there was a big gap between the top three and the rest of the league. This year, I think everyone will improve and the gap will narrow," Selvig added.

The lone senior on the team, Muralt was UM's leading scorer and rebounder last season, averaging 13.8 points and 8.6 rebounds. She led UM in scoring 10 times and in rebounding 13 times last year.

Sharla was a first team all-conference selection and was named to the Kodak All-District VII team. She also received UM's Coaches' Award in 1984-85.

She ranks sixth in career scoring and rebounding with 872 points and 557 rebounds.

Muralt has career highs of 31 points and 19 rebounds.

"Sharla is definitely one of the premier player in our league," Selvig said. "She had a very good junior year. She was consistent offensively and she improved on defense. She should be ready for a great senior year."

One of three returning starters, Streeter averaged 7.2 points and 2.7 rebounds despite being injured much of last season. She led the team in free throw percentage (.808) and ranked

third in field goal percentage (.459)

Natalie averaged 4.1 points and 2.4 rebounds her freshman year.

She has career highs of 16 points and 7 rebounds.

"Natalie played very well after overcoming injuries last year," according to Selvig. "She shot very well from the outside and we'll be looking for her to be more aggressive on offense this season."

Streeter came to UM after earning Converse High School All-America honors her senior year at Great Falls High. She averaged 18.5 points and 8.4 rebounds that season and was selected as the recipient of the Little Sullivan Award which is given to the top female amateur athlete in the state.

Easily the fastest and quickest player on the team, Williams was the starting point guard in 1983-84. She averaged 5.5 points, 2.2 rebounds and 3.5 assists. She also ranked second on the team in steals that season with 59

Margaret averaged 4.1 points and 1.2 rebounds as a freshman.

Her career highs are 17 points and 5 rebounds.

"We're very happy to have Margaret back. I expect her to make us a better defensive team because of her speed and quickness as well as her toughness on defense," Selvig said. University of Montana

The University of Montana boasts a proud tradition of academic excellence in teaching, research and service. Located in Missoula on 201 acres at the base of Mount Sentinel, UM was chartered February 17, 1893. Since then, it has grown from 50 students and seven faculty members to a present enrollment of 9,300 and about 450 full-time state supported faculty positions.

Bachelor's degrees are available in 58 fields, and associate of arts degrees may be

obtained in two areas. UM offers master's degrees in 54 programs and doctoral degrees in 13.

The College of Arts and Sciences is the core of the University. It includes a full range of programs and courses in the life sciences, physical sciences, social sciences and humanities.


Seven professional schools complete the academic program— Business Administration, Fine Arts, Journalism, Education, Forestry, Law and Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences.

Missoula is in the midst of an area noted for its spectacular scenery and recreational opportunities. It is within easy driving distance of four wilderness areas and Glacier and Yellowstone National Parks. The natural surroundings offer excellent opportunities for hunting, fishing, backpacking, river floating, camping and other recreational pursuits. Two winter ski areas are within minutes of the University, and several others are only a couple of hours away by car. UM owns and operates a golf course near the campus.

Downtown Missoula is within blocks of the University and is easily accessible to UM students. Other parts of the city can be reached by using Mountain Line, the city's mass transit system.
