## **Head Coach Robin Selvig**



For the sixth time in eight seasons, Robin Selvig guided the Lady Griz to a 20-win season in route to capturing the Mountain West Athletic Conference title. In his tenure at the University of Montana, Selvig has coached 85 percent of the all-time Lady Griz victories.

Success at Montana came quickly for Selvig as he led his team to 13 wins in his first season at the helm (a new school record). In his third season, the lady Griz won 22 games and the string of 20-plus wins each year has now reached six in a row.

Since taking over as the head coach of the Lady Griz, Selvig has compiled a record of 178-58 (75.4 winning percentage) in his eight seasons.

Selvig has won two straight WBCA (Women's Basketball Coaches Association) District VII Coach of the Year awards. He has also been selected as Conference Coach of the Year four of the last five seasons.

Selvig has been noted as a defensive oriented coach in the past, but his squad averaged 66.8 point per game in offense. This balanced approach has made him one of the more successful coaches in the country.

As a player, Selvig demonstrated the same defensive skills that would later characterize his teams. As a senior guard at the University of Montana in 1974, he was selected as the team's Outstanding Defensive Player. The same year, he was a second-team All-Big Sky choice and was the winner of the school's top athletic award, the Grizzly Cup.

Selvig Received his bachelor's degree in health and physical education from UM in 1974. Prior to coming back to the University of Montana, he was head girl's basketball coach at Plentywood High School from 1975 to 1978.

### **Assistant Coach Annette Whitaker**

Annette Whitaker begins her sixth season as the assistant coach of the Lady Griz basketball program. She was the Montana junior varsity coach for each of her first two seasons with the program and now assists head coach Robin Selvig in all coaching duties. Those duties include game strategy, recruiting, conditioning, scouting, etc.

As a collegian, she was a two-year starter at point guard for the Lady Griz and is among the top 20 all-time career scorers with 322 points.

Prior to her career at the University of Montana, Whitaker was a basketball standout at Cashmere, WA, and Wenatchee Valley College.

She is a 1982 graduate of the University of Montana and holds a bachelor's degree in health and physical education.



### Graduate Assistant Sharla Muralt



Former University of Montana standout Sharla Muralt enters her first season as a graduate assistant to Robin Selvig and Annette Whitaker.

During her career, Muralt was a threeyear starter at center and her 1157 career points ranks fourth on the all-time Lady Griz list. In addition, her total of 729 rebounds is third in the school's history.

The 23-year-old native of Missoula is a graduate of Sentinel High School. She is currently working on a degree in business management.

### The Outlook

After a 27-4 season, a Mountain West Conference Championship, and a second round appearance in the NCAA Tournament, just what does Head Coach Robin Selvig and the Lady Griz basketball team do for an encore? Well if you talk to Selvig, the answer is quite simple — "take each game of the next season one at a time."

To look at the Lady Griz, there is plenty of reason for optimism. Three starters return among 10 letterwinners and there is plenty of depth. But Selvig realizes that a bright outlook does not guarantee a successful season. "During the course of a season, so many things can happen that you don't plan on," he said.

Whether or not some of those "things" happen or not, there are many coaches who would like to enter the season with the potential the Lady Griz have

Montana suffered two significant losses in center Sharla Muralt and guard Cheryl Brandell. Both averaged 10 points per game and finished in the top three on the team in scoring and rebounding. Fortunately, there is a host of young talented players to fill the vacated jobs.

There are four candidates for the center spot and Selvig will be taking a long look at each of them. Sophomore Lisa McLeod  $(6-1^{1/2})$  saw the most playing time last season. As a freshman, she set a school record by rejecting 47 opposing shots. Senior Laurie Strube  $(6-2^{1/2})$  has been a dependable backup throughout her career.

Two other promising candidates for the center position are sophomore Linda Mendel (6-1) and redshirt freshman Kris Haasl (6-3). Mendel is a scoring threat while Haasl excels defensively.

At forward, the Lady Griz have two of the better ones in the Mountain West in juniors Marti Leibenguth (6-2) and Dawn Silliker (6-0). Leibenguth led the team in scoring with 11.8 points per game while Silliker chipped in 8.8. Support comes in the form of sophomore Jean McNulty (6-0) and talented freshman Marti Kinzler (5- $11^{1/2}$ ). McLeod could also see action here as well.

The Lady Griz will be directed by three-year starter Margaret Williams at point guard. The speedy Williams has led the Lady Griz to 54 victories in her 62 career starts.

Bidding to play opposite of Williams is senior Natalie Chamberlain (5-9), and juniors Kris Moede (5-9½) and Karyn Ridgeway (6-0). Chamberlain was a starter two years ago and saw plenty of action last season. Sharpshooter Moede appeared in 30 games in '85 while converted forward Ridgeway has shown promise.

Last year's team (No. 1 in the nation in scoring defense) held the opposition to an average of 53.8 points per contest. The 1986 version of the Lady Griz will be no different. "You won't always have a good offensive night," said Selvig. "But good defense can always keep you in the game."

While the trademark of the Lady Griz had been defense, it is not the only dimension. "We are proud of our reputation, but defense is no more important than offense," said Selvig. Last season the Lady Griz averaged 66.8 points per game.

Defensive prowess and offensive firepower could prove to be the combination that keeps Montana at the top of the Mountain West Conference.

## Natalie (Streeter) Chamberlain 22/23

Guard . . . 5-9 . . . Senior . . . Great Falls, MT

Natalie is one of the key returnees for the Lady Grizzlies this coming season after seeing considerable action as a reserve in 1985-86.

As a junior she adopted the role of the team's "sixth-man" and responded by averaging 6.2 points and 1.7 rebounds per game. In addition, she led the team in free throw percentage (.756) for the second straight season.

Natalie became a starter in 1984-85 as a sophomore and averaged 7.2 points and 2.7 rebounds per game despite nagging injuries.

A native of Great Falls, MT. Natalie came to the University of Montana after a tremendous career at Great Falls High

School where she averaged 18.5 points and 8.4 rebounds for the season.

SELVIG SAYS: "Natalie is a very intelligent player and a hard worker on offense. She's coming off a tremendous conference season in '85 and should continue playing well this season."

Laurie is one of the leading candidates for the center slot vacated by Sharla Muralt. So far she has demonstrated the scoring ability and the athletic talent to take over the position.

In a reserve role last season, Laurie averaged 1.4 points and 0.9 rebounds per game. In her career at Montana she has played in 61 games.

Laurie was an All-Conference selection at Magic City Campus High School in Minot, ND and averaged 14 points and 9 rebounds per contest. In addition, she connected on 68.5 percent of her field goals.

Margaret will return for her third season as a starter for Coach Selvig at the point guard position. In the two seasons that she has been the point guard, the Lady Griz have compiled an overall record of 54-8 (.871 winning percentage).

Margaret's quickness makes her a threat both offensively and defensively. This was evident in that she averaged 7.0 ppg and was second on the squad with 45 steals in 1985-86.

In her first year as a starter (1983-84), Margaret averaged 5.5 points and had 59 steals.

year coming off of an injury. The pride and intensity that she has on defense makes everyone on the court a better player."

Throughout her career as a Grizzly, Marti's trademark has been versatility, and she should continue that trend during the 1986-87 season.


Alternating between guard and forward last season. Marti led the team with an 11.8 scoring mark, a .572 shooting percentage and 178 rebounds.

One of three returning starters, Dawn enters the 1986-87 season as the team's leading active scorer (555 points) and rebounder (329).

Last season she averaged 8.8 points and 5.3 rebounds per game and had a season high 20 points against Idaho State. As a sophomore, she started all 31 games, was MVP of the Lady Griz Insurance Classic and earned all-tournament honors in the Santa Clara Holiday Classic.

As a senior at Whitefish High School, Dawn averaged 21 points and 14 rebounds per game. She was a three-time all-conference and all-state selection and received Converse High School All-America recognition as a senior. She set 12 school

### Shelli Sniffin 10/11


Guard . . . 5-6 . . . Freshman . . . Lander, WY
