The University of Montana in Missoula is located in a mountain forest setting in beautiful Western Montana. It is halfway between Glacier and Yellowstone national parks.

Four wilderness areas are located near Missoula. The natural surroundings offer excellent opportunities for hunting, fishing, backpacking, river floating, camping and other outdoor recreational pursuits. Two excellent winter ski areas are located within minutes of the university. Several other ski areas are only a couple of hours away by car. UM owns and operates its own golf course adjacent to campus.

The University of Montana is one of the West's pioneers in education and was chartered February 17, 1893. The school opened in September 1895, with 50 students enrolling the first day. Located on 201 acres at the base of Mount Sentinel, UM has grown from 50 students and seven faculty members to a present enrollment of 9,697 and approximately 450 full-time faculty positions.

Through its history, the University of Montana has sustained a high standard of academic excellence in teaching, research and service.

UM offers associate of arts degrees in two areas and bachelors in 58 fields. It offers master's degrees in 54 programs and doctoral degrees in 13.

The College of Arts and Sciences, which is the core of the university, includes a full range of programs and courses in the life sciences, physical sciences, social sciences and humanities. The college also offers curricula in interdisciplinary fields ranging from ethnic studies to interdepartmental studies.

Seven professional schools complete the academic program - Business Administration, Fine Arts, Journalism, Education, Forestry, Law, and Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences.

The aim of the university is to provide its students with relaxing and meaningful learning experience with the best facilities possible. The administration, faculty and staff strive for this goal.

SUCCESS...A Lady Griz Tradition

Lady Griz basketball fans have come to expect success and head coach Robin Selvig's teams have delivered. Over the past four seasons, UM has posted records of 27-4, 26-5, 28-2, and 27-4. UM has advanced to the NCAA second round two years in-a-row.

The 1989-90 squad had five high school standouts join the returning letterwinners from last season's Big Sky Conference championship team.

There were big shoes to fill as last season's Top Newcomer of the conference went down with an knee injury one week before season play began. Vicki Austin, a 5-7 guard from East Moline, Illinois was averaging 10.6 points, 2.5 rebounds and 3.8 assists. There were no hopes of her returning to the court for the Lady Griz as she used her redshirt year her first season at Montana.

But the Lady Griz conquered the conference anyway sweeping 16-0 for the second year in-a-row and Head Coach Robin Selvig is pleased.

"It's great!! I'm real proud of the kids," he said. "I thought there were some very good teams in the league this year. To have been consistent enough to go undefeated, I think, was a real credit to the number of kids who contributed."

The Lady Griz lost only two games this season to Washington 67-58 and San Francisco 70-61, both in preseason action.

Montana leads the Big Sky Conference in scoring offense (74.1 ppg), scoring defense (56.0 ppg), scoring margin (+18.1), field goal percentage offense (.470) and defense (.361), three point field goal percentage (.393), assists (19.0 apg), rebounding average offense (43.2 rpg) and defense (34.1 rpg), rebounding margin (+7.1), and blocked shots (4.6 bpg).

The Lady Griz are also ranked nationally in five categories. UM is fifth in won-lost percentage (.917), fourth in scoring defense (53.3 ppg), fifth in field goal percentage defense (.359), third in current win streak (19) and ninth in scoring margin (18.7).

Montana is also ranked seventh nationally in attendance averaging 2,788 fans per home game.

Head Coach Robin Selvig is 284-71 in twelve years as head coach and is ranked sixth nationally behind coaches from Louisiana Tech, Long Beach, Iowa, Texas and Auburn.

Montana powerhouse and All-American candidate Jean McNulty, a 6-0 senior forward from Whitehall, Montana, leads the team and the conference in scoring averaging 20.3 points per game. She broke two Montana records this season: Most points in a single game (35) and most points in a single season (528). Seven times this season she has scored 25 points or more and has led the team in scoring 13 times. A GTE All-District selection for the

second year in-a-row, she was chosen Player of the Week three times this season, matching teammate Cate's three awards.

Cate, a 6-1/2 forward from Billings, is Montana's second powerhouse. Ranked second in scoring at Montana and in the league behind teammate McNulty, she averages 19.7 points per game. She is also ranked third in conference rebounding (8.7 rpg) and fourth in assists (4.2 apg). She, too, has led the team in scoring 13 times this season and has scored 20 points or more ten times this season. She was selected the Domino's Pizza Classic MVP in December. She is the highest-scoring freshman in UM basketball history and shared the conference's Freshman of the Year award.

Sophomore guard Julie Epperly has been the one to fill Austin's shoes and has done a fine job. The 5-6 Kalispell native leads the Big Sky in assists averaging 5.2 per game. She averages 5.0 points and 1.6 rebounds per game.

Senior center Kris Haasl took the place of all-time leading scorer Lisa McLeod. She averages 5.4 points and 6.0 rebounds per game. She is second in league blocking averaging 1.7 per game. Haasl is a native of Florence, Montana.

Junior forward Marti Kinzler completes the starting five for the Lady Griz. The 5-11 Fairview native averages 9.8 points and 6.1 rebounds per game and was chosen Player of the Week once this season.

A well-rounded team, the Lady Griz have strong players coming off the bench. Two redshirts preparing for next season are forward Ann Lake and guard Kristin Omlid.

The Lady Griz have won the Big Sky tournament five out of the last seven years and are 65-2 against conference foes in the last four years. Montana has won 36 straight games against Big Sky opponents.

UM has advanced to the NCAA Tournament five times since 1983 with four of those years being second round competition. Last season the Lady Griz defeated Cal State-Fullerton 82-67 in first round action, but lost to the Texas Longhorns 83-54 in second round action.

With an overall record of 25-2, the Lady Griz are hopeful of improving that record in postseason action this year.

HEAD COACH ROBIN SELVIG
284-71, 12 Years

The winningest basketball coach in Montana history, Robin Selvig is ranked sixth in NCAA Division I won-lost percentage. With a won-lost percentage of 80.0 percent, he follows coaches from Louisiana, Long Beach, Iowa, Texas and Auburn.

He has been named the conference Coach of the Year six times in the 1980s (1983, 84, 86, 87, 88, 89).

Selvig has guided the Lady Griz to 65 wins and only two losses to conference foes in the last four years, and has led them to ten 20-win seasons in-a-row. His teams have won regular season conference titles seven of eight of the past nine seasons.

He and the Lady Griz have become a Missoula favorite averaging 2,679 fans per game. Last season Montana was ranked seventh in NCAA Division I attendance. UM set a school record in attendance in 1988-89 with an average of 3,161 fans.

NCAA rankings this season put the Lady Griz fifth in won-lost percentage (.917), fourth in scoring defense (53.3), fifth in field goal percentage defense (.359), third in current win streak (10) and ninth in scoring margin (18.7).

Selvig and his team have advanced to post season action the last eight seasons in-a-row, including four NCAA second round games. In the 1988 second round game Montana lost a heartbreaker to Stanford 74-72 in overtime.

Selvig played the guard position for Montana from 1971 to 1974. He was an All-Big Sky Conference pick as a senior and was selected the winner of the John Eaheart Award for the most outstanding defensive player. That same year he was awarded the school's top athletic award, the Grizzly Cup. In 1983 Selvig was inducted into the Grizzly Basketball Hall of Fame.

He earned his bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education at UM in 1974.

Selvig came to UM from Plentywood High school near his hometown of Outlook Montana. After graduating from college, he returned home to coach girl's basketball from 1975 to 1978 where he compiled a record of 38-24.

His brother, Doug Selvig, was a four-year letterman for the Grizzly basketball team in the early 80's as was his sister Sandy (Sullivan).

Selvig is married to Janie and they have two sons, Jeff 8, and Dan 5.

Assistant Coach Annette Whitaker-Rocheleau

This is Whitaker-Rocheleau's ninth season as an assistant basketball coach at UM under Head Coach Robin Selvig. She served as junior varsity coach her first two years. She assists Selvig with all coaching duties including game strategy, recruiting, conditioning and scouting.

Before she was appointed assistant coach, Whitaker-Rocheleau was a graduate assistant to Selvig for two years.

Prior to joining the coaching ranks, Whitaker was a two-year starter at point guard for the Lady Griz. Whitaker-Rocheleau was also a basketball standout at Wenatchee Valley College where she captained her team as a sophomore. She played basketball for Cashmere High School in Cashmere, Washington from 1974 to 1977. She also earned four letters in tennis in high school.

She received her bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education in 1982.

Last summer she married Keven Rocheleau, also a former Grizzly basketball player.

Student Assistant Coach Marti Leibenguth

After playing professional basketball for a year in Roquebrune Cap Martin, France, Marti Leibenguth returned home last fall to start her first season as student coach for the Lady Griz.

One of the most consistent performers in Lady Griz history, Leibenguth is the second leading scorer in Montana history with 1,360 career points. She is third on the rebounding list with 830 career boards. Shooting 57.2 percent from the field in 1985-86, she holds the school record for the highest field goal percentage.

Leibenguth was named Lady Griz MVP as a sophomore and a senior. She received the Grace Geil/Most Improved Player Award as a sophomore. As a junior she received the Theresa Rhoads Coaches' Awards, and was named the Domino's Pizza Woman Athlete of the Year.

She competed in track and field at Montana for three years and holds the javelin record (160-1) which she set in 1985.

She was recruited by UM from Missoula Big Sky High School.

Leibenguth will graduate this spring with a degree in math education.

LADY GRIZ POSTSEASON ACTION

1988-89: NCAA Second Round

Leading 38-19 at the half, the Lady Griz went on to defeat Cal State-Fullerton 82-67 in first round action of the NCAA tournament. In front of a 6,074 home crowd, Montana shot 54.4 percent from the field against CSF's 35.7 percent. Jean McNulty led all with 22 points, eight rebounds.

Traveling to Austin, Texas for second round competition, the Lady Griz, behind 33-27 at the half, lost to the University of Texas 83-54. In front of 9,108 Longhorn fans, the Lady Griz shot 32.9 percent from the field against UT's 54.2 percent. Against Jean McNulty led Montana with 14 points.

1987-88: NCAA Second Round

In front of 8,709 Montana fans, the Lady Griz lost an agonizing NCAA second round game to Stanford 74-72 in overtime. Tied at 34 at half time, the Lady Griz shot only 36.0 percent for the game against Stanford's 38.3 percent. Marti Leibenguth led all with 27 points, 13 rebounds.

1986-87: Women's NIT

The Lady Griz lost to the University of Arkansas 92-74 in the first round of the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT). Behind 46-30 at the half, the Lady Griz 45.6 percent from the field compared to UA's 50.9 percent. Jean McNulty and Lisa McLeod each led with 14 points.

After losing to the Razorbacks, UM went on to defeat DePaul University 75-73 after leading 42-35 at the half. Both teams shot 49.2 percent from the field, but Kris Moede's 16 points and Marti Leibenguth's 15 helped the Lady Griz come out on top. Jean McNulty had 10 points, three rebounds.

In third round action, the Lady Griz lost to Stephen F. Austin 78-68 after trailing by only six at the half (38-32). Montana shot 53.3 percent from the field, but the Lumberjacks shot 66.6 percent. Lisa McLeod led with 24 points, six rebounds.
