FINALIST FOR POST OF DEAN OF UM BUSINESS SCHOOL
WILL BE ON CAMPUS FOR INTERVIEWS THURSDAY

MISSOULA--

David W. Ortlieb of Kildeer, Ill., one of four finalists for the post of dean of the School of Business Administration at the University of Montana, will be interviewed on campus Thursday.

Ortlieb is president and CEO of Erbamont N.V., a diversified health care company operating worldwide. He has also been an executive with Mead Johnson and with Abbott Laboratories. He is a director of Bemis Company, a packaging and industrial products business.

Ortlieb has been a lecturer in the Graduate School of Business at Indiana University, where he earned M.B.A. and D.B.A. degrees.

UM Academic Vice President Donald Habbe said the administration will make its recommendation on the position to the Board of Regents this spring. The position will become vacant July 1, following the retirement June 30 of the present dean, Paul B. Blomgren.

It is hoped the university's largest professional school will have a new dean before fall quarter starts in September, Habbe said.

A committee headed by UM Law Dean John O. Mudd screened 60 applicants drawn by a nationwide search begun in the fall of 1984. The 11-member committee was made up of representatives of the business community and the UM administration, faculty and student body.

Mudd said interviews will be scheduled with other finalists after the committee contacts them.
