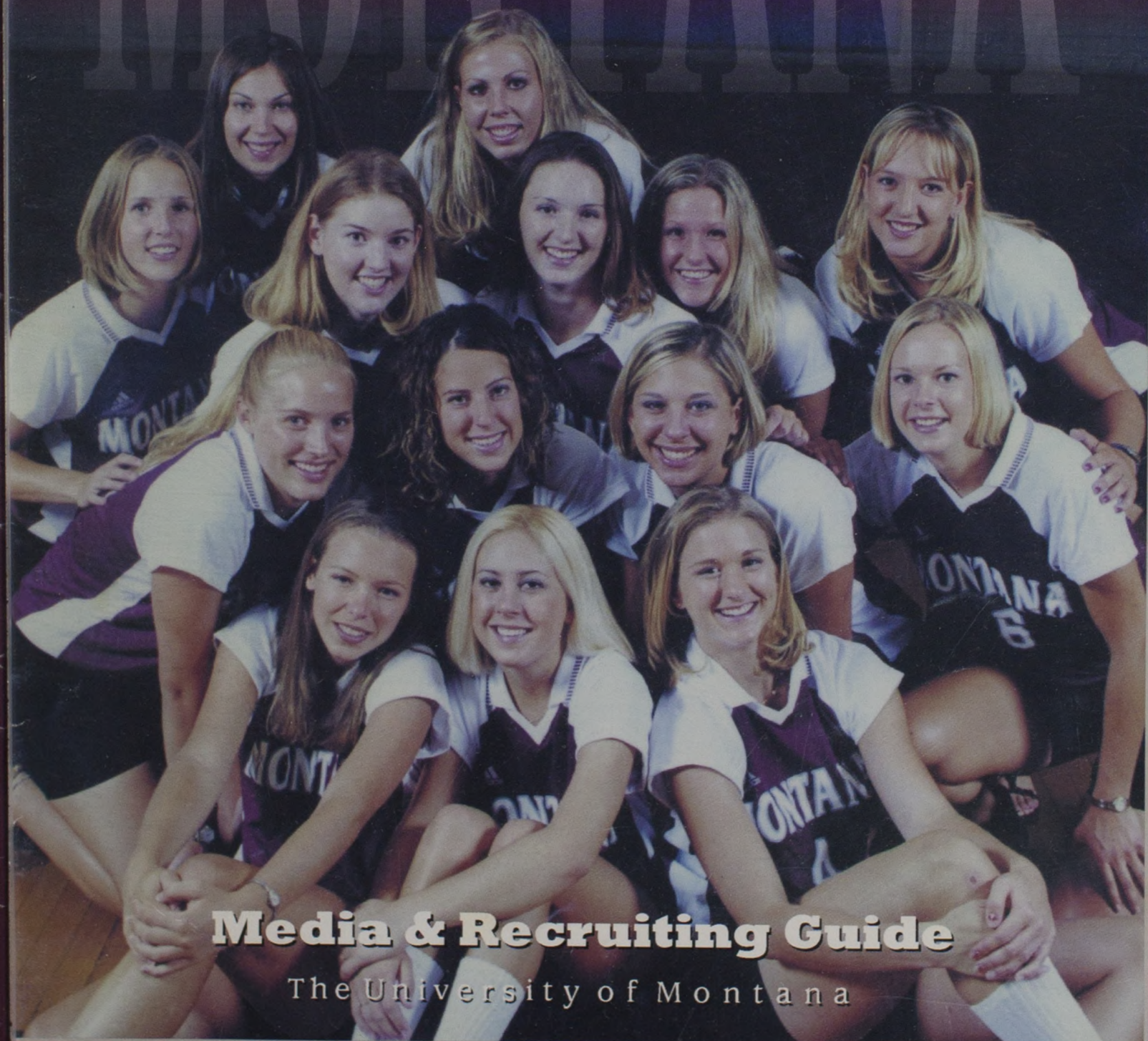

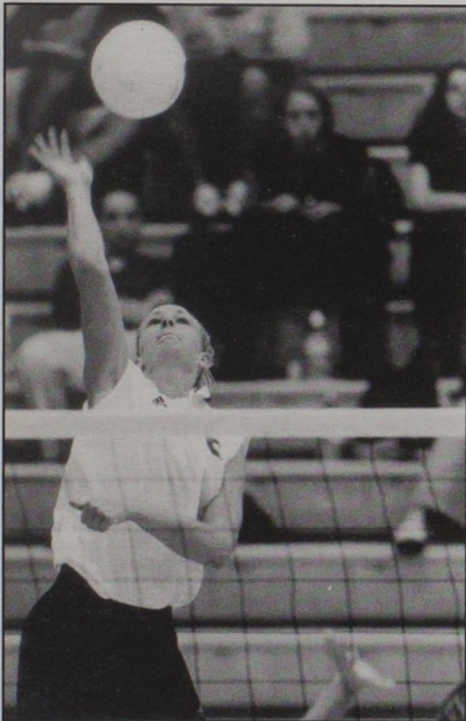

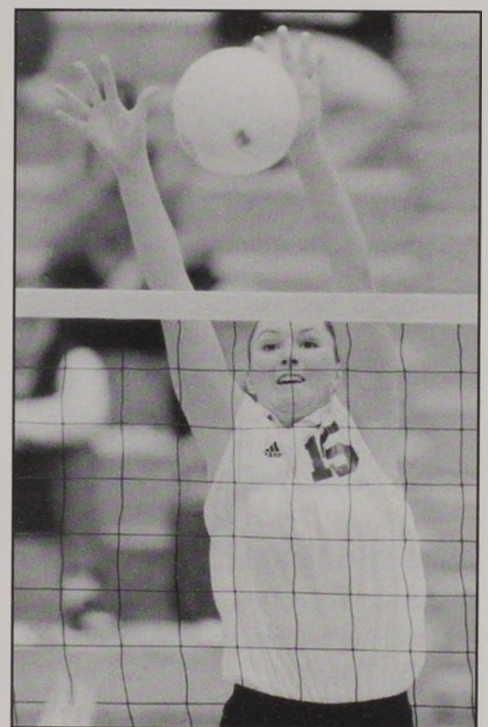

# 2000 Season Outlook

The University of Montana volleyball team starts the 21st century with a number of new looks but hopes to keep one tradition from the 20th century - numerous visits to the Big Sky Conference Championships.

Montana enters the 2000 season with a new head coach in Nikki Best, who takes over after spending the past four seasons at the University of Nebraska. She has her sights on returning Montana to the elite of the Big Sky Conference and to the NCAA Tournament. Serving as assistants this season will be Dave Best and Stacie Maser. Former Griz standout Katie Almquist joins the coaching staff after completing her eligibility last season.

The coaching change has given the Grizzlies a new outlook on the season. UM has had a strong tradition in volleyball (16 appearances in the Big Sky tournament and three NCAA berths) and this season could shape up to be another stellar campaign.

For starters, Montana returns three seniors who could go down among the school's all-time best.

- Erin Adams** (Milwaukie, Ore.) returns at outside hitter after being a second-team all-conference pick last season. She was one of one three players last season to record 300+ kills and digs.
- Kodi Taylor** (Bridger) was a Big Sky honorable mention pick last year after leading UM in kills and blocks at middle blocker. Her versatility and hitting ability could allow her to be used in various frontline positions.
- Setter Tara Conner** (West Linn, Ore.) is back to run the squad after posting one of the school's top seasons last year. She was named most valuable player at two tournaments as UM opened the 1999 campaign by winning tournaments at Wisconsin-Green Bay, Boise State and the Montana Invitational.

"We have a senior setter, a senior middle blocker and a senior outside hitter. To me, that's great balance," said Best. "They are great leaders and physically exceptional players. Tara allows the other two to be versatile because of her strengths as a setter. Erin and Kodi can hit any ball set to them at any tempo. Their experience, their leadership and their physical talent are what makes them stand out. They've seen success and failure and are motivated to end on a positive note."

But foes will have to worry about more than the presence of those three.

Junior **Joy Pierce** (Fort Collins, Colo.), who started various times last season, raised her game in the Big Sky Championships. She recorded 12 kills while hitting .500.

Pierce also had a career-best 106 blocks last season. **Lindsay Kaiser** (Jr., Stockton, Calif.) will continue to see playing time. Kaiser recorded 10-or-more digs and kills against Idaho State last season after leading UM in service aces in 1998.

Sophomore **Teresa Stringer** (Phoenix, Ariz.) returns at middle blocker. An intense player, Stringer is a threat offensively as well as defensively. Sophomore **Katy Kubista** (Tacoma, Wash.) saw limited action last season but her reach and leaping ability will grant her playing time.

A pair of redshirt freshmen, **Audra Pearce** (Walla Walla, Wash.) and **Mary Forrest** (Boring, Ore.) showed improvement during spring practices.

**Natalie Jacksha** (Gresham, Ore.) joins the team after spending two seasons at Southwest Missouri State. **Claire Thompson** (San Clemente, Calif.), **Marci Kaiser** (Stockton, Calif.), **Samantha Weber** (Anchorage, Alaska) and **Lizzie Wertz** (Oakland, Calif.) could figure into the playing rotation as incoming freshman.

Best and the rest of the coaching staff started to instill a new attitude and saw it pay results during spring practices. She hopes that thought pattern will carry over this fall.

"I challenged the team this spring into coming out solid for the first five to 10 points and take control of the match," she said. "I wanted the players to come out and control the tempo. It can be as simple as serving tough. If you come out serving bullets, some teams back off right away."

"Personally, I'm more comfortable coming out strong from the get-go. We're encouraging that by making them play shorter games," continued Best. "If we come out and play hard at the beginning, we have a better chance of controlling the match. If we wait until the end, we might or might not have a chance to do that. I don't want to wait and find out."

But most of all, Best is looking forward to her first season at the helm of Montana volleyball.

"I'm looking forward to putting the puzzle together of the season - how we use our strengths to attack the other teams' weaknesses and take advantage of tendencies," she said. "It should be a great year."

# Head Coach

## Nikki Best



Success in athletics has been a part of life for Nikki Best for as long as she can remember.

While attending Lincoln East High School (Neb.), she was named the state's athlete of the year by two publications for her volleyball exploits. Her storybook career continued after enrolling at the University of Nebraska.

The Cornhuskers posted a 106-20 record with three conference championships during her four seasons. She capped her career as the 1993 Big Eight Player of the Year and an AVCA all-Midwest Region pick. Best finished her career with a then school-record 3,786 assists and also ranking among the school's leaders in block assists.

A three-time all-conference performer in the classroom as well as on the court, Best graduated and was named the head coach at South Dakota School of Mines and Technology. She guided the Hardrockers to a 53-33 record and one conference title in the 1994 and 1995 seasons.

Best then returned to Nebraska as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. The Huskers recorded a 116-20 overall record to go with a 71-9 conference record in four seasons. Nebraska won three Big 12 titles and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 four times, twice reaching the Final Four.

Now Best turns her attention to The University of Montana volleyball program.

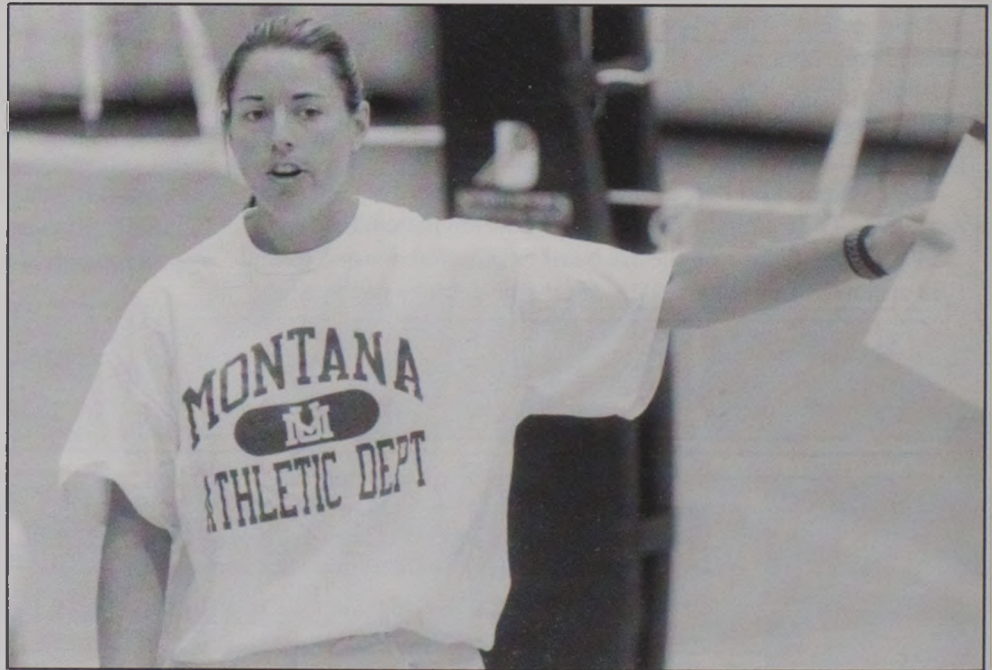
With nationally-renowned abilities as a recruiter, Best aims to keep the program among the elite in the Big Sky Conference. UM has competed in 16 of the past 18 postseason conference tournaments.

She will attempt to mold Montana in her image - a calm exterior masking an intense and driven interior. Those emotions come across when observing her guiding her team in practice or talking about the upcoming season. Best is

attempting to have the Griz play an aggressive style, one which will allow them to grab the game's initial momentum.

On the court, Best trains the middle blockers and setters, positions she played in college, as well as overlook the entire offensive attack.

Best earned a bachelor's degree in elementary education in 1994. She and her husband, Dave, were married on July 30, 1994.

## Dave Best



Dave Best, in his first season on the Grizzly staff, looks to make Montana volleyball one of the elite programs. Together, Dave and his wife, Nikki, have hopes of becoming one of the nation's top coaching tandems.

As the head assistant, Best comes to UM after spending the past three seasons at the University of Nebraska as a volunteer coach. The Cornhuskers recorded two Big XII Championships to go with a 52-8 league mark, one Final Four appearance and an overall record of 86-15.

His primary on-court duties will include training the outside attackers, primary passers, team defensive tactics and training the student-athletes for the game's mental challenges. Best's time off of the playing floor will be spent serving as a liaison for the marketing and promotion of the program and as camp director.

## Stacie Maser



Stacie Maser joins the Montana coaching staff this season. Maser's primary responsibilities will be the on-court training of the middle blockers and right-side hitters. She will also be involved in administering home events, opponent preparation and video editing, as well as various recruiting duties.

Maser joins the Montana coaching staff after serving as an assistant coach at Lincoln (Neb.) High School for the 1999 campaign. She also served as coach for the Lincoln Juniors club team last year.

A middle blocker for the University of Nebraska, Maser was named the 1995 Big Eight Co-Newcomer of the Year after playing in 32 matches during Nebraska's national title run. She recorded 89 kills and hit .266 as the Huskers were 32-1 with a season-ending 31 consecutive victories. She was a Phillips 66 Academic All-Big Eight selection as a freshman.

Maser played in 27 of 34 matches as a sophomore, recording 123 kills and a .293 hitting percentage. She also had 19 total blocks and 17 digs. She was particularly impressive in the inaugural Big 12 season, hitting a team-best .375 with 38 kills on 72 attacks.

Maser, a Lincoln, Neb., native, graduated with distinction from Nebraska in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in exercise science. She was a *USA Today*/Mizuno First-Team High School All-American in volleyball.

As defensive coordinator, Best will implement his philosophy of team defense, stressing the importance of individual movements to create a well-balanced team defense. In order to prepare the team mentally for competition as well as practice, the squad will conduct mental training sessions to enhance the team chemistry and create dynamic problem-solving techniques.

Best also was an assistant coach at South Dakota Tech for two seasons. The Hardrockers posted a 53-33 record during those two seasons and won a conference title.

Best was an assistant coach for the elite Nebraska Junior club team in 1997 and coached many players who would continue their careers with the Cornhuskers.

A native of Dodge, Neb., Best played club volleyball at Nebraska for three seasons. He earned a bachelor's degree in recreation administration (1994) as well as a master's degree in athletic administration (1999) with an emphasis in team psychology, both from Nebraska.

## Katie Almquist



After a standout career with the Griz, Katie Almquist makes the transition to the sidelines as a volunteer coach this season.

As a senior last season, she recorded 379 digs, seventh-most in a season at UM, and 342 kills, 24th most in a season. She shared the team's most valuable player award in 1999 and also received

that honor in 1998.

A three-time academic all-conference performer, she also earned GTE Academic All-District 7 second-team honors in 1999.

She was an assistant coach for two seasons at Missoula High.

A native of Missoula, Almquist attended Big Sky High and led the squad to the 1994 State AA title. She was a two-time all-conference and all-state selection.

## Montana Administration

### George M. Dennison

### President



George Dennison, the 16th president of The University of Montana, begins his second decade at the University. He served on the NCAA Division I Board of Directors from 1997-2000, and chaired the Big Sky Conference Presidents' Council in 1992-93.

Dennison came to UM from Kalamazoo, Mich., where he served as the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs of Western Michigan University from 1987-90. In earlier years, he spent time at the Universities of Arkansas and Washing-

ton prior to 18 years at Colorado State University in Fort Collins.

At Colorado State, he started as a history professor then served in numerous other positions. He simultaneously held the positions of Associate Dean of the College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences and Associate Dean of the Graduate School for International Development Studies. He also served as Acting Academic Vice President, Associate Academic Vice President and Director of Admissions and Records.

### Wayne Hogan



Unprecedented growth and expansion have been the hallmarks of Athletic Director Wayne Hogan's tenure at The University of Montana. Serving as UM's 14th director of athletics, Hogan begins his sixth year with the Grizzlies in the fall of 2000. The success of the Montana program comes as no surprise to those who have followed Hogan's 23 years in the field of intercollegiate athletics.

In his association with three collegiate programs, the 44-year-old Hogan has known only victories and championships. He had the rare opportunity

to join the Montana program just as the 1995 Grizzlies began their immortal drive to the I-AA Football National Championship, winning their last eight games en route to the title and then 13 straight games in 1996. This came on the heels of a national title in 1994 while Hogan was serving his alma mater, Florida State University, where he spent 18 years in various athletic department capacities.

At Florida State, Hogan played an integral role in that program's rise from relative mediocrity in the 70s to one of the nation's premier athletic programs today. Along the way he filled almost every conceivable role, from a volunteer student intern in 1974 to director of athletics in 1994. During that time the Seminoles won 190 football games and 14 of 16 bowl games, joined the Atlantic Coast Conference and saw their basketball teams reach the Sweet 16 and the Elite 8 during the 90s.

Since his arrival at Montana, the football program has won 39 of 51 games, four Big Sky Conference Championships, appeared in the I-AA playoffs every year, won a national championship and then repeated an appearance in the national title game the following year. Perhaps the defining achievement of Hogan's tenure occurred both in 1996 and this past year when both men's and women's basketball teams won league championships along with football. A sweep of those three championships in a single year had never before been achieved in the 35-year history of the conference.

With a knack for marketing and communications, Hogan's contributions probably are best tallied by looking at the numbers. Attendance is up dramatically across the board. In football, season ticket sales, just 6,500 in 1995, will top 12,000 this year. Projections are for a complete preseason sellout for Washington-Grizzly Stadium. Average attendance is up from 11,000 at his arrival to better than 18,000. Annual giving is up by more than \$100,000 and corporate sponsorships have also seen a

An historian by training, Dennison received his Bachelor's degree with high honors in history from UM in 1962. He received his Master's degree from UM in 1963, then earned his Ph.D. in history from the University of Washington in 1967. He has written numerous publications and made several professional presentations in both history and higher education.

Dennison serves on several boards. He chairs the Governor's Council on Community Service and serves on the Board of the International Heart Institute of Montana, the Community Medical Center Advisory Committee, the Campus Compact Executive Committee, the Board of Directors of the International Student Exchange Program, the Steering Committee for America Reads/America Counts, and the Maureen and Mike Mansfield Foundation.

George and his wife, Jane, have two sons, Rick and Robert. Rick played college football at Colorado State then joined the Denver Broncos. He played linebacker for Denver for nine years and now serves as special teams coach. Robert teaches math and computer programming in Tecumseh, Kansas, and coaches football, wrestling, and track. The Dennisons have four grandchildren.

six-digit increase. Hogan has also fostered UM's royalty program which has seen revenues on licensed products jump from \$20,000 to well over \$100,000. In all, revenue generated by this area has grown from \$2.8 million in 1995 to a projected \$4.1 million this year.

Clearly Hogan's most visible role has been the undertaking of a \$14.7 million facility project which has converted the antiquated Harry Adams Field House into the sparkling new Adams Center. In addition to transforming the old gymnasium into a truly modern-day basketball arena, the project has given Grizzly athletics a roadway to the future. Included in the project is a massive indoor practice and volleyball game facility, a new double-the-size weight-training facility, a new and expanded medical treatment facility, an academic center for student-athletes and remodeled equipment and locker rooms. The crowning jewel of the project is the new John C. Hoyt Athletic Office Complex. Hogan recently received a gift of \$550,000 from Hoyt, a longtime UM supporter. That donation pushed a current fund-raising blitz to more than \$1.3 million just since last September.

These are just a few examples of Hogan's aggressive style that has the Grizzly program on the move. Somewhat behind the scenes, Montana has received its NCAA certification, satisfied numerous gender equity concerns including the complete equalization of recruiting, travel and equipment budgets, attacked a number of salary inequities and reorganized staff duties and responsibilities. During a recent State of the University address, President George Dennison called Hogan's program "the most efficient I-AA program in America."

After receiving a Bachelor's Degree in communications from Florida State in 1979, Hogan worked for two minor league baseball teams as a broadcaster and public relations specialist. He spent one year in Charleston, WV., with the Houston Astros AAA farm team before moving to Albuquerque and a stint with the Los Angeles Dodgers AAA club in the Pacific Coast League. While in Albuquerque Hogan was coaxed back into college athletics when he became the assistant sports information director at the University of New Mexico in 1981. He returned to Florida State in 1982 as the school's sports information director. He was promoted to Assistant Athletic Director in 1992 and served as the interim athletic director in 1994-95.

A native of Tallahassee, Fla., Hogan's father, Patrick, is a former sports information director and longtime college administrator at FSU. His wife, Dawn, is a native of Treasure Island, Fla. They have three children: Lindsay (18), Kelly (16) and J.P. (8).

The former Marie Hibbard was a four-year standout on the Jayhawk tennis team. She was the KU Outstanding Woman Student-Athlete in 1986, 1987 and 1988 and was a two-time GTE Academic All-American (1987, 1988). Porter was a recipient of an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship in 1988.

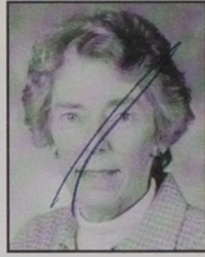

# Griz Volleyball: Success on the court and in the classroom

The University of Montana has had numerous successful achievements in academics and the UM athletic teams have as well.

After grades were released following the Spring 2000 semester, the athletic teams averaged a 2.96 grade-point average for the semester. That performance boosted UM athletic squads' cumulative GPA to a 2.96 as well. That mark is the highest one since the athletic department started tracking it. The previous best cumulative mark was a 2.95 GPA recorded after the Fall 1999 semester.

Approximately 56 percent of the Montana student-athletes received a 3.0-or-better GPA last semester as 144 of the 259 reached that level. Forty-four student-athletes were named to the Dean's List with 20 posting 4.0 GPAs.

The Grizzly volleyball team has won the past two Montana Athletic Director's Award (1999 and 2000) for posting the highest GPA of all of the teams and had sophomore outside hitter Katy Kubista be the 2000

recipient of the Montana President's Award for having the department's highest GPA. Inga Swanson won the President's Award in 1994 and 1995.

Montana has placed 49 student-athletes on the Big Sky Conference all-

academic team since 1986. Kodi Taylor will attempt to become the program's fourth student-athlete to earn the recognition all four years. Heidi Williams (1991-94), Dana Bennish (1994-97) and Paige Merritt (1995-98) also accomplished the feat.

An impressive 10 of the 15 student-athletes on the volleyball team recorded a 3.0-or-better GPA during the spring semester. The team combined for a 3.30 GPA for the semester and have a cumulative GPA of 3.18. Four student-athletes were named to the Dean's List.

One sign of UM's commitment to academics came in 1993 when the late faculty athletic representative Dr. Robert O. Lindsay developed a program at UM to honor student athletes who excel in the classroom. The program has developed into the Lindsay Scholar-Athlete Banquet. A total of 129 Montana student-athletes, who earned a 3.0 grade point average or higher, were invited to this past year's banquet.

The team continues to work out during the season and spring practices. However, that time is to maintain their performances rather than push to achieve new maximums.

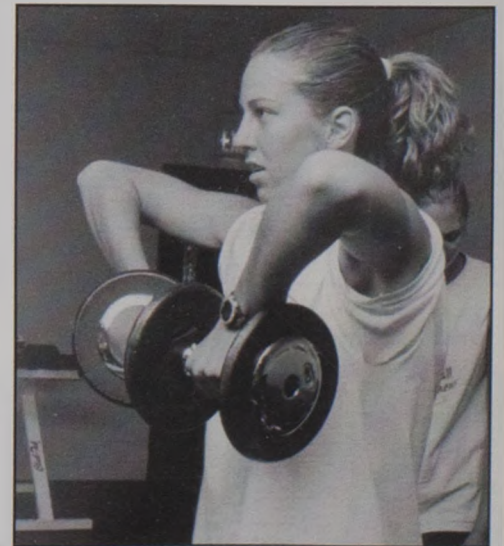
The squad undergoes an extensive off-season program in the summer as well as an eight-week program from January until the spring practice session begins.

A native of Stromsburg, Neb., Wieseman was recently married. His wife's name is Tara.

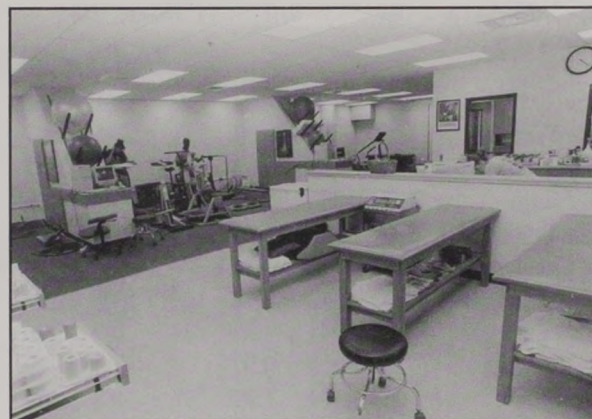
# Rhinehart Athletic Training Center

Completed in the fall of 1999, the newly-remodeled Rhinehart Athletic Training Center boasts 7,200 square feet of space and includes an enlarged rehabilitation area. Also included are athletic trainers' offices, six hydrotherapy units and a consulting office where nutritionists and doctors can meet with athletes. There are also classrooms for the athletic training curriculum.

Jennifer Mason, an assistant certified athletic trainer, serves as the primary contact for volleyball. She is in her third year working at Montana.

The RATC provides numerous ways to treat injuries: electrical stimulation units, whirlpools, free weights and balance boards. The primary goal of the athletic training staff is to provide quality care for student-athletes while helping them safely return to competition.

When a student-athlete is injured, an athletic trainer evaluates the severity of the injury and renders whatever care is needed. Depending on the extent of the injury, the

student-athlete visits the center daily, at least two to three times, for treatment and rehabilitation exercises. The athletic training staff works together with the Athletic Performance staff to monitor the student-athlete's strengthening exercises. Once the student-athlete has regained strength and function, they are allowed to return to the playing field or court.

Although athletic trainers provide injury care, they also promote injury prevention. Preventative maintenance occurs in the form of injury-screening processes, flexibility, taping and strengthening exercises.

Montana has a well-established athletic training curriculum which allows students to work directly with the student-athletes.

Michaela Bollwitt, a senior, works with the volleyball team this season along with Mason. Bollwitt, from Great Falls, is majoring in health and human performance with an emphasis in athletic training.



Naseby "Doc" Rhinehart came to Missoula in 1931 from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, to play football and basketball. He also competed in track and field where he had bests of 23 feet in the long jump and 140 feet in the discus.

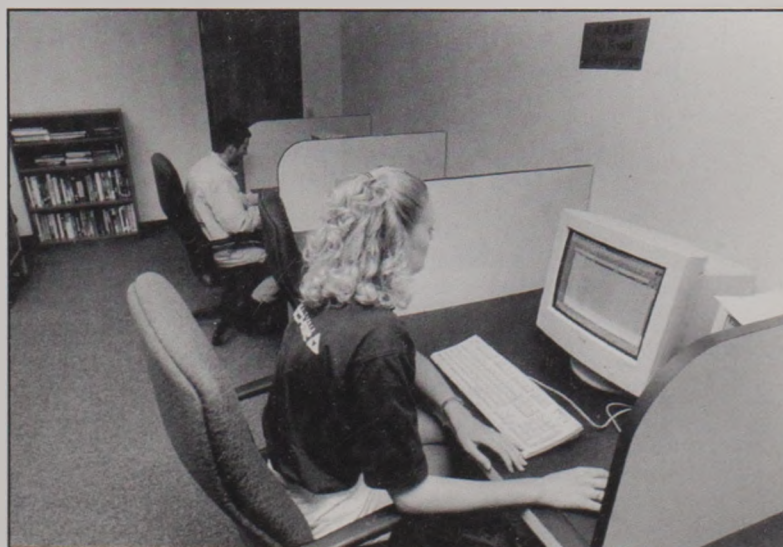
After graduating in 1935 from the University of Montana, Rhinehart was asked if he was interested in becoming the UM head certified athletic trainer. He did and stayed at the University for 47 years, retiring in 1982. He was one of the first people in the nation to develop an athletic training curriculum (1971) at a university.

## Jacobson Academic Center

The latest addition to academic services for student athletes is the Jacobson Academic Center. Thanks to the generous contributions of Curt and Lanni Jacobson, student-athletes now have a computer lab/study room to use during the day.

The Jacobson Academic Center has six computers and a laser printer. In addition, there are five additional spaces for individual studying. Finally, students have use of a small conference room for group studying.

The Jacobson Academic Center is located on the Adam Center's ground floor, down the hall from the weight room.

# Montana's Volleyball Venue

The Adams Center auxiliary gymnasiums were completed in 1998, providing Grizzly Athletics with two additional facilities for athletic events and practices.

The auxiliary gymnasiums are located just south of the newly-renovated Adams Center and north of the Grizzly Pool. The facility is split into two separate venues. The West Auxiliary Gymnasium (WAG) is the playing venue for the Montana volleyball program. The East Auxiliary Gymnasium (EAG) is a practice facility for all UM programs to use, particularly during the winter months when indoor training is needed.

The WAG is large enough to set up three volleyball courts, allowing it to be conducive to regular-season tournaments, summer camps and other events as needed. It also has been used as a practice area for both UM basketball teams.

The Griz christened the WAG with an impressive 10-1 record in its last season, highlighted by a season-opening eight-game win streak.

The WAG features a permanent maple wood floor and a high-intensity lighting system. A scoreboard from Dahlberg Arena was mounted on the south side of the WAG and permanent shot clocks for basketball were mounted behind the backstops. A state-of-the-art public-address system is in place, and eight speakers were installed at ceiling height to provide quality sound throughout the facility. The volleyball program also purchased nets, standards, pads, and transport carts to aid in the transition to the facility.

There is seating for 1,218 fans, providing an intimate atmosphere for matches.

The entire facility is handicap accessible from both the east and west sides. The connecting south concourse of Adams Events Center will be used for ticket sales, food and beverage sales, and restrooms.

Montana's main facility, the Adams Center, opened in the fall of 1999 after nearly two years and 15 million dollars of renovation. The improvements, along with the addition of the auxiliary facility, will make The University of Montana one of the best places to play in the Big Sky Conference.

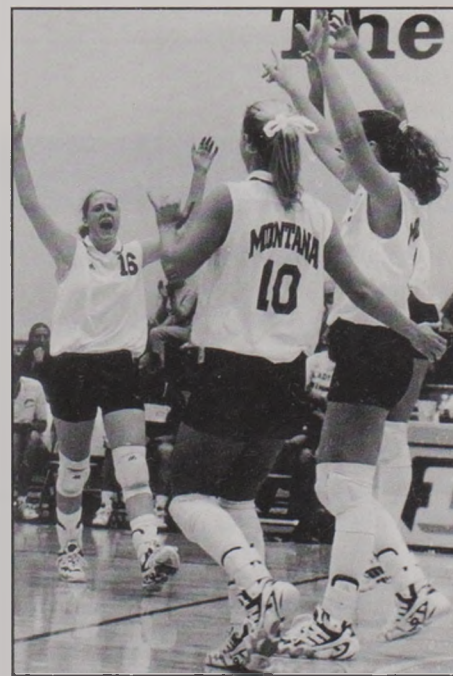

# Big Sky Conference

Although still youthful in the world of NCAA Division I athletic conferences, the 37-year-old Big Sky Conference has solidified itself as one of the strongest leagues in the west as well as the nation. The Big Sky begins its fifth year of the current nine-institution league membership after adding Cal State Northridge, Sacramento State and Portland State to the mix in 1996.

With its roots established in 1963, the Big Sky Conference began with six charter members: the University of Idaho, Idaho State University, Gonzaga University, The University of Montana, Montana State University and Weber State University. On July 1, 1970, the league experienced its first expansion, adding Boise State University and Northern Arizona University to the fold to create an eight-member league. On July 1, 1979, charter-member Gonzaga left the league and was replaced by the University of Nevada. In 1987, Eastern Washington was admitted to the league to create the first version of a nine-member Big Sky Conference. The University of Nevada's departure in 1992 made the Big Sky an eight-member league. On July 1, 1996, both Boise State and Idaho left the Big Sky, but the three additional institutions moved the league into a nine-member scenario for the second time.

The Big Sky Conference sponsors championships in 15 sports, including men's and women's cross country, golf, basketball, tennis, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, in addition to football and women's volleyball and soccer. The Big Sky is a NCAA Division I member in all sports, with member institutions classified as I-AA in football.

The 2000-01 athletic season is the 13th straight year the Big Sky Conference will sponsor championships in women's sports. Thirteen years ago, the Big Sky Conference merged with the Mountain West Athletic Conference, forming one

league for both men's and women's athletics. The Mountain West had been in existence since 1982, sponsoring championships for women's athletics at the same institutions the Big Sky had sponsored men's programs.

The Big Sky Conference member institutions are located in seven states spanning from the Pacific Ocean to the Rocky Mountains and from the Canadian to the Mexican borders. The entire west coast is now represented by the Big Sky with members in Washington, Oregon and California, and of the nine western-most states, only three (Alaska, Hawaii and Nevada) do not contain Big Sky members. League members can be found in Arizona, California, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Utah and Washington.

The name BIG SKY originated in a novel written in 1947 by the late A.B. (Bud) Guthrie of Great Falls, Mont., entitled *The Big Sky*. Jack Hollowell, former Montana Advertising Director, promoted the Big Sky theme for the Treasure State, and Harry Missildine of the Spokane *Spokesman-Review* called for the newly formed league to be named "The Big Sky Conference" in his column dated Feb. 20, 1963. Five days later, on February 25, the name Big Sky was adopted by the six presidents of the newly formed league.

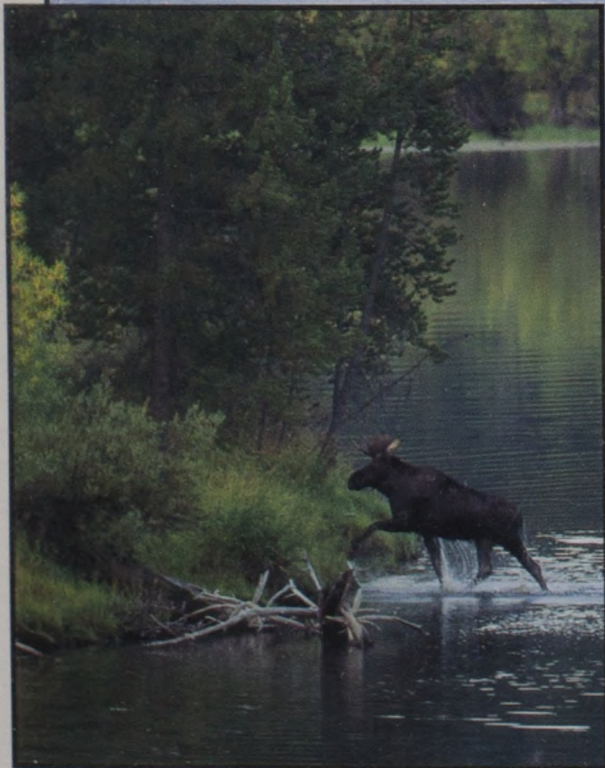
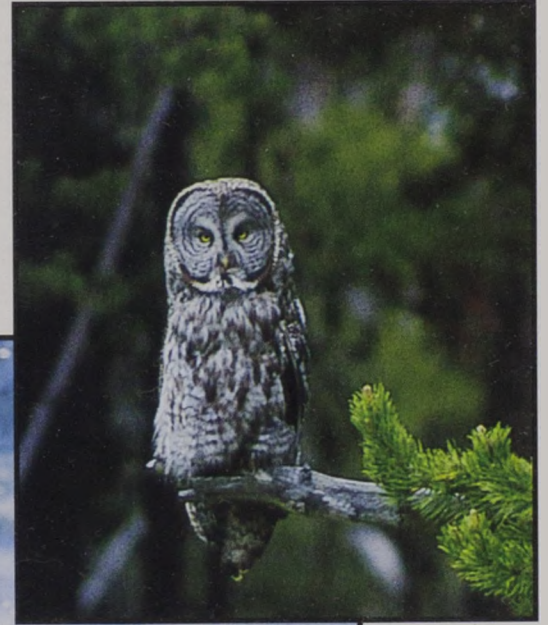
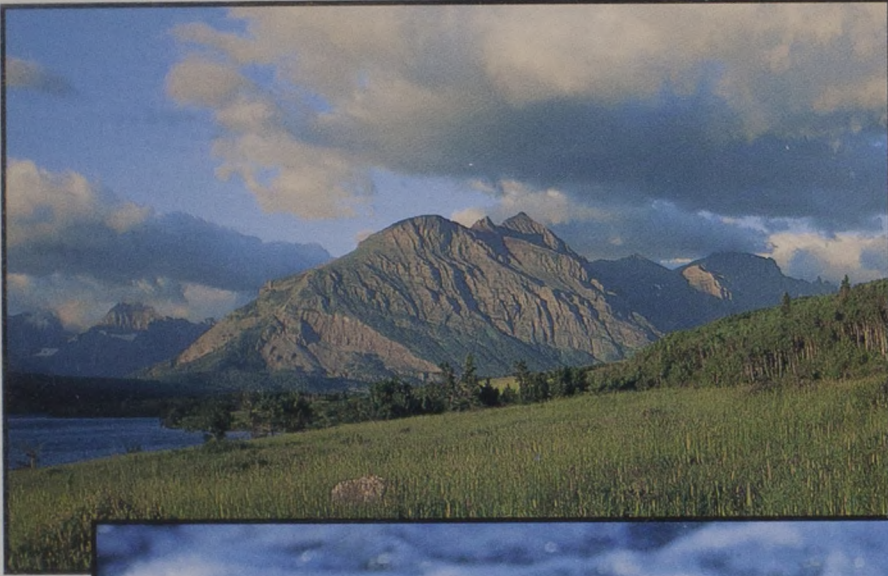
