NIKKI BEST

Head Coach

Nebraska, 1994

Fifth Season at Montana (35-67 record)

Seventh Season Overall (88-100 record)

The University of Montana volleyball program and fifth-year head coach Nikki Best both have a similar past: a long history of successful volleyball.

After joining the Mountain West Conference in 1982 and later the Big Sky Conference, the Grizzlies ran off a streak of top-three league finishes in 13 of the next 14 seasons, including Big Sky regular-season titles in 1991, '92 and '94. But after a stretch of just one winning season over the final five years of the 1990s, the program needed new direction.

Enter Best, who was hired as Montana's fourth coach in February 2000. Who better to move the Griz back to the top of the Big Sky Conference than a player who won nearly every individual award possible at storied Nebraska while leading the Huskers to a four-year mark of 106-20? Or a coach who won a league championship at South Dakota Tech in her first year of coaching? Or who returned to Nebraska to become the legendary Terry Pettit's top assistant and recruiter for four seasons that saw two trips to the national semifinals and a four-year mark of 116-19?

In her fifth season at UM, it still remains Best's goal to return Montana to a spot atop the league and surpass even the Griz's halcyon days of the 80s and early 90s.

In four years on the Montana bench, Best has compiled a record of 35-67, 13-45 in league play.

Injuries plagued the Grizzlies in 2000 and 2001. In 2000, Montana had a 12-6 overall record and a 4-1 Big Sky mark midway through the year, but season-ending injuries to two starters took a toll and the Griz finished with a 16-14 record. The season ended on a positive note as Montana made its 11th league tournament appearance in 13 years.

In 2001, the Grizzlies never fielded their pre-season starting lineup. Three key players missed extensive parts of the season, while a fourth missed the entire year as Montana struggled to a 5-16 finish.

Despite the loss of Katy Kubista for 14 matches during the 2002 season, the Grizzlies made great strides on the court, although the results did not always appear in the win-loss column. Montana finished the year with a 7-18 record, with eight losses coming in five games.

The 2003 Griz showed flashes of the level of play Best envisions for Montana volleyball, including an early-season tournament title at Missouri-Kansas City and a 3-0 victory over Montana State in November, but inconsistent play resulted in a 7-19 overall mark.

A native of Lincoln, Neb., Best remained home to attend the University of Nebraska for four standout seasons. After graduating in 1994, Best was named the head coach at South Dakota School of Mines and Technology in 1994. She guided the Hardrockers to a two-year mark of 53-33, including a league title in 1994.

Best then returned to Nebraska as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator.

On the court, Best coaches the middle blockers and setters, positions she played in college, as well as oversees the entire offensive attack.

Best and her husband, Dave, were married on July 30, 1994.

**Assistant Coach
Nebraska, 1994
Fifth Season at Montana**

Dave Best is in his fifth season on the Montana volleyball coaching staff. He has been coaching at the collegiate level since 1994.

Best's on-court coaching duties include working with the Grizzly outside hitters and primary passers and serving as the team's defensive coordinator. Off the court Best works on marketing the program and directing the Grizzly volleyball camps.

In 2001 Best started the Montana Volleyball Club, an organization dedicated to the continued training of coaches and players in western Montana.

In 2002 Best continued the growth of volleyball in the region with the creation of the Missoula Juniors Volleyball Club. In its first season the club attracted 60 athletes.

Best has also added international coaching to his resume during his time at Montana. In the spring of 2001 and the spring of 2002 Best coached U.S. teams in the Spring European Cup. In '01 he coached a team comprised mostly of former U.S. collegiate players. In '02 Best served as

the training coach for a U.S. expansion team.

Best began his collegiate coaching career in 1994 as an assistant coach at South Dakota Tech. In two seasons, the Hardrockers posted a 53-33 overall record and won the Dakota Athletic Conference title in 1994.

Prior to Montana, Best spent three seasons at Nebraska as a volunteer coach from 1997 to 1999. During those three years the Cornhuskers won two Big 12 Conference championships and recorded a 52-8 league mark while posting an overall mark of 86-15. Nebraska made a trip to the NCAA semifinals in 1998 and advanced to the NCAA tournament regional level three times.

A native of Dodge, Neb., Best played club volleyball at Nebraska for three seasons from 1990 to 1992. He earned a bachelor's degree in recreation administration (1994) as well as a masters degree in athletic administration (1999) with an emphasis in team psychology, both from the University of Nebraska.



ALLISON WESTON

**Assistant Coach
Nebraska, 1997
Third Season at Montana**

Allison Weston is in her third year on the Montana volleyball coaching staff. Weston, a former U.S. Olympic volleyball player, played collegiately at Nebraska where she was a two-year teammate of coach Nikki Best.

Weston's on-court duties include working with Montana's middle blockers while off the court she breaks down video and handles home events.

Weston is one of the premier players in NCAA and U.S. volleyball history. At Nebraska she started her career by earning 1992 Big 8 Conference Newcomer of the Year honors. Weston book-ended that honor by being named the 1995 AVCA co-National Player of the Year after leading the Cornhuskers to a 32-1 record and the national championship.

In between she was a three-time AVCA All-American, a two-time Big 8 Conference Player of the Year, a three-time All-Big 8 Conference selection and a two-time Big 8 Conference tournament MVP.

Also a success in the classroom, Weston was a

two-time Academic All-American and a three-time Academic All-Big 8 Conference selection.

Weston remains Nebraska's career kills leader (1,778) and ranks in the top 10 in several other categories.

The Cornhuskers went 110-14 during Weston's playing career.

After earning a bachelor's degree in natural resources from Nebraska in 1997, Weston joined the U.S. National Team in May 1997. Named team captain in January 1999, Weston led the squad at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia, and helped the U.S. advance to the bronze medal match. In 2000, Weston left the national team and played professionally in Italy for one season. She helped her team, AGIL, to a second-place finish in the Italian championship.

During the summer of 2002, Weston helped train the USA Volleyball A2 Team in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Weston is a native of Papillion, Neb.

In football a team needs to establish the run to set up the pass. In basketball it needs the outside scoring threat to open things up inside. Volleyball is no different. A multifaceted attack is required before any success is going to be enjoyed.

Montana volleyball coach **Nikki Best**, who is entering her fifth year as coach of the Grizzlies, believes her 2004 team finally has that kind of attack to rely upon, which should result in a much more competitive team and more wins this fall.

"Montana has a tradition of having strong outside hitters, and that should not change this year," Best said the day before her 2004 team was due to report to campus, "but for the first time since we've been here we'll have an established middle attack and experienced play at the setter position.

"That diversity in our offensive attack is going to make us a lot more offensive-minded and make us much more competitive. In past years we've been forced to try to stop teams from scoring on us. Now we think we are in a position to turn the table and force our opponents to try to stop us from scoring."

Best will have three starters and six letter-winners back from the 2003 Griz team that went 7-19 and finished eighth in the Big Sky Conference with a 2-12 mark. Five of Montana's 11 players will be playing in the maroon and silver for the first time, yet Best thinks experience is going to be a key asset for Montana this season.

"We've got holes to fill from the players who graduated last year, but we have experienced people coming in to fill those positions. Both the experience and maturity level of this team is much higher than teams we've had in the past."

The team's five newcomers include sophomore **Claudia Houle** and freshmen **Leah Wissing**, **Jessica Petersen**, **Micaela Parker** and **Jackie White**.

Houle ("ool," rhymes with pool) played her freshman season at Barton County (Kan.) Community College in 2003 and helped lead the Cougars to a 34-1 record and Barton County's first NJCAA national championship. But that was only the most recent of the 5-10 outside hitter's impressive litany of success. She also won three national titles as a prep star and two more club national championships while being raised in Ste. Anne du Sault, Quebec.

"Claudia's a winner and a great competitor," Best said. "She joins the program with a winner's mentality and after competing with the Canadian national team this summer, she will be the most experienced player we have."

Wissing also joins Montana with plenty of top-level playing experience. The Lincoln,

Neb., native competed last season at the University of Cincinnati and is a veteran of one of Nebraska's top club teams. Though the 6-0 outside hitter only saw action in two matches with the Bearcats last fall after suffering an injury, Best expects the lefthander to vie for playing time from the start of practice.

"Leah's one year of Division I experience and her competitiveness are going to allow her to compete for playing time this year," Best said. "She is an explosive jumper who has a very strong net game."

Petersen, a 6-3 middle blocker from Helena, Mont., redshirted last year. "Jessica should be a very effective player for us," Best said. "She is the type of player who is a quiet competitor: calm on the outside but someone who really wants to win."

Parker, a 6-0 outside hitter from Marysville, Wash., and White, a 5-7 defensive specialist from Bellevue, Wash., are Best's lone high school signees. Both were named to Washington all-state teams as seniors and both competed for the Washington Volleyball Academy.

"Micaela is a high-energy player and someone who loves volleyball," Best said. "She was the go-to player for both her club and high school team and is a strong attacker and an excellent passer."

"Jackie played outside hitter for both her club and high school teams, but she'll likely play libero for us. She'll do well in that position because she is so feisty and such a hustler and is quick to the ball."

Alice Myers, a 5-11 outside hitter from Klamath Falls, Ore., is the lone senior on this year's team. Myers played in 17 matches last year, averaging 0.55 kills per game mainly coming off the bench.

"Alice has a big heart, is selfless and will be a strong leader on this team," Best said. "She is a powerful attacker on the outside and hits a hard ball."

Junior **Audrey Jensen**, a 6-1 middle blocker from Minden, Neb., was Montana's most consistent player last year and is one of the middles that Best refers to when she talks of more experienced play at that position in '04. Jensen played in all 26 matches a year ago and led the team in both hitting percentage (.264) and total blocks (72).

"Audrey, who is our most aggressive offensive player entering the season, will be this team's leader," Best said. "She has a charismatic personality and is committed to seeing this team succeed."

Diana Thompson, a 5-11 junior setter from San Clemente, Calif., missed the Grizzlies' first 14 matches last year with an injury, but returned to average a team-best 8.00 assists per game over the season's final 12 matches. She

enters the season still battling some lingering injuries.

"If Diana returns 100 percent from her injuries, she has the potential to be a great setter for us," said Best. "She has great touch on her sets, a good mind for the game and really knows how to isolate her hitters."

Junior **Ashley Gorham**, a 5-11 outside hitter from Billings, Mont., averaged 0.92 kills per game and totaled 13 total blocks while seeing action in 16 matches last season.

"Ashley is an explosive jumper and is ultra-competitive," Best said. "She has really improved her backcourt passing and is one of our top blockers."

Because of the injury to Thompson, sophomore **Shelley Boyd**, a 5-7 setter from Missoula, Mont., was forced to start at the setter position last year from the opening match. She answered the challenge by leading the team with 748 assists and tying for the team lead with 26 service aces.

"Shelley is a great leader and such a positive influence on the team," Best said. "Not backing down from the challenge of starting as a freshman last year shows what kind of person she is."

Sophomore **EvaLyn Whitehead**, a 6-3 middle blocker from Hyrum, Utah, played in 24 of 26 matches a year ago and finished third on the team in blocks (57), fourth in kills (1.92 kpg) and fifth in hitting percentage (.141). Whitehead is another of the middles Best sees as bolstering that area of the Grizzly offense.

"EvaLyn has been our most improved player since the end of last year," Best said. "She has become more aggressive and has learned how to score. I look for EvaLyn to be an impact player for us this year."

The Season

"We open the season with three solid tournaments and face teams we should be competitive against," Best said of the upcoming season. "All of our pre-conference games will help us prepare for league play. And those out-of-town tournaments mean we'll be traveling a lot, which I think will help us grow and come together as a group."

The Grizzlies will be attempting to make the Big Sky Conference tournament this year for the first time since 2000, but the league should be as tough and as balanced as ever.

"The Big Sky Conference is going to be very solid from top to bottom again this year," Best said. "Every match is going to be important and no match is a given for any team."

"Our goal is simply to get into the tournament. When you get that far, anything can happen."

The 2004-05 athletic season marks the 42nd year of the Big Sky Conference and although still youthful in the world of NCAA Division I athletic conferences the Big Sky has solidified itself as one of the strongest leagues in the West as well as the nation.

Established in 1963, the Big Sky Conference began with six charter members: Idaho, Idaho State, Gonzaga, Montana, Montana State and Weber State.

On July 1, 1970, the league experienced its first expansion, adding Boise State and Northern Arizona to the fold to create an eight-member league. On July 1, 1979, charter member Gonzaga left the league and was replaced by Nevada. In 1987, Eastern Washington was admitted to the league to create the first version of a nine-member Big Sky Conference. Nevada's departure in 1992 moved the league to eight members until July 1, 1996, when both Boise State and Idaho left the Big Sky, but the three additional institutions moved the league into a nine-member scenario for the second time. Cal State-Northridge entered the conference in 1996 and left it in the spring of 2001.

The Big Sky Conference sponsors championships in 15 sports, including men's and women's cross country, golf, basketball, tennis, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, in addition to football, women's volleyball and soccer. The Big Sky is an NCAA Division I member in all sports, with member institutions classified as I-AA in football.

year in which the Big Conference will sponsor championships in women's sports. Thirteen years ago the Big Sky Conference merged with the Mountain West Athletic Conference, forming one league for both men's and women's athletics. The Mountain West had been in existence since 1982, sponsoring championships for women's athletics at the same institutions the Big Sky had sponsored men's programs.

The name Big Sky originated in a novel written in 1947 by the late A.B. (Bud) Guthrie of Great Falls, Mont., entitled *The Big Sky*. Jack Hollowell, former Montana advertising director, promoted the Big Sky theme for the Treasure State, and Harry Missildine of the Spokane (Wash.) *Spokesman-Review* called for the newly formed league to be named "The Big Sky Conference" in his column dated Feb. 20, 1963. Five days later, on Feb. 25, the name Big Sky was adopted by the six presidents of the newly formed league.

On July 1, 1995, Doug Fullerton became the fifth commissioner of the Big Sky Conference. Fullerton replaced longtime commissioner Ron Stephenson, who retired after 14 years in the position. The first commissioner of the Big Sky was Jack Friel, who served from the league's inception until 1971. After Friel, John Roning directed the conference for six years until 1977 when Steve Belko assumed the commissioner's role. Belko was with the league for five years.

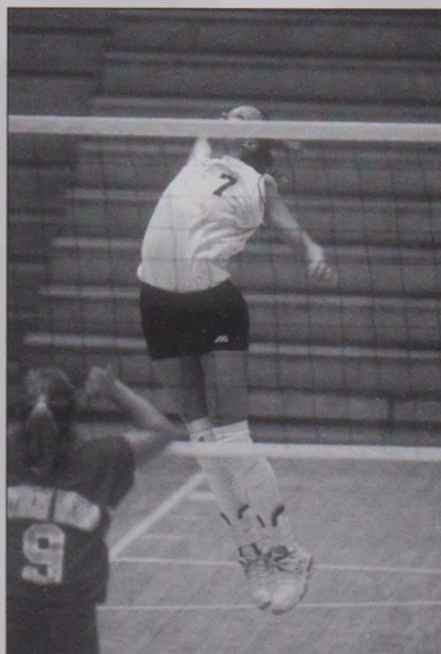

The University of Montana

The University of Montana provides a high-quality, well-rounded education to students and a wide range of services to Montanans. UM is a major source of research, continuing education, economic development, civic engagement, fine arts and entertainment, and serves as a driving force in strengthening Montana's ties with countries throughout the world.



UM's Missoula campus comprises the College of Arts and Sciences, the Graduate School, the Davidson Honors College and seven professional schools: business administration, education, fine arts, forestry and conservation, journalism, law, and pharmacy and allied health sciences. The University also has an excellent physical therapy department. The University of Montana also includes The University of Montana-Western in Dillon; Montana Tech in Butte; The University of Montana-Helena College of Technology; and The University of Montana College of Technology in Missoula, which

offers two-year programs in business, trades and industry, and technical and health occupations.

UM owns and operates Lubrecht Experimental Forest, a 28,000-acre teaching and research forest. Located approximately 30 miles northeast of Missoula, Lubrecht Forest provides the opportunity for students to learn tree thinning and harvesting techniques in addition to working on forest and ecological projects.

The Flathead Lake Biological Station, located at Yellow Bay on the east side of the lake, is a year-round research facility and academic center for the ecological sciences. The freshwater research laboratory encompasses 80 acres.

Located at the base of Mount Sentinel and on the banks of the Clark Fork River, the 200-acre campus of The University of Montana is one of the most beautiful in the nation.

Campus life offers a variety of living choices for the UM student. Dormitory living provides nine halls with various options on campus: a men's dormitory, a women's dormitory, along with six co-ed dorms. Also, Pantzer Hall provides four-person suites and was completed in 1995. Family housing can be found just three blocks south of the main campus in University Villages. New multi-student apartments will be completed for the 2004-05 school year and will be located minutes from campus. Students interested in the Greek life have four sororities and seven fraternities from which to choose.



The University of Montana has a nine-hole golf course, located just south of campus. The Grizzly Pool is a seven-lane, 25-yard indoor swimming pool that features numerous classes and programs and has been recently upgraded. The Fitness and Recreation Center, adjacent to the Adams



Center, has undergone a major renovation also. It provides the campus community with three levels of state-of-the-art exercise equipment, racquetball, handball and basketball courts, and a two-story glass-enclosed climbing wall.

KBGA-FM is UM's student-run radio station and features seven-day-a-week, 24-hour programming of contemporary and alternative music programs.

The Outdoor Program provides opportunities for the campus community to participate in recreational activities such as rafting, kayaking, climbing, hiking, backpacking and skiing.



Missoula

Birthplace and hometown of author Norman McLean, who wrote *A River Runs Through It*. Missoula is also known as the "Garden City" for its dense trees and lush green landscape. Missoula

is nestled in the heart of the Northern Rockies in western Montana. A community of approximately 66,000 residents, Missoula is located where five valleys converge. It is 140 miles from Glacier National Park and 270 miles from Yellowstone National Park.

The search for gold in the West and the completion of the Mullan Road, which opened up travel from the Missouri River to the state of Washington, brought people to the valley in 1860. Missoula began as a settlement called Hell Gate when

C.P. Higgins and Francis Worden began a trading post to accommodate the travelers. The settlement was later renamed Missoula, taken from a Salish Flathead Indian word, *Imisuletiku*, "At the stream or water of surprise." (*Missoula, the Way It Was*, Lenora Koelbe, 1972).

The Lewis and Clark Expedition, the Corps of Discovery, passed through the Missoula area 200 years ago. There are many interpretive sites in the area, and bicentennial celebrations are planned throughout the area for the next two years.

Early settlers constructed Fort Missoula in 1877. Today the Fort Missoula Museum remains a testament to the West.

For many years Missoula's main industry was logging, sawmills and related activities. Because of its location on the Mullan Road, it also became a trading and commercial center, which it remains to this day. The U.S.D.A. forest service's northern regional headquarters is located in Missoula, and the Aerial Fire Depot Smokejumper Center is strategically located as the nation's largest training base for smokejumpers.

Missoula also serves as a center for education, health care, retail, and the arts. The University of Montana provides educational opportunities for more than 13,000 college students. Two major hospitals, along with many clinics, make Missoula one of the state's premier health care communities.

The Missoula community supports the arts in all its forms: theater productions, dance, art, and music. The Missoula Children's Theater, founded in 1970, is located close to campus and produces plays and musicals by national and local playwrights for both adults and children. The theater also takes theatrical productions to audiences outside the Missoula area. The Garden City Ballet and Missoula Symphony, which is in its 51st season, bring performances and concerts to the community year round. The Art Museum of Missoula, located in downtown Missoula, sponsors changing exhibits and also has a permanent collection that focuses on Western contemporary art.

One of the most desirable places to live in the United States, western Montana has become an attractive residence for those looking for pristine beauty and serenity. Some of America's famous people, such as Liz Claiborne, Tom Cruise, Emilio Estevez, Phil Jackson, Huey Lewis, and Charlie Sheen, have made western Montana their home.

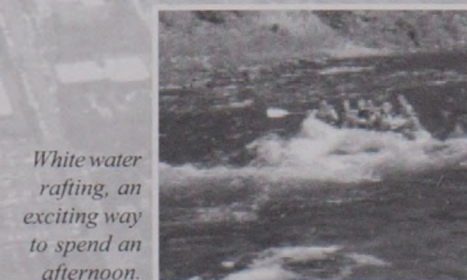

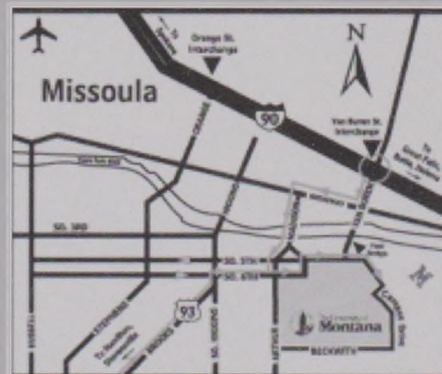

Missoula Attractions and Activities...

- Fly fishing, rafting, kayaking, and canoeing in western Montana are favorite activities. Flathead Lake, the largest natural freshwater lake in the western United States, is close by.
- Hiking, biking, camping, rock climbing, and hang gliding are a few activities enjoyed in and around Missoula. Many trails are within minutes of Missoula. Hiking in Glacier National Park is also popular.
- Other area attractions include "A Carousel for Missoula" (one of the first fully hand-carved carousels to be built in America since the 1930s), Garnet Ghost Town, the National Bison Range, the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation Wildlife Visitor Center, and the Smokejumper Visitor Center.
- Missoula Parks and Recreation and the YMCA provide a variety of recreational opportunities in basketball, soccer, softball, tennis, and volleyball. The Missoula Osprey professional baseball team is an affiliation of the Arizona Diamondbacks and play their home games in a new downtown stadium easily accessible to UM.



Missoula is easily accessible by either Interstate 90 from the east and west or by Highway 93 to the north and south. Missoula International Airport has a number of flights daily in and out of Missoula by the major airlines Delta, Northwest, United, Horizon, and Big Sky Airlines.

Montana Academics



The University of Montana has had 28 Rhodes Scholars and ranks 15th among American colleges and universities in the number of Rhodes Scholars it has produced, fifth among public universities.

School of Education graduates compete very successfully for jobs. A high percentage of those with bachelor's degrees and graduate degrees find teaching, administrative and other education-related positions in Montana and many other states.

KUFM, a non-commercial public radio station operated by the UM Broadcast Media Center, reaches an estimated 400,000 Montanans in central and western Montana. KUFM-TV is a non-commercial public television station also operated by the Broadcast Media Center. It is the western partner in the Montana Public Television network that serves more than 106,000 Montana households.

Ten UM students have received Truman Scholarships. The national scholarship is given annually to students committed to a government career who have superior academic ability and leadership potential.

The Department of Anthropology has the largest collection of artifacts and records of prehistory in the region, while UM's Montana Museum of Art and Culture has the largest art collection in the state.

The School of Business is the only business school in Montana to be accredited at the graduate level by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business. Year in and year out, a high percentage of the school's accounting graduates pass the Certified Public Accountant Exam on their first try.

The Department of Geology has a strong nationally known program in traditional geology and environmental geoscience.

The Department of Geography has one of the Northwest's best cartography laboratories where students learn to make maps and interpret aerial photography.

The Flathead Lake Biological Station, located about 80 miles north of Missoula, is the oldest biological station west of the Mississippi. The UM research station is one of the finest facilities in the country for ecological studies and freshwater research.

The Department of Health and Human Performance is one of a handful in the country that prepares students to be athletic trainers.

The School of Journalism has had eight Pulitzer Prize winners. The school ranked seventh overall in the national 2003 Intercollegiate Hearst Journalism Competition.

UM's graduate creative writing program, started in 1919 by H.G. Merriam, is the second oldest program of its kind in the country and is consistently ranked among the top-10 programs nationwide.



Montana Academics

A significant sign of UM's commitment to athletes' academic pursuits was initiated in 1993 when former faculty athletic representative Dr. Robert O. Lindsay developed a program at UM to honor student-athletes who excel in the

GPA of 3.50 or above, and eight had a perfect 4.0.

Last season the President's Award, which is given annually to the most outstanding student-athletes at Montana, was presented to four-time winner Chris Tobiason of cross country and track and field and to three-time recipient Anne Sheehy, also of cross country and track and field. Both student-athletes had a perfect 4.0 GPA. Chris majored in pharmacy, and Anne majored in music. Sheehy also was awarded the Elaine Murray Award from the Copper Connection for academic excellence.

The Athletic Director's Award, presented every year to the Griz athletic team with the highest overall grade point average, was earned by the women's cross country team with a 3.295 average GPA.

In the 2003-04 season, there were four Academic All-District VII selections: Dylan McFarland of football, Brooklynn Lorenzen, women's basketball, Anne Sheehy and Chris Tobiason, both of track and field.

The 2003 six-year graduation rate at UM for student-athletes was 53% compared to the general student population at 43%.

Last year 132 student-athletes were recognized at the 12th Annual Dr. Robert O. Lindsay Academic Awards Banquet. Of the 117 athletes honored at the banquet, 42 of them maintained a

JACOBSON ACADEMIC CENTER

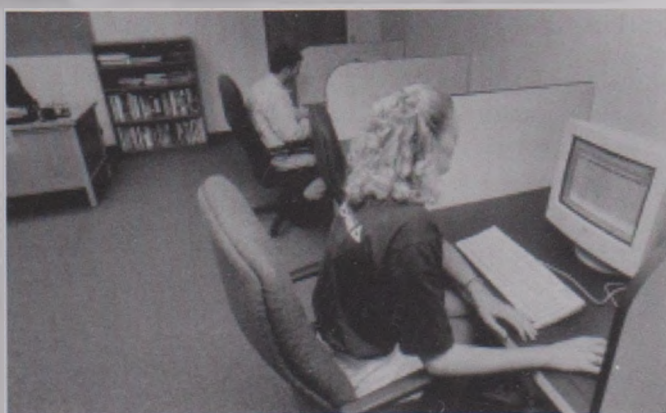

ADAMS CENTER



- The recently renovated Adams Center, hub of The University of Montana Intercollegiate Athletic Department, features two auxiliary gyms, remodeled Dahlberg Arena, new weight center, athletic treatment center, locker rooms, academic center and the John Hoyt Athletic Complex, which houses the athletic staff.

RHINEHART ATHLETIC TRAINING CENTER



- The Rhinehart Athletic Training Center (RATC) boasts 7,200 square feet of space and includes an enlarged rehabilitation area. The primary goal of the athletic training staff is to provide quality care for student-athletes while helping them safely return to competition. The RATC provides numerous ways to treat injuries: electrical stimulation units, whirlpools, free weights and balance boards.

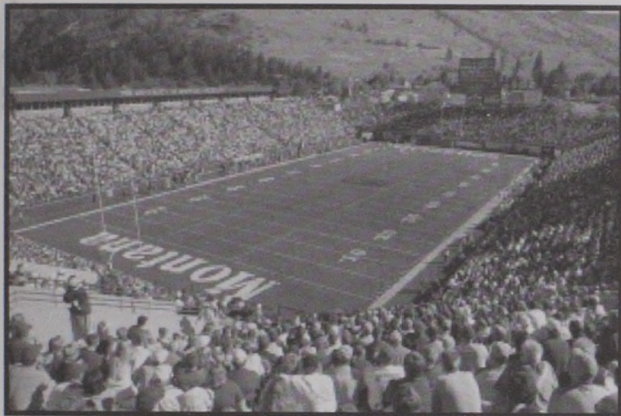

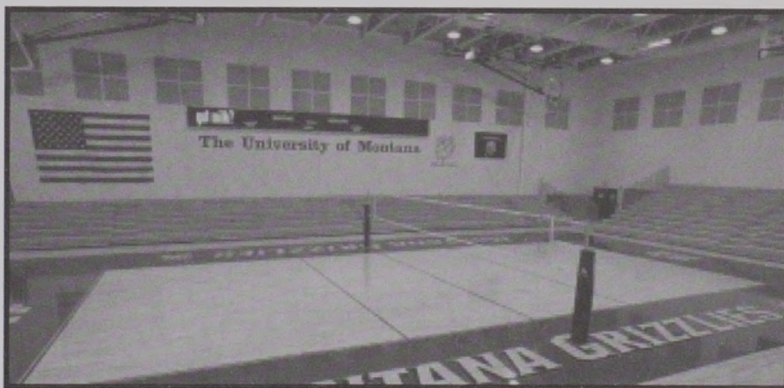
- The track & field venue also saw a recent upgrade with refurbished lanes and new seating for fans.

Grizzly Administration



President George M. Dennison

George Dennison, the 16th president of The University of Montana, begins his 15th year at the University.

A native of Montana, Dennison came to UM from Western Michigan University where he served as the provost and vice president for academic affairs from 1987 to 1990. He spent time at the Universities of Arkansas and Washington before working 18 years at Colorado State, where he served as acting academic vice president, associate academic vice president and director of admissions and records, among other positions.

Dennison received his bachelor's degree from UM in 1962 and his master's degree, also from UM, in 1963 and earned a Ph.D. in history from Washington in 1967.

Dennison serves on a number of boards. He chairs the Montana Commission on Community Service and serves on the Board of the International Heart Institute Foundation of Montana, the Community Medical Center Advisory Committee, the Montana Campus Compact Executive Committee, the Board of Directors of the International Student Exchange Program, the Neuroscience Institute, and the Maureen and Mike Mansfield Foundation. He has been the longest acting president in the history of UM.

George and his wife Jane have two sons, Rick and Robert. The Dennisons have four grandchildren.



Don Read, Athletic Director

Don Read, the most successful head football coach in the history of The University of Montana, was named athletic director in May of 2004.

Read was Montana's head coach from 1986-95. He is the winningest coach in school history with a career record of 85-36 (.702) and a Big Sky Conference mark of 54-22 (.711). He had 10 straight winning seasons during his tenure. He culminated his outstanding career with his 1995 Grizzly team winning the Division I-AA national championship with a 22-20 victory at Marshall. Read retired from UM on April 15, 1996.

While in retirement Read wrote a book, *Complete Quarterbacking*, and is currently in the process of writing another. Several years ago he authored the book *The Complete Passing Game*. He has written more than 100 articles for athletic and coaching publications.

He came to Montana from Portland State, where he was the mentor from 1981-85 and 1968-71. Between his stints at PSU he was the head coach at Oregon (1974-76) and Oregon Tech (1977-80). He was in the coaching profession for 37 years, beginning in 1959.

Read has been the Big Sky Conference, Evergreen Conference, and Western Football Conference Coach of the Year. He was an NCAA Regional Coach of the Year twice. He was voted the Division II National Coach of the Year in 1984 and the Division I-AA National Coach of the Year (at UM) in 1995. While at Montana he was selected the Big Sky's coach of the year in 1989, 1993, and 1995.

Don has a son Bruce, and a daughter, Beth. Bruce recently became an assistant football coach at Oregon State.
