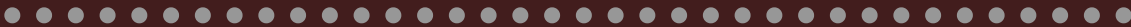

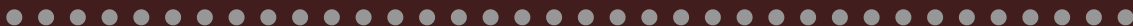



### **Marjorie Nichols Lecture**

This lecture series is named for Marjorie Nichols. She was a 1966 graduate of the UM J-school, and the next year became the youngest member of the Ottawa press gallery and the only woman. Over more than two decades she distinguished herself in her native Canada through her widely read national political commentary. When she died of cancer in 1991 at the age of 48, she was one of Canada's most influential journalists. UM awarded her its Distinguished Alumni Award in 1988. This series brings journalists and political leaders to UM as a way to honor Marjorie Nichols' legacy and began in 2000.
