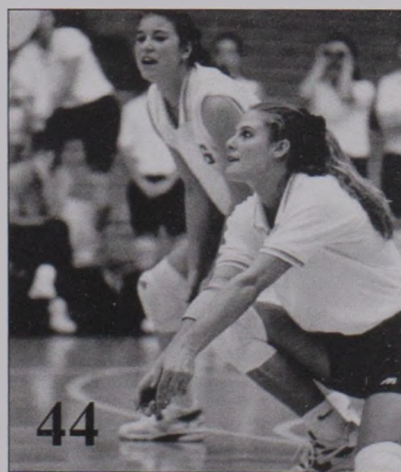
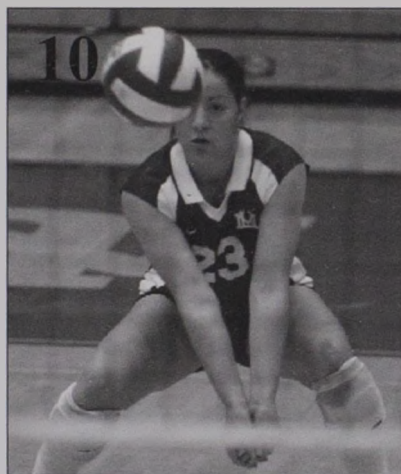

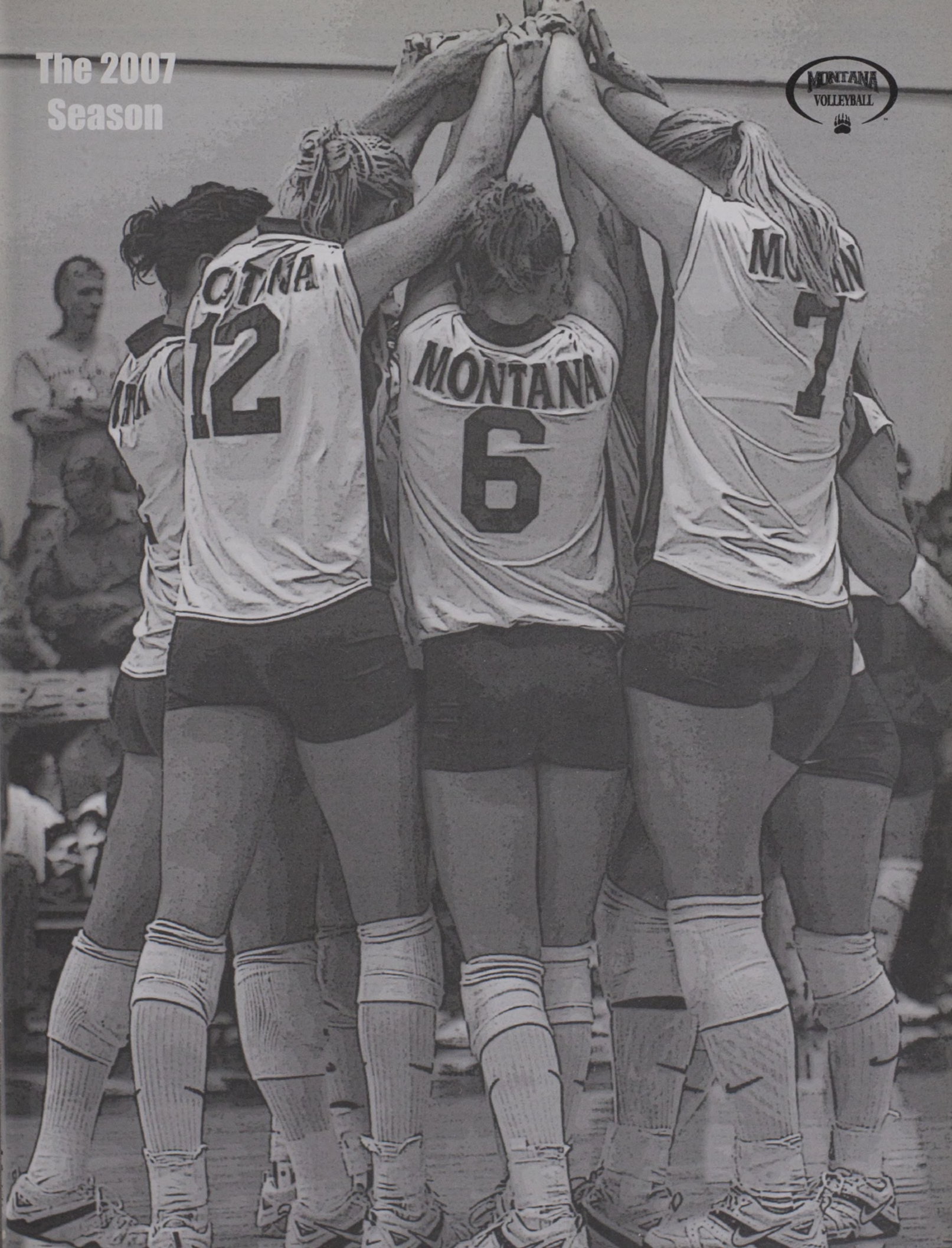

The 2007 Season



Second-year Montana volleyball coach **Jerry Wagner**, who was an assistant with the Grizzlies from 1988 to 1990, may have waited patiently for 15 years for the chance to return to Missoula, but once he was on the job, he moved quickly.

In his first season last fall, Wagner coached Montana to the Big Sky Conference tournament, a destination the team had not reached since the 2000 season.

Now it's 2007 and Wagner, who helped coach the Griz to their first of three NCAA tournament appearances in 1990, is not only hungrier for more of the same, but wants to get Montana back to what he feels is its rightful place: atop the Big Sky.

"Making the tournament was the main rallying cry last year," Wagner said on the eve of the season. "Now that we know how to get there and what kind of commitment it takes, what are we going to do to go beyond that? I always want that to be our goal: to go beyond where we went the year before."

"We lost three very potent offensive players from last year, but I fully expect this season not to be about rebuilding but about revisiting the spot we reached last year, then exceeding that level."

To recap what Montana accomplished last year: Wagner led UM to a 9-7 league record (12-15 overall) and a fourth-place finish in the Big Sky Conference. The league mark was Montana's best since 1999 and the fourth-place conference finish was its highest since 1994.

Last year's senior class of Claudia Houle, Emily Sakis and EvaLyn Whitehead played a large role in the turnaround, with Houle (4.39 kpg, 3.42 dpg) becoming the first Montana player to earn first team All-Big Sky honors since 1996 and Whitehead (2.16 kpg, 1.19 bpg) receiving honorable mention all-league honors.

The production of the lost trio will need to be replaced, but Wagner is certain he has the players that can step in and handle the added responsibility.

"We had a spring season where we were able to develop an identity with the players we have returning," Wagner said. "We've had a chance to work with these players for an entire year now, and we think we're becoming a team that has the attitude, philosophies and work ethic that we want in a team."

The new senior class is made up of setter **Shelley Boyd**, middle blocker **Jessica Petersen** and libero **Jackie White**.

Boyd, a team captain, split time at the setter position last year. The three-time Academic All-Big Sky selection enters the

season ranked ninth in Montana history with 1,407 assists.

Petersen, the team's most experienced returning middle blocker, has played in 79 career matches, totaling 385 kills and 214 blocks. She will be charged with leading a group of young players in the middle.

White is a three-year starting libero for the Grizzlies. With an entire year to go, she is already the UM career leader with 1,390 digs.

"This year's senior class is a mature and experienced group that has developed into strong players at their respective positions," Wagner said. "They all want to be factors in what we are trying to accomplish, so we'll be counting on them to set a clear direction on what it will take for our continued success."

The junior class is made up of libero **Julie Faulk**, outside hitter/middle blocker **Lauren Gustafson**, outside hitter **Micaela Parker** and outside hitter **Jade Roskam**.

Faulk has been a steady performer as a defensive specialist her first two seasons, playing in 55 of a possible 56 matches.

Gustafson is in her second year in the program and will be challenged with a larger role in 2007 after seeing time as a reserve as a sophomore.

Parker is the team's top returning hitter (2.41 kpg) and its second-leading returning blocker (0.61 bpg).

Roskam is the group's most experienced player, having started in 53 of a possible 56 matches that last two seasons. The two-time Academic All-Big Sky selection averaged 2.03 kills and 0.36 blocks per game in 2006.

The sophomore class is Montana's smallest, but it is fitting that setter **Taryn Wright** and outside hitter **Whitney Hobbs** are together again after playing club volleyball together in California as high schoolers.

Wright had an immediate impact with the Grizzlies last fall, playing in all 100 games and leading the team with 644 assists (6.44/g) and 41 (0.41/g) service aces. She set a Big Sky single-match record with 13 service aces in UM's BSC tournament match.

Hobbs joins the program after playing at Auburn as a freshman. She played in 22 matches for the Tigers, finishing fourth on the team in service aces (0.31/g) and sixth in digs (1.70/g).

Montana will have five freshmen in 2007. Libero **Theresa Bennett** and outside hitter **Stephanie Turner** both redshirted last year. Incoming freshmen include outside hitter/middle blocker **Paige Nash**, outside hitter **Amy Roberts** and middle blocker **Jaimie Thibeault**.

Roberts and Nash were the 2006 Gatorade Girls' Volleyball Players of the

Year for Montana and North Dakota, respectively, while Thibeault won a provincial volleyball title as a senior and recently led Alberta to a second-place finish at the 2007 Canada National Team Challenge Cup.

Hobbs, along with Nash, Roberts and Thibeault, make up Wagner's 2007 recruiting class.

"I like this class," Wagner said. "What we did was add four players to what we've been able to build over the last year as far as team personality. We're counting on the four newcomers to be just who they already are: steady, enthusiastic and very coachable."

"All four of them bring enthusiasm and a passion for the game that has led them to have experience beyond their years. All of them have been a key player on a previous team and been a player that's been counted on, and they've all excelled in that role."

Montana's preseason schedule includes three tournaments and a match at Gonzaga. The Grizzlies host their own tournament, which will feature UC Irvine, Canisius and Gonzaga, then play in tournaments at Bradley and South Dakota State.

"Our non-conference schedule is going to be good preparation for Big Sky play," Wagner said. "Every match is going to allow us to establish the type of offense we want to run."

"We have two capable setters, so we have no limitations in that area, and we have a deep corps at the outside hitter position that has a good understanding of what we want to do."

"The middles are not as experienced, but we have the personnel at that position to do whatever it is we want to do."

In Big Sky Conference play, it's been Sacramento State ... and everybody else for the last decade. The Hornets have won the Big Sky regular-season or tournament title 10 consecutive years, including a sweep of both titles in 2006.

"Sacramento State will be the favorite based on their experience," Wagner said. "then there will be a handful of teams that will attempt to mount an attack on the Hornets. I think the league's coaches will view us as one of the teams that will be right in there with the teams challenging Sac State."

"I think the other coaches are now viewing us as a team that is regaining some of the pride that the program had years ago (when Montana went to three NCAA tournaments in a five-year span), that we're not going to be just a flash in the pan. With the culture and atmosphere that we're creating, I think it's clear to outsiders that we're in this for the long-term."

Jerry Wagner

Head Coach • Second Season
Montana State-Northern, '86

Montana volleyball coach Jerry Wagner enters his second season with the Grizzlies in 2007. After being hired May 5, 2006, Wagner led an immediate turnaround of the program's fortunes with a successful debut last fall.

In his first season as a head coach after 18 years as an assistant coach or associate head coach, including three with Montana from 1988 to 1990, Wagner guided UM to a 9-7 Big Sky Conference mark in 2006, fourth in the league, and took the Grizzlies to their first Big Sky tournament since 2000.

Montana's 9-7 conference record (12-15 overall) was its best since 1999, and its fourth-place league finish was its highest since 1994. The Grizzlies had gone 12-58 in Big Sky play between 2001 and '05, then nearly matched that win total in Wagner's first season.

Wagner coached Claudia Houle to first team All-Big Sky Conference honors in 2006 and EvaLyn Whitehead to honorable

mention All-Big Sky accolades. Houle became the first Grizzly to receive first team honors since Dana Bennish in 1996.

Wagner's Division I coaching experience began in 1988 when he was hired by Dick Scott to serve as an assistant with Montana. Wagner helped UM to two 20-win seasons in his three years with the Grizzlies (1988-90) and the program's first NCAA tournament appearance in 1990.

Wagner took an assistant job at Oregon State following the 1990 season. He spent eight years as an assistant with the Beavers, working for Dave Gantt in 1991 and '92 and Jeff Mozzochi from 1993 to '98.

In eight seasons at OSU, Wagner's teams won 125 matches and earned trips to the Women's Invitational Volleyball Championship (WIVC) in 1993 and '94.

Following the 1998 season, Wagner reunited with Gantt at

Montana State. Wagner was the top assistant with the Bobcats for four seasons (1999-2002), then became the associate head coach under current MSU coach Miya Malauulu for the 2003 and '04 seasons.

In six years with the Bobcats, Wagner was part of teams that went 117-54.

Wagner spent the 2005 season as an assistant at Gonzaga, where he helped the Bulldogs to a six-win improvement from 2004 and



the program's best record in a decade.

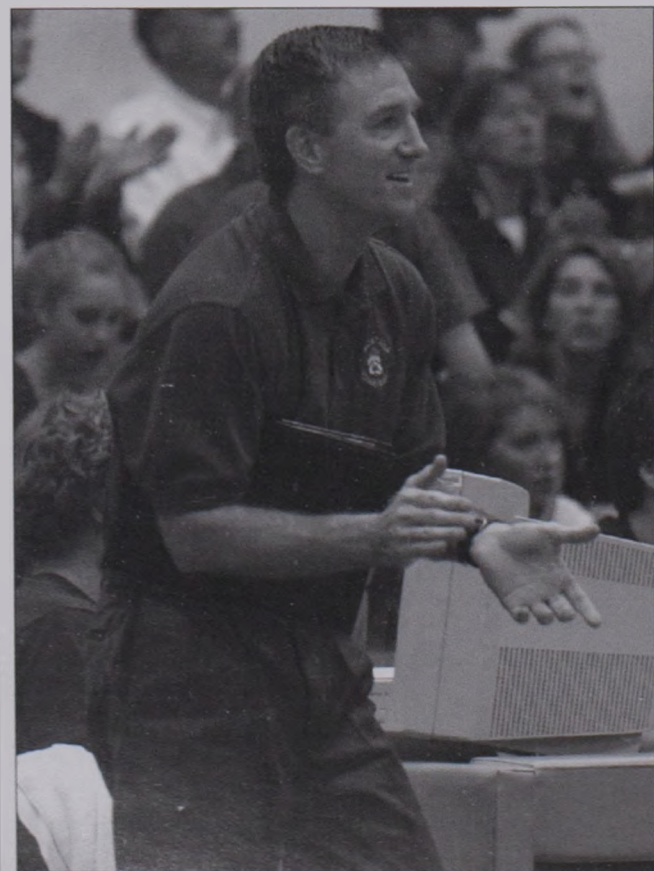
Born in Havre, Mont., Wagner was the youngest of four children. He was a 1979 graduate of Havre High School, where he wrestled and played tennis, football and basketball.

Wagner's coaching career started the fall of his first year in college, 1979, when he was a student assistant coach for the Northern Montana College (now Montana State-Northern) volleyball program. He coached for two seasons (1979-80) before graduating with an associate degree in drafting.

After working as a draftsman in the private sector for two years, Wagner enrolled again at Northern Montana (NMC) in the fall of 1983, from which he would graduate in 1986 with a degree in secondary education and an extended major in physical education.

Fully immersed in coaching volleyball, Wagner spent the next four falls (1983-86) as an assistant at NMC and spent the 1985, '86 and '87 winters as the first head coach at Havre High.

In 1987 Wagner served as the head coach at Northern Montana before joining Scott's staff at Montana in 1988.

Q: After an 18-year career as an assistant coach, the 2006 season was your first as a Division I head coach. How would you evaluate your first year?

A: I thought it went pretty well. And a big reason is that I was able to use my experiences of the previous 18 years to my advantage. Every coach I had the opportunity to work with during that time taught me some things that I was able to draw upon.

I think last year was also successful because the team allowed itself to be open to new ideas. With that attitude, it made the transition that much easier. Their willingness to learn and accept whatever changes needed to be made allowed us to make some positive steps.

Q: You have worked with a lot of coaches in the past. Do you find yourself using any of them for feedback now that you are a head coach?

A: I do that continually. If I'm stuck on something or want insight from a different perspective, I know I can run it by some longtime friends and coaches who have been through much the same things and have experiences that I can probably use. Even though I've been through quite a few situations, I know I don't have all the answers.

In particular, I probably use (former Montana coach) Dick Scott and a handful of other trusted long-time Division I coaches the most. Plus Tony Conkle. It's important to get that reinforcement.

Q: What are some characteristics that you want the players you recruit to have?

A: I'm looking for somebody that is open-minded and believes they still have a lot to learn. I want somebody that is going to grow



and develop every year she is in the program, and allows herself to do so. I want somebody that adds other areas to their game from one year to the next and is anxious and excited to do so. And I'm looking for somebody that has a passion for whatever it is they do.

And that can come in any sized package.

Q: When you take your team on road trips, what do you hope people outside the program go away saying about the Montana volleyball program?

A: I want them to go away thinking they have just seen a team that exhibits great chemistry both on and off the court. I hope they see a team that enjoys itself and sticks together. I want it to be clear what we are trying to accomplish on the court, and I expect the team to be great representatives of the program, the University and the State of Montana. And I hope the players show the characteristics of a person that is stress-free and likes what they are doing.

Q: Kandice Kelly replaces Allison Weston on your coaching staff this year, and Ryan Platt is back for his second year. How would you evaluate the 2007 volleyball coaching staff?

A: Collectively we have strengths in many areas. Coach Platt is very good at team chemistry and helping us create and establish goals for our team, as well as being an accomplished court coach.

Even though she is in her first year, Coach

Kelly has experience beyond her years. She comes from a volleyball coaching family, so she has been around a coach and the game her entire life. She brings a fire and love of the game that will be very evident at our practices. Her experiences and background make her a real positive addition to our coaching staff.

Q: Even though volleyball is a fall sport, the spring season plays a big role in the continuing development of your players. Talk about the importance of the spring season.

A: The spring is critical because it gives us a chance to really narrow things down. Every player has skills they need to devote time to in order to get better, and you have the time to do that in the spring. But we also try to keep things simple. The kids in our program need to play the game as much as they can and not always be tied down by specific positions and roles. We allow the players to expand roles during the off-season.

Q: When you got the Montana job, you talked about it as being your dream job and one that you felt you'd been preparing for your entire coaching career. Is it everything you thought it would be?

A: Absolutely it is. I still feel like this is a dream job for me because some of my fondest memories are of the things we accomplished here (when I was an assistant under Dick Scott). Because of the success this program has enjoyed in the past, I don't feel like this has been me taking over a program. I'm just trying to be a facilitator that helps get things back to their rightful place.

We took a big step forward last year, and we're going to keep working toward that goal. The resources and support are all in place. My dream won't be complete until I can be a factor in getting this program back to the top of the Big Sky Conference.





Ryan Platt

**Assistant Coach • Second Season
Lewis-Clark State, '02**

The 2007 season is Ryan Platt's second as assistant coach with the University of Montana volleyball program. He joined the Grizzly coaching staff in 2006 after serving as a volunteer assistant coach for one season at Gonzaga, where Grizzly volleyball coach Jerry Wagner was an assistant.

Platt had nine years (1992-2000) of successful high school and club volleyball coaching experience in Idaho before breaking into the collegiate coaching ranks in August 2000 as an assistant coach at Lewis-Clark State in Lewiston, Idaho.

In two seasons Platt helped lead the NAIA Warriors to a combined record of 48-11, one Frontier Conference regular-season championship and two trips to the NAIA Region I tournament.

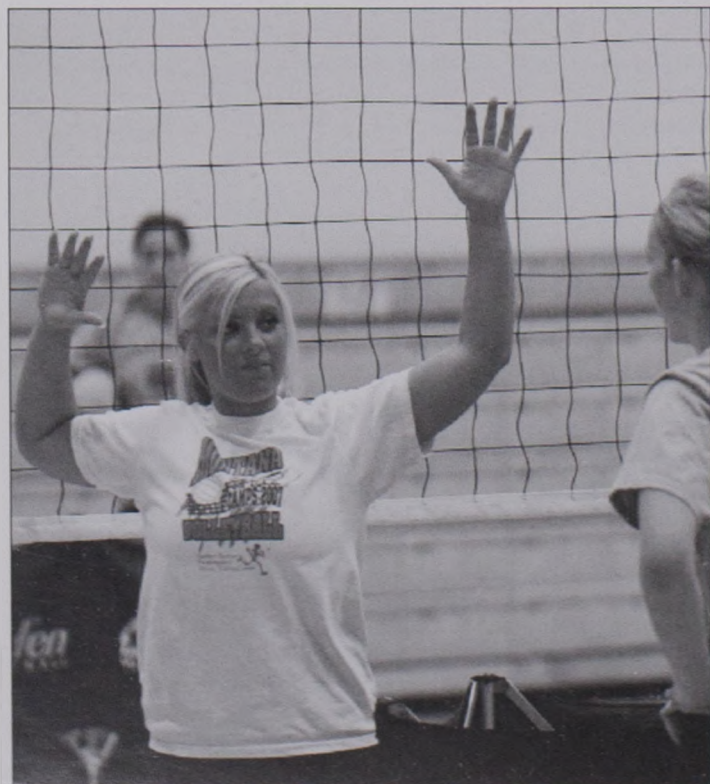
Platt was the interim head coach at Lewis-Clark State from January 2002 until June 2002 when he was named head coach at Eastern Oregon University in La Grande, Ore.

In three seasons Platt had 21 Mountaineer student-athletes on the EOU Dean's List and produced two NAIA honorable mention all-region and two first team All-Cascade Conference players.

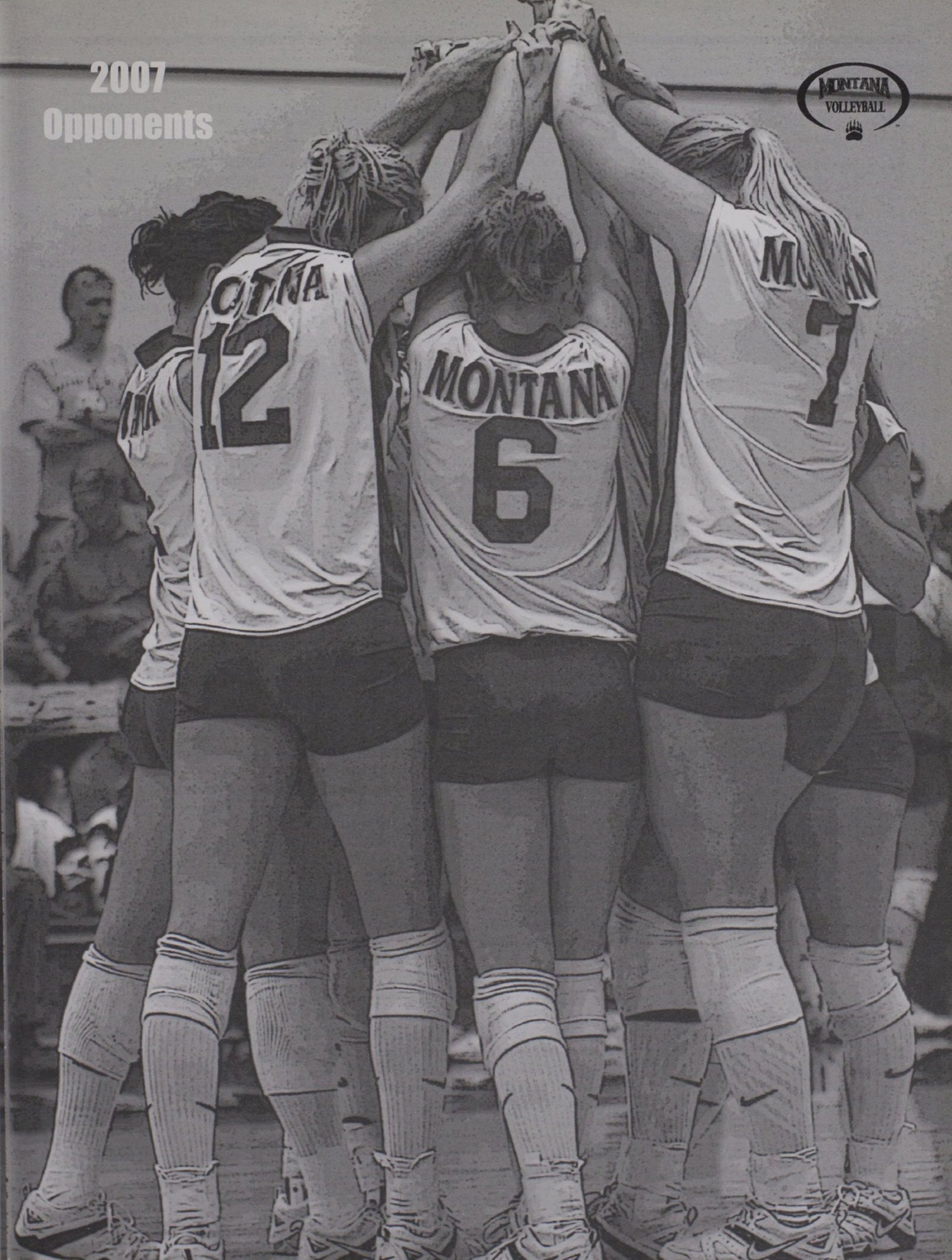
An honorable mention All-Big Sky selection as a senior in 2006, Kelly ranks second in Big Sky Conference history in career digs.

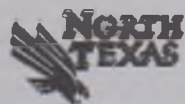

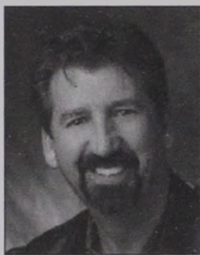

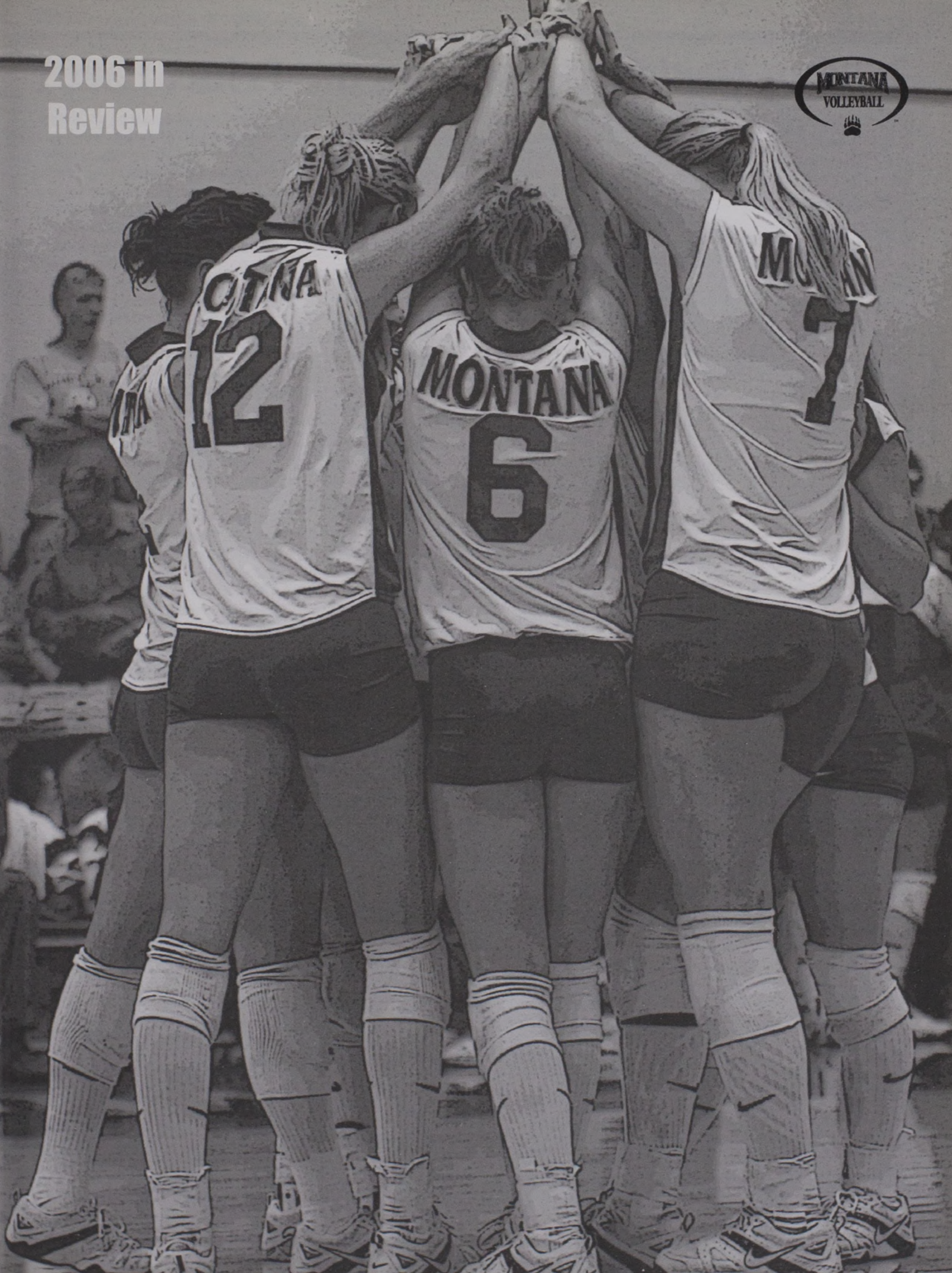

2006 in Review: Restoring the Pride, Part I

When Jerry Wagner was hired as Montana's volleyball coach a few months prior to the 2006 season, he had a number of goals that he wanted to reach in his first season, but none as large and as important as this: restoring the pride.

In the 80s and 90s, the Grizzly volleyball program was one of the top teams in the Big Sky Conference. And Wagner knows that as well as anybody. He was an assistant to Dick Scott from 1988 to 1990, a stretch when Montana averaged over 20 wins per season, culminating with the team's first NCAA tournament appearance in 1990.

From 1991 to 2005 Wagner was climbing the coaching ladder elsewhere. He watched from a distance as the goals of the program became just making the Big Sky tournament, which Montana failed to do in the five seasons before his return to Missoula.

"Restoring the pride" is difficult to define, but steps were taken in 2006 toward accomplishing that goal. Montana went 9-7 in Big Sky Conference play to finish fourth and make the tournament. The 9-7 record was the team's best since 1999, and its fourth-place league finish was its highest since 1996.

Things seemed to get off to an inauspicious start for Wagner and the Grizzlies when they fell in three games to California, Baylor and UC Davis at the Cal's season-opening tournament, but he didn't see it that way.

"I wasn't discouraged at all by the way the season started out," Wagner recalled almost a year later. "We were trying multiple lineups, we had people that were limited by injury and we were trying to figure out what system was going to be the one that would allow our strengths to come through."

"We were playing good teams, and we were doing enough good things not to be frustrated at all."

Two losses at Nevada's tournament, followed by a loss to Portland at its tournament dropped Montana to 0-6.

The Grizzlies picked up their first win of the season against High Point at UP's tournament, and then came the season's breakthrough match against Cornell, an NCAA tournament team from 2005. After dropping game one, Montana rallied to win three straight games for its second consecutive win.

"Cornell was a very disciplined team," Wagner said. "To break through like that against a team that had been to the NCAA tournament the year before was a real shot in the arm for us."

Montana was 2-6 entering league play, but the positives were there.

"Over those first three weekends we were able to define our offensive personality and come up with a system," Wagner said. "The two wins provided us some momentum and proved to us that we had some real good lineups that we could put out there."

UM's next match would bring with it a number of storylines. It was not only Montana's home opener, but its Big Sky Conference opener. It was against in-state rival Montana State, which had been dominating the series over the last half decade, winning nine of 10 since the 2000 season. And it was against the team Wagner had served as assistant and associate head coach for six seasons from 1999 to 2004.

The Grizzlies exploded out of the gate, winning games one and two, 30-19, 30-23. After dropping a close game three, the team regrouped and pulled out a 30-27 victory in game four, its third straight win.

With momentum on its side, Montana picked up three more home wins over Gonzaga, Idaho State and Weber State to stretch its win streak to six matches and even its season record at 6-6.

The perfect Big Sky start was the team's first 3-0 league mark since 1994. No one was expecting the team to duplicate the '94 team's 13-1 Big Sky record, but after going 12-58 in conference play between 2001 and 2005, followers of Griz

volleyball were starting to sense that maybe things were on the verge of changing.

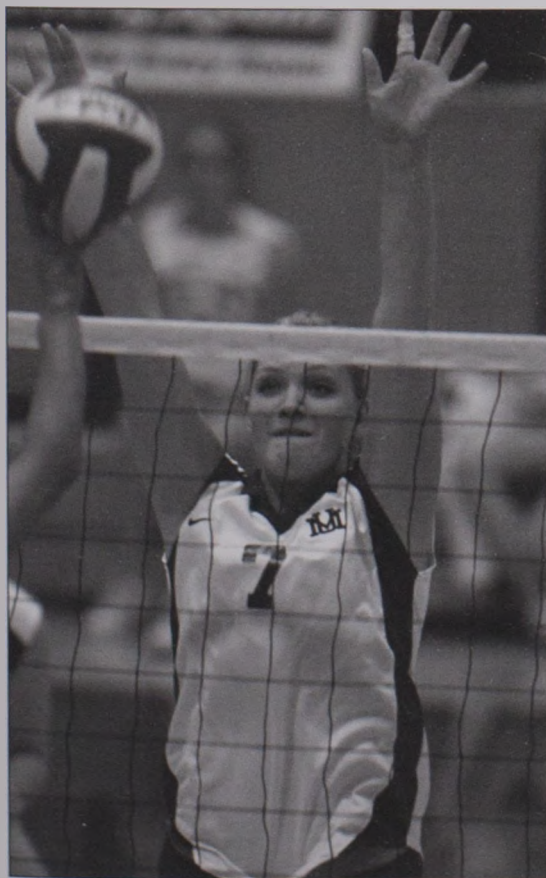
Unfortunately the team was thinking that as well. In its next match at Northern Arizona, UM opened with an easy 30-19 win in game one, but then dropped three straight games to lose for the first time in three weeks.

"That was a huge learning experience," Wagner said. "We just couldn't hammer the point through enough that you have to play these matches with everything you have. We found out against NAU that if you don't do that, you're going to get bit."

Whatever Wagner said in the locker room after that match, then at the hotel, then on the plane, then in the locker room prior to the team's match two nights later at Northern Colorado must have sunk in.

Facing a Bears team that was off to a 4-1 start in league play, Montana won a five-game thriller, taking a 15-13 decision in game five.

"For us to turn things around in the middle of a road trip and have the intestinal fortitude to fight tooth and nail as hard as we did and come away with a win, that was another huge step in the right direction for us," Wagner said. "We hung in there and then seized an opportunity when it was there."

Home losses to Portland State and Eastern Washington, which would finish two-three in the final Big Sky regular-season standings, were followed by a visit from Sacramento State. The Hornets entered the match 18-4 and had yet to drop a single game in conference play while opening 6-0.

Having lost two straight at home, Wagner's mid-week press conference showed no signs of a coach who thought his team was on the verge of falling back upon its former ways.

"I think it's going to be a back-and-forth match," he said. "After dropping our last two, I am confident we'll step right back into the batter's box and establish ourselves. I think we might even surprise some people."

The match was everything Wagner had predicted, and then some. Sac State opened with an easy 30-21 win in game one, then had to rally back from a 28-26 Montana lead before taking game two, 31-29.

Coming out of the break, Montana got the Hornets on their heels, hit .410 and won a surprisingly one-sided game three, 30-22, Sac State's first lost game of the conference season.

And the fun was just getting started.

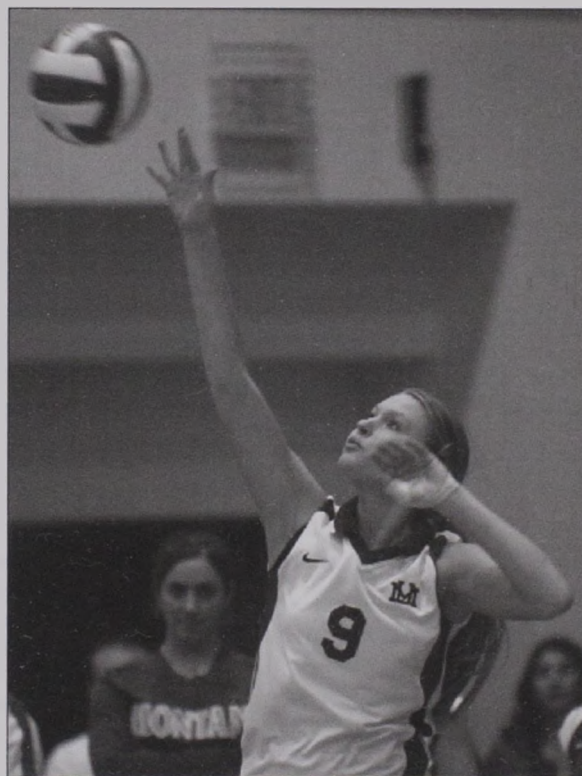
Montana faced a match point in game four before winning an epic battle, 35-33, and game five was tied at 12-12 when the Hornets scored three quick points to put a decisive end to the long match.

"Despite the loss, we proved to ourselves that we can be a team that can contend with a veteran group like Sac State," Wagner said. "I was proud of the way we played that match."

The three-match losing streak to the league's heavyweights only bolstered the Grizzlies' confidence. Five straight wins followed, including a four-game win at Montana State that gave Montana its first sweep of the season series with the Bobcats since 1995 and a sweep of Idaho State and Weber State on the road for the first time since 1994.

"Every series (in the Big Sky Conference) is difficult to sweep in a season," Wagner said, "so to get past MSU twice was special because the shoe had been on the other foot in recent years. For us to change that, you can hold your head a little higher."

Montana dispatched Northern Colorado and Northern Arizona at home, each in three quick games, over

October's final weekend.

"After losing at NAU and winning a five-game match at Greeley, to sweep that week-end series said a lot about our team's ability to continue to add schemes and styles of play as the season progressed."

The regular season ended with road losses to Sacramento State, Portland State and Eastern Washington, but Montana had reached its primary goal: the Grizzlies would be the No. 4 seed at the Big Sky Conference tournament.

"I couldn't be prouder of the way it all culminated," Wagner said. "We could have lost our way as we went through the pre-season, but we were able to break out and have a good start in conference."

"By making the conference tournament, I just think it instilled the attitudes and habits that we want this program to be known for year in and year out."

Montana suffered a disappointing five-game loss to Northern Colorado in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament, but that did little to change Wagner's evaluation of the season.

"Last season was special," he said. "I was extremely proud of what we accomplished, and I'll never forget it. It put the program on solid ground in its infant stage. It was a model of what we can expect in the future."

What he didn't mention is this: the pride started returning.

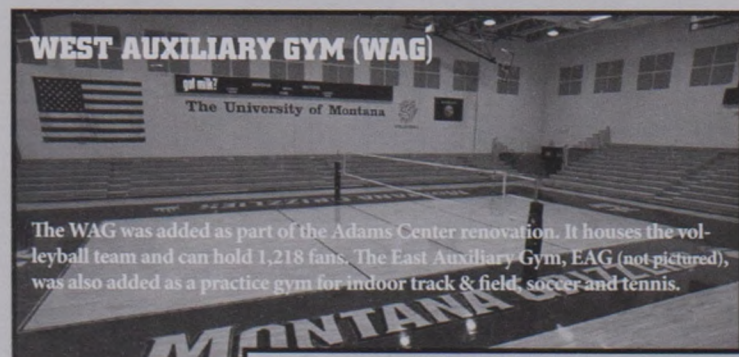
As part of the renovation to the Adams Center, a 7,000-square foot Athletic Performance Center was created. The new center, which is home to the Griz student-athletes, is geared to enhance the overall athletic performance of the teams.

The Athletic Performance Center is as sport specific as possible, and the program is scientifically based and intended to increase one's athleticism, as well as decrease an athlete's susceptibility to injury.

President George M. Dennison

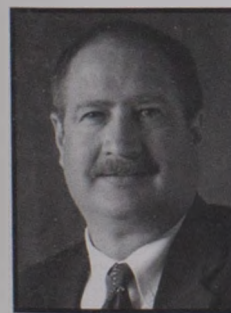
George Dennison, the 16th president of The University of Montana, begins his 17th year at the University.

Dennison came to UM from Western Michigan University where he served as the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs from 1987 to 1990. He spent time at the Universities of Arkansas and Washington before working 18 years at Colorado State, where he served as Acting Academic Vice President, Associate Academic Vice President and Director of Admissions and Records, among other positions.

Dennison received his Bachelor's degree from UM in 1962 and his Master's degree, also from UM, in 1963 and earned a Ph.D. in history from Washington in 1967.

Dennison serves on a number of boards. He chairs the Montana Commission on Community Service and serves on the National Security Education Board, the International Student Exchange Program Board of Trustees, the Institute of Medicine and Humanities, the St. Patrick Hospital Executive Board, the Community Medical Center Advisory Committee, the Maureen and Mike Mansfield Foundation Executive Committee, the Montana Campus Compact Executive Committee, the International Heart Institute of Montana Foundation, the Montana Neuroscience Institute Foundation, and the Montana Cancer Institute. He has been the longest acting president in the history of UM.

George and his wife Jane have two sons, Rick and Robert. The Dennisons have four grandchildren.



Jim O'Day, Director of Athletics

Jim O'Day was named Director of Athletics at The University of Montana by UM President George Dennison on June 30, 2005. Prior to that, he spent almost four years as UM's Director of Development for Intercollegiate Athletics, and three years as Assistant Director of the Grizzly Athletic Association (now the Grizzly Scholarship Association).

As Director of Development, O'Day was responsible for major gift development as it pertains to athletics and served as the liaison between UM Athletics and The University of

Montana Foundation. At the GAA, he was involved in annual gift fund-raising.

O'Day returned to his alma mater in 1998 following a lengthy career in the print media business. After graduating from the UM School of Journalism in 1980, O'Day was the sports editor of the Daily Interlake newspaper in Kalispell, Mont., for two years. Following the death of his father in 1982, he returned to his hometown of Cut Bank, Mont., to assist his mother as a reporter/editor of the twice-weekly, and family-owned, Western Breeze newspaper. In 1987, he purchased the newspaper from his mother and served as owner/publisher until selling the business to his employees in 1998. He then relocated to Missoula to begin work with the GAA.

O'Day was a charter member of the Cut Bank Education Foundation and Alumni Association. He was Cut Bank's Citizen of the Year in 1992 and served on various boards and committees in the community. In 1986, he was selected as a member of the UM Alumni Association's Board of Delegates, and his volunteer work with that organization eventually led to his involvement in other UM activities. He organized the Golden Triangle Chapter of the GAA in 1992 and eventually became the state board president until his appointment at UM in 1998. O'Day was the 1991 recipient of The University of Montana Service Award.

Jim and his wife Kathy have three sons: Chris, Kevin and Brian. Chris and Kevin are students at The University of Montana, while Brian will be a junior at Missoula Hellgate High School in the fall of 2007.

As Director of Athletics at UM, O'Day oversees an athletic department with a \$11.5 million annual budget and a staff of more than 70 people. The challenge each year is to produce almost \$8 million in private funding to support and operate the program. In addition to nationally-recognized teams in football, men's basketball and women's basketball, UM also competes in the Big Sky Conference in the NCAA-sanctioned sports of men's and women's tennis, women's golf, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, women's soccer and women's volleyball.

Along with success on the playing fields, UM student-athletes are excelling in the classroom with an all-time high cumulative GPA of 3.02 in 2006-07.
