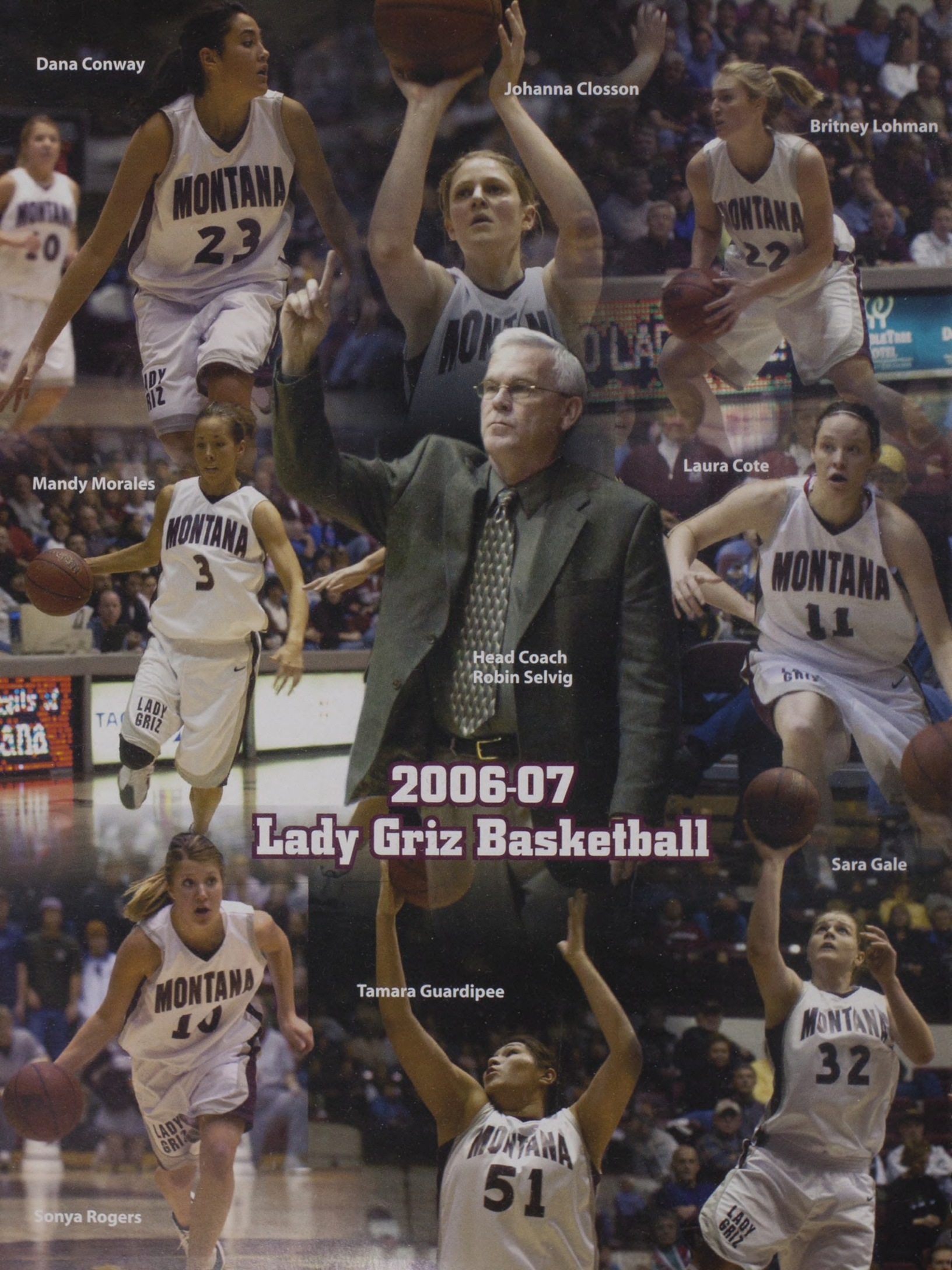

Media Credentials

Requests for media and photography credentials should be received by the Grizzly Sports Information Office no later than two days prior to the scheduled game.

Credentials will not be mailed. Instead they may be picked up at the UM Sports Information Office on the day of the game or starting one hour before the game at the will call window, located at the Adams Center Ticket Office.

Press Row Seating

Seating at press row is limited and will be filled on a first-requested, first-served basis. Press row is a working area. Cheering for either team is not permitted.

Photography

Photographers are limited to the marked areas along the baselines, in accordance with NCAA guidelines.

Visiting Radio

A visiting radio phone line, along with a courtesy line, is available. Visiting radio will also have access to a monitor displaying live stats.

Weekly Interviews

Coach Robin Selvig and a selected player will be available at the Montana athletic department's weekly press conference early Tuesday afternoon. Members of the media should arrange additional interviews with coaches and players with Joel Carlson. The best time to talk to coach Robin Selvig via phone is weekday mornings. On game days, no player interviews will be allowed until the conclusion of the game.

Practices

With the exception of game-day shoot-arounds, most Lady Griz practices are open to the media. Players and coaches will be available for interviews either pre- or post-practice. Contact Joel Carlson for practice times and locations.

Post-Game Services

Following a 10-minute cooling off period, Selvig and Lady Griz players will be available for interviews. Players will be available outside the Montana locker room. Coach Selvig will meet with the media in the same area following his postgame radio show.

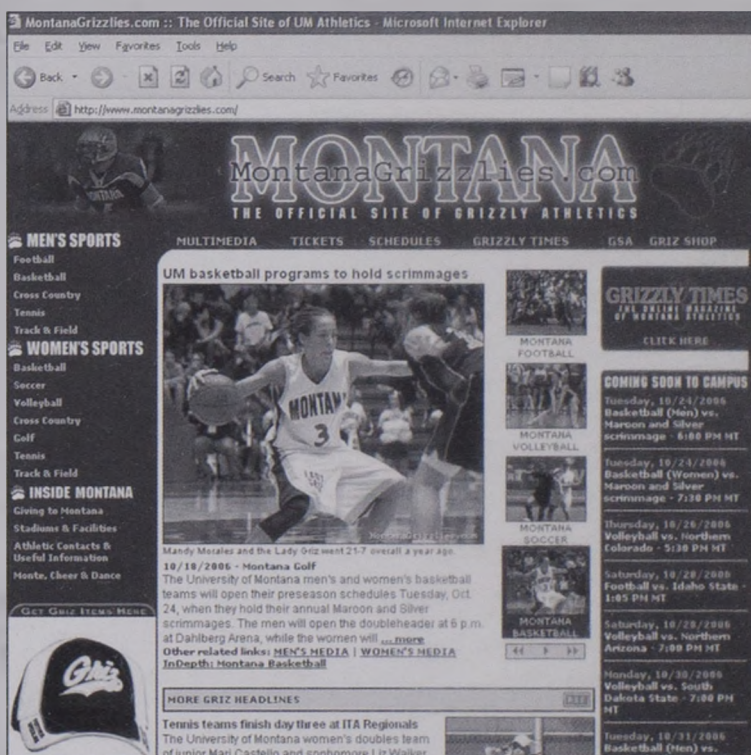

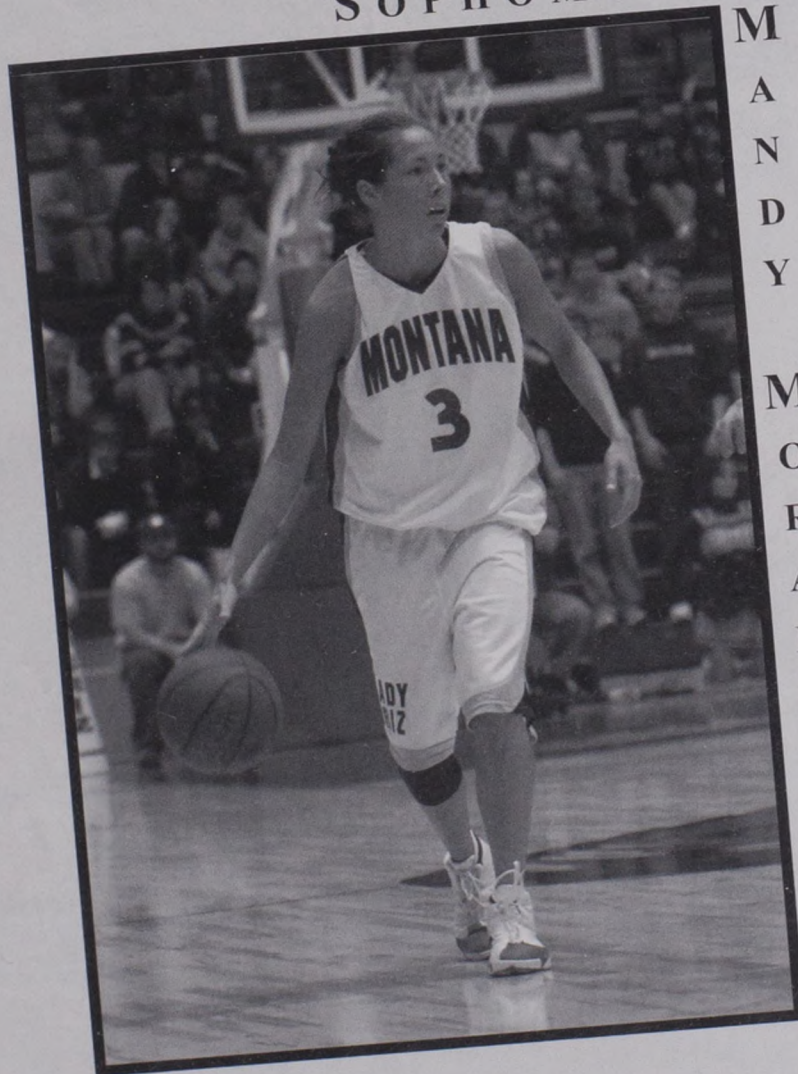

When University of Montana women's basketball coach **Robin Selvig** sits at his desk this time of year and pores over his 2006-07 roster, he has a just-out-of-the-box jigsaw puzzle at his fingertips. Granted, it is a puzzle that has only 14 pieces and there are probably dozens of easy ways to put it together if his only objective was putting five random players on the floor at a time, but there is only one final pattern that is acceptable to him and his team: one that looks like an NCAA tournament logo.

Like any puzzle-maker, Selvig has the four corner pieces he needs to get things moving toward his goal in lone senior **Sara Gale** and returning starters junior **Dana Conway** and sophomores **Mandy Morales** and **Tamara Guardipee**.

Katie Edwards and Jody McLeod were lost to graduation, but four other letterwinners return, all of whom made solid contributions in 2005-06 when the Lady Griz went 21-7 and finished second in the Big Sky Conference at 10-4. Call them the edge pieces: Juniors **Johanna Closson** and **Laura Cote** and sophomores **Britney Lohman** and **Sonya Rogers**. Closson, Cote and Rogers all averaged more than 11 minutes per game last season, while Lohman saw action in 25 games.

And the middle pieces of the puzzle, which bring all the corner and edges together: Junior **Jackie DeShazer**, sophomore **Betsy Snead**, redshirt freshmen **Lauren Beck** and **Shadra Robison** and incoming freshmen **Jessa Linford** of Seeley Lake, Mont., and **Stephanie Stender** of Sheridan, Wyo.

"We've got a lot of things to decide," said Selvig, whose career record of 645-188 (.774) has him among the leaders in Division I women's basketball in both wins and winning percentage. "We return a lot of playing experience, but some new faces have jumped into the picture, so we've got a lot of kids vying for playing time."

"But that is usually the case unless you return everybody. So what kind of look we'll have when we take the floor has yet to be determined."

Morales and Edwards made up Montana's starting backcourt in the Lady Griz' final 20 games last year and notched some impressive accolades. Edwards ended her career as a two-time All-Big Sky Conference selection and the Montana and Big Sky Conference leader in career 3-pointers (236), while Morales was a unanimous selection to the All-BSC team and was named a Kodak/WBCA honor-

able mention All-American, one of only three freshmen nationally to be recognized along with Courtney Paris of Oklahoma and Candace Parker of Tennessee.

Rogers started the first seven games last season at the point, then became Morales' back-up when she returned from an early-season injury.

Morales may see more time away from the point, where her play-making ability and athleticism might be better put to use, but Rogers is one of the best outside shooters on the team, something that can go underutilized at the point guard position.

"We need to figure out who's going to do a bulk of the time at the point, because Mandy can play the two or three as well, as can Sonya," Selvig said. "Or Lauren could play the point for that matter, so we need to figure out who's going to be running the team."

Morales? Rogers? Beck? By committee?

You can just picture Selvig putting the puzzle

the two or three, along with Conway and Cote.

Conway, along with Edwards and Morales, was one of three players to average over 30 minutes per game last season, while the athletic Cote came off the bench to see action in 26 games.

Linford and Stender, both redshirt candidates for 2006-07, could also provide depth at the wing.

Closson, who split time with the graduated McLeod at the four last year, is the natural successor to the starting spot, while Guardipee returns at center, where she started 28 games as a freshman in 2005-06.

Gale (15.9 mpg) and Lohman (7.6 mpg) both saw considerable action off the bench last season. They will be joined in the four-five rotation by sophomore Betsy Snead, who is eligible after sitting out the 2005-06 season after transferring from Xavier, and Shadra Robison, who redshirted last season.

"Obviously Johanna has had a couple of good years, so we're looking for her to emerge

A fourth option, depending on her health, is DeShazer, who gained valuable experience as the backup to Brooklynn Lorenzen during Montana's 2003-04 NCAA tournament season, but who has not seen a minute of action since that season's Louisiana Tech tournament game due to lingering injuries.

Depending on what happens at the point, Morales, Rogers and/or Beck will also see time at

at the four," Selvig said. "Tamara had a great freshman year, plus we've got Britney, who finished her freshman season strong, and two redshirts coming into the picture in Betsy and Shadra, and Sara returning as our only senior."

When all is said and done and Selvig can relax and look at the finished puzzle next March, what will he see? Will the pieces form a Big Sky Conference regular-season championship team? Maybe the program's 17th NCAA tournament appearance?

"Last year was a good year," Selvig said. "I felt good about how we played, but you always want a little bit more."

"The team worked very hard this summer and showed me they are motivated. They want to get back to the NCAA tournament this year. That's their goal."

"We had a lot of young kids playing last year, so I think we should be an improved team. I think we have good team speed and quickness. I think we're a good shooting team, but we'll need to have more of an inside game."

"We'll also be looking for more offense and more consistency on offense. I think that's what we didn't have last year, and hopefully it's because we were young."

"I think we should be pretty deep if some kids come through like I think they will."

"Overall, I think the cumulative effect of everything is that we'll be better."

The Senior

Sara Gale (6-2, center, Corvallis, Ore.) saw limited court time as a freshman (2002-03) and sophomore (2004-05) and dealt with injury in 2003-04, when she redshirted. She finally saw some extensive playing time last year, getting on the court in all 28 games, averaging just under 16 minutes per game. She averaged 3.0 points and 4.6 rebounds per game and finished second on the team in blocked shots with 29.

Gale is a true post player with strong back-to-the-basket moves who can step out to 15 feet and hit the perimeter jumper.

"Sara is strong around the basket and is a good post scorer," Selvig said. "She also has the confidence in her perimeter game to spot up and shoot the 15 footer, and she runs the floor well."

"Last year was her first real year of playing, and she's been making great strides. Sara should be a strong contributor to the success of this year's team."

The Juniors

Johanna Closson (6-0, forward, Whitefish, Mont.) is a sweet-shooting forward who has been an impact player since her first collegiate game in 2004-05 when she posted 11 points and nine rebounds. Coming off the bench as a sophomore last year behind McLeod at the four, Closson averaged 7.4 points and 4.7

rebounds per game. She is a career 83.1 percent free throw shooter.

"Johanna worked extremely hard in the off-season, and that's showing up this fall," Selvig said. "She's been beating everyone in pre-season conditioning, and she's in the best shape she's ever been in."

"We're looking for Johanna to emerge this year and grasp the four position. She is a very talented player with a very good pull-up and 3-point shot, and her turnaround jumper is as good as any we've had in this program."

"More minutes will only help her confidence, and I think she has a chance to be a great player when it's all said and done."

Dana Conway (5-10, guard/forward, Billings, Mont.) enters the 2006-07 season as UM's starter at the small forward, but can also move up and play the two due to her solid handling skills. After serving as a role player off the bench in 2004-05, Conway emerged as a threat last season, when she averaged 9.8 points and 4.6 rebounds while playing over 30 minutes per game.

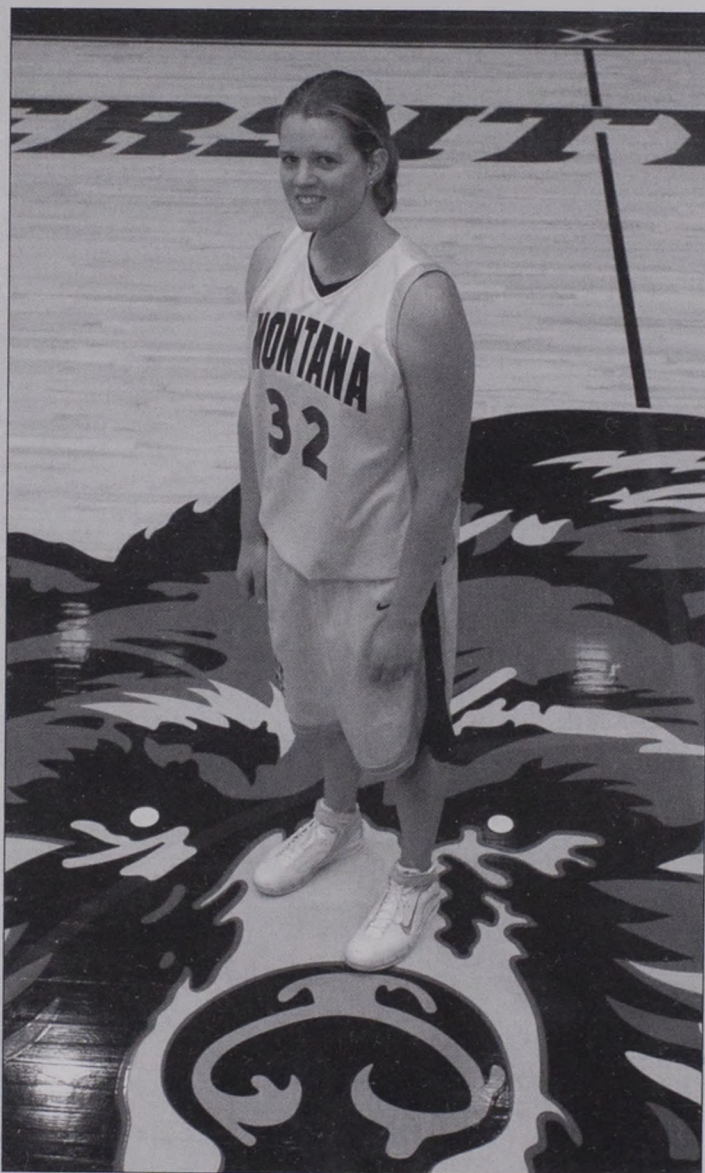
Conway, who was named MVP of last year's Lady Griz Holiday Classic, is one of the team's top shooters, averaging 42.1 percent from the field, 39.0 percent from 3-point range and 80.5 percent from the line.

"Dana is a good all-around player and someone who works hard all the time at both ends of the floor," Selvig said. "Defensively she is extremely intense and aggressive and one of our better defenders. Offensively she is a versatile scorer who can score inside or out."

"We expect a strong year out of her."

Laura Cote (5-8, guard, Gardiner, Mont.) has been a role player off the bench her first two seasons, but with that experience should see more minutes in 2006-07. She averaged 2.7 points and 1.2 rebounds in 26 games last season but showed flashes of her potential with a 14-point outing against Rocky Mountain and two nine-point efforts.

"Laura is very athletic and has good skills, and she's had some great moments. But now we're looking for her to become a more consistent and more complete player," Selvig said.

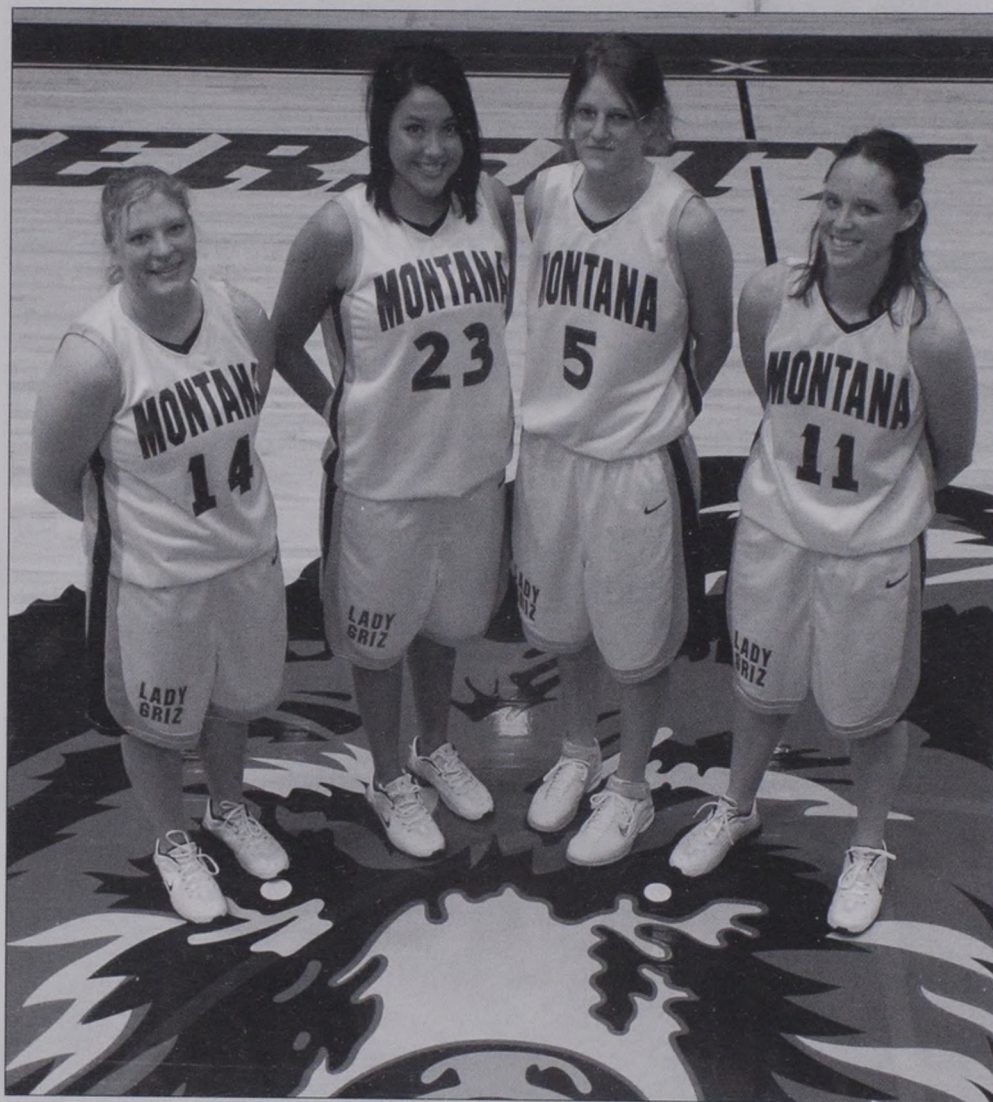

"Laura is extremely quick with the basketball. Her first step is quick as can be. That quickness also makes her one of our better defenders."

Jackie DeShazer (5-7, guard, Libby, Mont.) has had a career riddled by injury after a promising freshman campaign in 2003-04. She has not seen the floor since the Louisiana Tech NCAA tournament game in March 2004, a season in which DeShazer averaged 8.8 minutes per game and finished fourth on the team with 33 assists and had a sterling 2.1:1 assist-to-turnover ratio.

"Jackie's been out, so it's hard to say what she can offer us," Selvig said. "The number one thing will be getting cleared to play again, then returning to game shape."

"Jackie was an outstanding shooter who got valuable experience as a freshman, so we're just hoping she can function and have a chance to show what she can do for an extended period of time."

The Sophomores

Tamara Guardipee (6-2, center, Browning, Mont.) filled an immediate need her freshman season by filling the post void left by Hollie Tyler and Crystal Baird, who both graduated after the 2004-05 season. Guardipee stepped in and started all 28 games at center in 2005-06, averaging 6.3 points and 6.0 rebounds per game and shooting 43.2 percent from the floor.

Following Tyler, UM's top career shot blocker with 297, Guardipee led the Big Sky Conference and was 27th nationally with 60 blocks (2.1 bpg).

"I'm really happy with Tam's play and work in the pre-season," Selvig said. "She's getting to be a better basketball player every day by developing more of a complete game."

"Tam is becoming a much better scorer inside, which is a nice complement to her shot blocking and post passing game. Tam is a force in the game because of the way she can block and change shots."

Britney Lohman (6-1, forward, Bozeman, Mont.) averaged nearly eight minutes per

game as a freshman in 2005-06 because of her defensive abilities and toughness. At 6-1, Lohman was one of UM's better interior defenders, but also showed some offensive spark, including a 10-point outing against New Orleans in the opening round of the 2005 Lady Griz Holiday Classic.

"Britney finished strong last season playing both the four and five for us," Selvig said. "She was that rare freshman who can be a really good defender because she is so fundamentally sound on the defensive end and always playing hard."

"She enters this season as probably our best defender because she can guard quicker people as well as size people."

"We may look for her to play more on the perimeter this year, but she has the feet and is developing the skills to do it. She's a good shooter and becoming a better scorer."

Much was expected of Mandy Morales (5-9, guard, Billings, Mont.) prior to her freshman season in 2005-06, yet Morales still managed to exceed those expectations, capping her year with a unanimous All-Big Sky

Conference selection and Kodak/WBCA honorable mention All-America honors.

Sidelined with an injury for the season's opening five games, Morales returned on Dec. 10 and led the Lady Griz to nine straight wins and an 18-5 record over their final 23 games with her in the lineup. She scored in double figures in 20 of the 21 games she started, with six occasions of at least 20 points.

Morales led UM in five statistical categories, including scoring average (15.9 ppg), assists (4.1 apg) and steals (2.2 spg). She also ranked among the Big Sky leaders in nine of the league's 12 statistical categories and had the highest scoring average by a Lady Griz freshman in program history.

"Mandy is as complete a player as we've had here and a big part of what this team does," Selvig said. "She is so versatile. We can use her from the point guard to the three, and she makes all her teammates better because of her ability to penetrate and break defenses down."

"Mandy is also a great leader. She was the one getting the girls into the gym all summer, and she's the one that stayed here and lifted."

"She had a great freshman year, and she has the chance to be a great player if she continues to grow and improve."

Sonya Rogers (5-7, guard, Lewistown, Mont.) was thrust into a starting role from her first collegiate game in 2005-06 due to Morales' injury and she delivered immediately, averaging 9.5 points and 5.5 assists in UM's opening two games. Rogers eventually started seven games and saw action in all 28, finishing second on the team with 59 assists and averaging 4.8 points per game, mainly by hitting 38.9 percent of her 3-point shots.

"Sonya worked extremely hard in the off-season and keeps getting better every day," Selvig said. "She's probably our best shooter, and she can play both the one and two for us."

"Sonya has point guard savvy, but she can also shoot the heck out of the ball, so we may be able to get her more shots if she is at the two."

"And she is as competitive as competitive gets, right down to getting upset if she doesn't win conditioning things we do in the fall."

Betsy Snead (6-2, forward/center, Gillette, Wyo.) enters the fray this year after sitting out the 2005-06 season. Snead, a strong, athletic player who was named Wyoming's Miss Basketball as a senior, was recruited out of Campbell County High School by the Lady Griz, but she chose to attend Xavier, where she played sparingly for one year before transferring to UM.

"Betsy is as athletic a player as we have," Selvig said. "She has good size, good speed and good quickness, and to make us the best team, we need to utilize her strength inside."

"Betsy has good perimeter skills, but we'd like to see her continue to expand her game to where she has the ability to score, rebound and defend inside."

The Freshmen

Lauren Beck (6-0, guard/forward, Great Falls, Mont.) and Shadra Robison (6-3, center, Billings, Mont.) both redshirted in 2005-06 and will enter their freshman seasons with a year's experience under their belts.

"I thought Lauren had a great redshirt season," Selvig said. "She is another very versatile player that can play the one, two or three for us because she can handle, she's a good shooter and she has different ways to get to the basket.

"On defense she can create havoc because she has long arms, so Lauren is definitely going to be in the mix, and I expect a good contribution out of her.

"Shadra is a true post player for us, and I thought she had a good redshirt year. She'll battle Tam and Sara for playing time at the five.

"Shadra is a strong player. She posts up as strong as any girl we've had here recently. When she comes along defensively, I think she could be a great scorer for us."

Incoming freshmen are Jessa Linford (6-1, forward, Seeley Lake, Mont.) and Stephanie Stender (5-11, guard/forward, Sheridan, Wyo.).

Linford led Seeley-Swan High School to a 15-12 record as a senior, averaging 17 points and eight blocked shots per game, which followed the Blackhawks' state runner-up and 25-1 finish in 2005. A talented track and field athlete, Linford won 2006 Montana Class B state titles in the 100-meter hurdles (15.86) and high jump (5-2).

"Jessa is an exciting athlete," Selvig said. "She can run, she can jump and she has good basketball skills. We're probably looking at her as a perimeter and an inside player, but probably more on the perimeter this season, not only for her own development but also for practice purposes.

"I've been impressed with Jessa so far this fall with what she's done on the basketball floor. You want to have athleticism. Speed and quickness are tough to teach people, so she has a bright future."

Stender averaged 16.7 points, 7.2 rebounds

and 2.8 steals per game as a senior, leading Sheridan High School to the Wyoming Class 4A state consolation championship. She was named the 4A North Conference Player of the Year as a senior and earned all-conference and all-state honors as a junior and senior.

Stender was also an all-state volleyball player.

"Steph is another really good athlete," Selvig said. "She can play either small forward or big guard, she's a very good shooter and she's as strong a rebounder as we have. I'm excited about her potential.

"Steph is an awesome kid, just bubbly and outgoing, so she's fun to be around. She's always got a smile on her face, but she's also a very good competitor."

A Look Back

Montana went 21-7 in 2005-06, the team's 24th 20-win season in 28 years under Selvig. The Lady Griz went 10-4 in Big Sky Conference play to finish in second place, then ended their season with a 73-66 semifinal loss to Northern Arizona in the Big Sky tournament.

Another successful season, certainly, but for a program that's been to 16 NCAA tournaments since 1983, has a trip to the Big Dance become the annual measuring stick for the team?

"It was a good year," Selvig said. "The league was very competitive, and the team that was playing its best basketball of the season at tournament time was the team that was going to win it and go to the NCAAs.

"We would have liked to have finished it a little stronger, but I felt good about how the team played. It's just that you always want a little bit more."

Montana opened the season going 3-2, with back-to-back losses at Florida State, 69-56, and at Wyoming, 50-45, though both were teams that would go on to 20-win seasons and get selected to national tournaments (the Seminoles played in the NCAAs while the Cowgirls were picked for the WNIT).

The return of freshman Mandy Morales came in the season's sixth game, which started a nine-game winning streak. That stretch included a tournament championship at the 26th annual Lady Griz Holiday Classic with wins over New Orleans and UNC Asheville.

Montana's eventual second-place finish in the Big Sky instead of its 20th regular-season conference championship probably came down to early-season struggles, when the team opened league play 3-3 with two home losses.

Those three losses came by a grand total of eight points, which meant the Lady Griz were close to putting everything together.

What started a six-game winning streak and got Montana back into the Big Sky race was a record-setting 105-55 home-court victory over Idaho State, which would go on to win

the league with an 11-3 record.

The Lady Griz opened a 32-point lead in the game's first 15 minutes against the Bengals and would go 16-for-24 from 3-point range in matching the program record for points in a game.

The winning streak set up a showdown at Idaho State on the regular season's final weekend, with both teams sitting atop the league at 9-3.

Montana would never lead in the game, falling 71-57, but would go on to defeat Weber State by 14 two nights later to secure the No. 2 seed in the BSC tournament.

"We dug a hole early in the conference when we lost a couple of home games (to Northern Arizona by five and Weber State by one), but we came back and were in the hunt the last weekend," Selvig said.

"And we beat those two teams that got us at home when we went back to their place, but you'd prefer not to have to do that."

Though Montana finished second, a closer look at the numbers reveal that the Lady Griz had as good a season as anyone in the league in 2005-06. In league games, UM ranked first in the Big Sky in scoring defense (58.4 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.348), 3-point field goal percentage defense (.294), scoring margin (+14.7 ppg), rebound margin (+6.4 ppg) and blocked shots (6.00 bpg).

If it was the hottest team that would win the Big Sky tournament, then that team was No. 3 seed Northern Arizona, which defeated No. 6 Portland State, No. 2 Montana and No. 5 Weber State (which upset host and No. 1 seed Idaho State in the semifinals) to advance to the NCAA tournament.

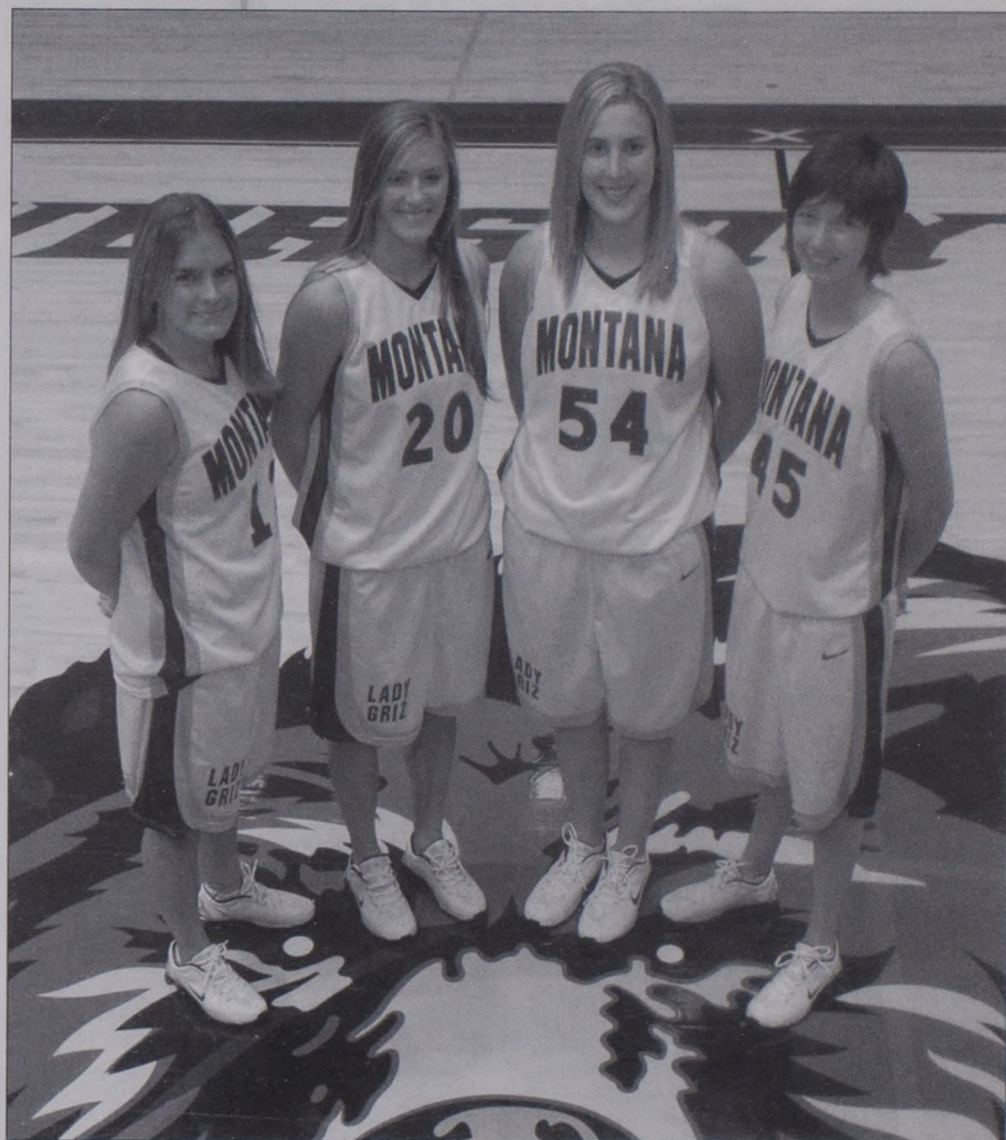
NAU, which received a No. 14 seed in the NCAA tournament, fell to No. 3 Baylor in the first round, while Idaho State was selected to play in the WNIT, where the Bengals lost at Kansas State in the opening round.

The Non-Conference Schedule

The season opens with Sunday home games against MSU-Billings (18-9 in 2005-06) and Gonzaga (16-14) on Nov. 12 and Nov. 19 before Montana travels to Ohio State's tournament. The Lady Griz will face Davidson (17-12) in one opening-round game, while the host Buckeyes (29-3) will take on Cornell (8-19) in the other.

Ohio State, which is ranked No. 3 nationally in *Slam Magazine's* preseason poll, earned a No. 1 seed in the Albuquerque Regional at the 2006 NCAA tournament but was upset by Boston College in the tournament's second round. The Buckeyes return 6-5 senior center Jessica Davenport, a two-time Big 10 Player of the Year and two-time Kodak All-American.

"Ohio State was a No. 1 seed in last year's NCAA tournament, and it's a place that draws people (OSU was 19th in the nation in atten-

dance in 2005-06 at 5,261 fans per game), so we'd love to get a chance to play them," Selvig said. "But we're going to have to beat a good Davidson team to get that opportunity."

The Lady Griz follow the OSU tournament with home games against Wyoming (21-9 and WNIT participant), Portland (4-24) and Utah State (3-24) before road games at Washington State (8-20), Idaho (10-19), Cal State Northridge (10-20) and Santa Clara (19-12 and WNIT participant) close out the pre-Christmas schedule.

The 27th Lady Griz Holiday Classic takes place Dec. 28-29. Idaho and Wyoming will square off in one game on opening night, while Montana will host Canisius (18-11) in the other.

The 2006-07 Big Sky Conference

Selvig and the Lady Griz will have their hands full if they want to make a run toward the 2007 NCAA tournament. The Big Sky

Conference is loaded with returning talent. Nine of the league's top 10 scorers and eight all-conference players from a year ago are back, with Weber State and Montana State returning all five of their starters, and Idaho State, Northern Arizona and Portland State each returning four starters.

"The league is going to be very competitive, as it was last year," Selvig said. "There are going to be a lot of tough games and I think a lot of close games. There could be a handful of different teams that are in the hunt coming down to the last weekend."

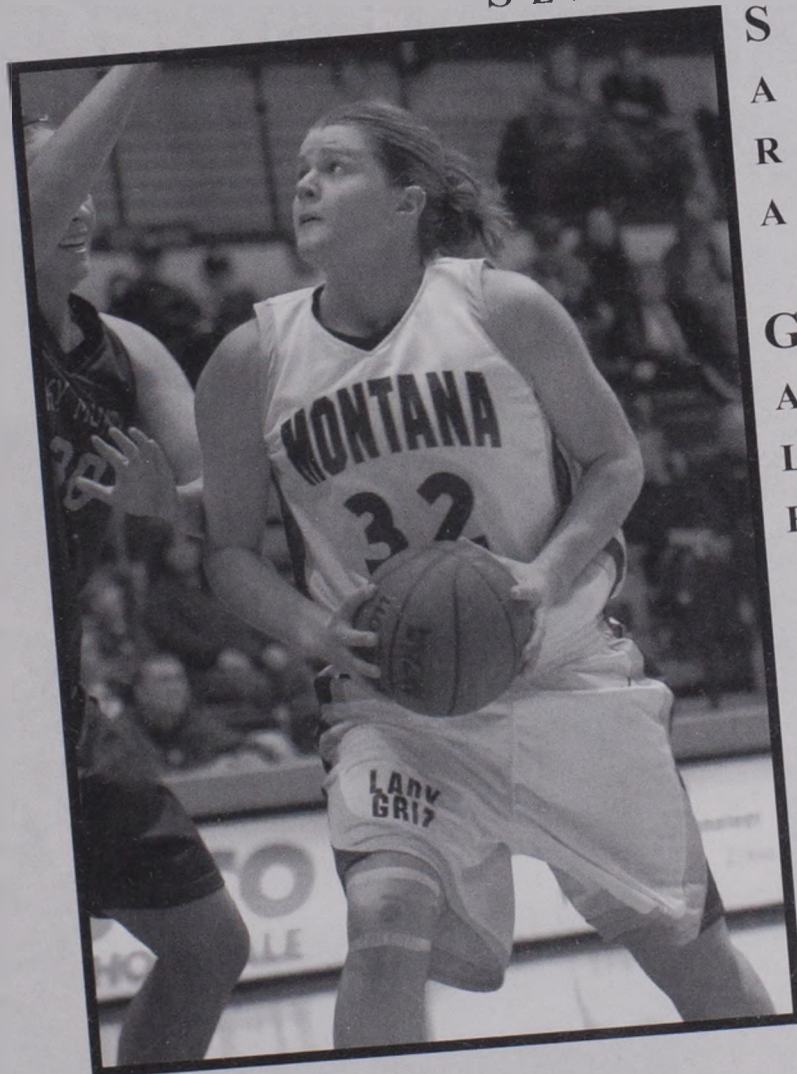
With the addition of Northern Colorado to the conference and therefore a nine-team league, the Big Sky Conference schedule will have a different look in 2006-07 from previous years.

"It's a strange set-up, but any time you go to nine teams that's what you're going to be dealing with," Selvig said. "I'm sure every team is going to feel like there are some tough things they have to deal with."

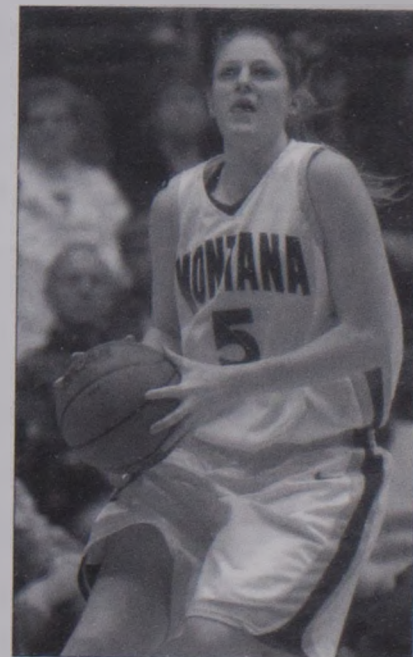
More minutes will only help her confidence, and I think she has a chance to be a great player when it's all said and done. ”

The 2006-07 season marks Robin Selvig's 29th year as coach of the Lady Griz and his 34th year of affiliation with University of Montana athletics. Selvig was a four-year member of the Grizzly basketball

team (1970-71 to 1973-74), coached the men's freshman team in 1974-75 and was named UM's women's basketball coach June 6, 1978.

After nearly three decades on the UM sideline, the depth of Selvig's numbers are monumental. In 28 seasons, he has posted 26 winning seasons, 24 20-win seasons and 645 wins. He has coached the Lady Griz to 20 national tournament appearances (16 NCAAAs) and 19 conference championships, for which he has been recognized as the conference coach of the year 16 times. He has coached one all-American, 10 conference MVPs, 72 all-conference selections and 93 academic all-conference players.

Selvig's .774 career winning percentage and 645 victories both rank him among the top 10 winningest active Division I women's basketball coaches.

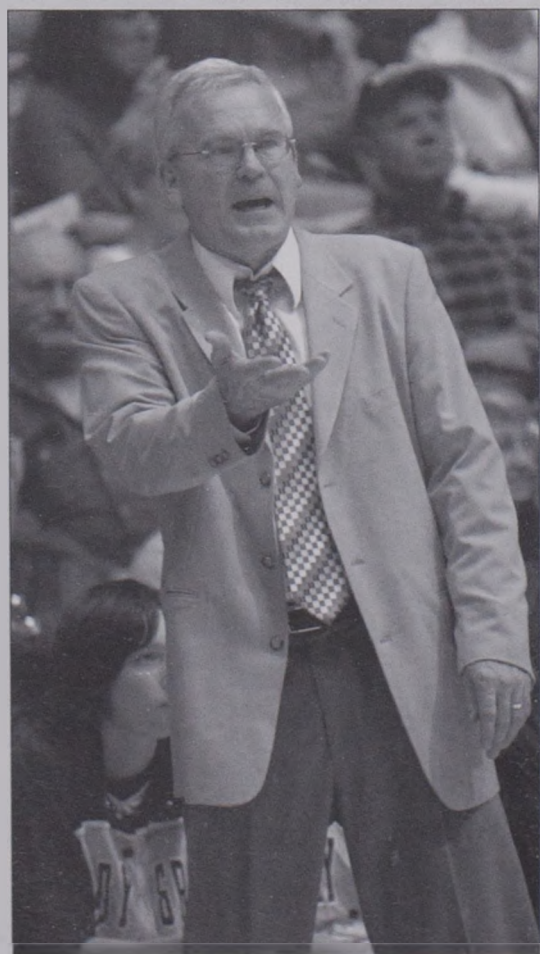
Upon his hiring in 1978, Selvig inherited a team that had gone 11-27 in the two seasons prior to his arrival. Success came quickly for the Lady Griz program under Selvig's guidance and has continued with few interruptions for 28 years.

That success has placed his name among the woman's game's most recognized figures in coaching today, and he recently joined the rarified air of Kentucky's Adolph Rupp, UCLA's John Wooden, Kansas's Phog Allen and North Carolina's Dean Smith.

When Montana defeated Portland State on March 6, 2004, Selvig reached 600 career wins, doing so in just 772 games. That made the Lady Griz coach the sixth-fastest coach in NCAA history to reach No. 600, in all NCAA divisions, men's or women's, trailing the likes of Rupp (704), Tennessee's Pat Summitt (734) and Wooden (755), but reaching the milestone faster than Smith (773) and Allen (780).

Selvig's quarter-plus century of success has been impressive in its consistency and has been done with similar methods year after year: Superior team defense, turning great crowd support into a dominating home-court advantage and remarkable league performance.

Seven different Montana teams have led the nation in a defensive category. The trend started early in Selvig's career, when his fourth team, 1981-82, led the country in points allowed (53.3 ppg). Four more times the Lady Griz led the nation in scoring defense. Twice they have ranked first in field goal percentage defense.

Selvig's 2005-06 team finished the season ranked No. 6 nationally in field goal percentage defense, limiting opponents to a 35.1 percent shooting.

Prior to Selvig's first year, Montana women's basketball games were attended by an average of fewer than 200 fans. The support the Lady Griz enjoy today (Montana's average home attendance of 3,855 ranked 27th in the nation last year) did not happen overnight, but rather was a gradual process.

By 1982-83 UM had cracked the 1,000 mark for average attendance (1,180). Just five years later, 1987-88, the average had jumped to 3,119 fans per game, which ranked sixth in the nation that year, and the fans have continued flooding into Dahlberg Arena.

Montana averaged a program-high 5,235 fans per game in 1994-95.

The Lady Griz have won nearly 90 percent of their home games under Selvig, going 382-43 (.899).

Montana's success in league play (first the Northwest Women's Basketball league, then the Mountain West Conference and now the Big Sky Conference) under Selvig,

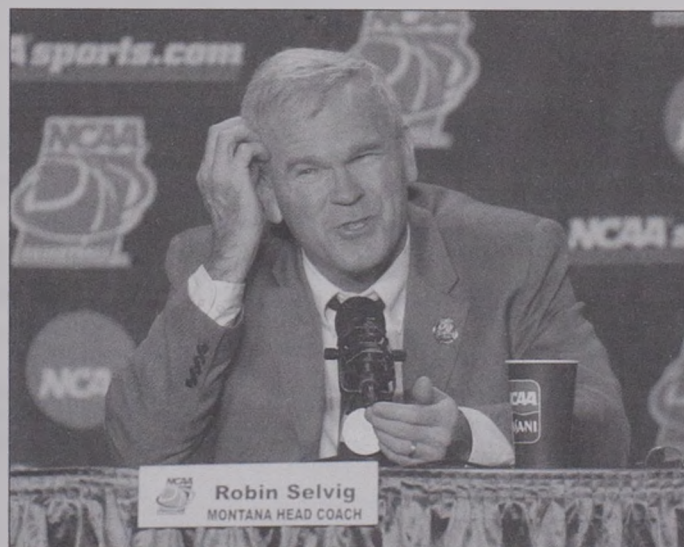

on the other hand, was far from gradual. He took a team that went 4-19 in league play in '77 and '78 and turned it into a second-place finisher with his first team in 1978-79.

Selvig's first 20 teams would finish either first or second in their respective conferences. To date Selvig's teams have gone 341-61 in league play, an .848 winning percentage. Perhaps more impressive than the Lady



SELVIG VERSUS OPPONENTS

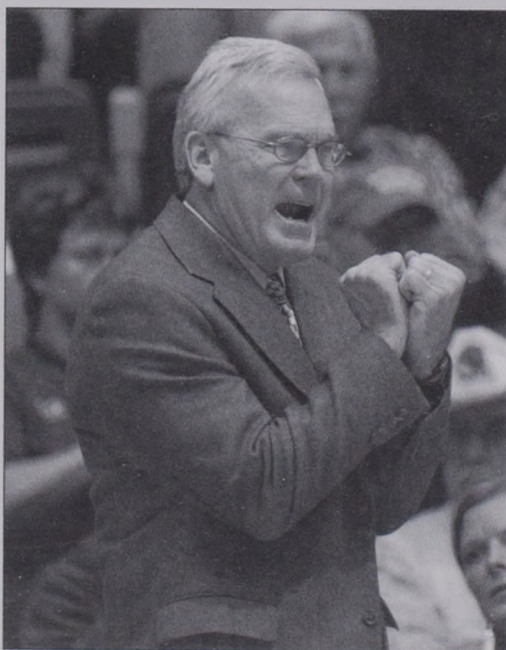

Griz' 184-18 (.911) record at home in those games is their 157-43 road record, a .785 winning percentage.

While Selvig is entering his 29th season as coach of the Lady Griz, his association with the university goes back to the fall of 1970, when the Outlook, Mont., native matriculated at UM as a student-athlete himself.

Selvig was a four-year member of the Grizzly basketball team, earning second team All-Big Sky honors as a senior. In his final year of competition he was also presented the John Eaheart Award as the team's top defensive player and the Grizzly Cup, given to UM's best all-around athlete, scholar and person.

Selvig graduated in the spring of 1974 with a degree in health and physical education and was inducted into the Grizzly Basketball Hall of Fame in February 1983.



After coaching the Montana men's freshman team to a 10-8 record in 1974-75, Selvig took over the girls' basketball program at Plentywood (Mont.) High School, where he totaled a 38-24 record over three seasons.

Selvig was hired by UM athletic director Harley Lewis as Montana's fourth women's basketball coach on June 6, 1978, taking over a team that had gone 7-13 the previous season.

Selvig's first Montana team finished 13-13 and in second place in the NWBL Mountain Division and in a sign of things to come led the league in scoring defense.

Montana's modest improvement to .500 in Selvig's first year blossomed into a stretch of success that rivals any team's in the country.

After going 19-10 in 1979-80, Montana went 22-8 in 1980-81, winning the program's first league title. Those years started a string

of 19 consecutive winning seasons and 18 straight 20-win seasons.

Montana made its first of 20 national tournament appearances in 1981-82, losing a tight 57-52 decision to Wayland Baptist in the opening round of the AIAW national tournament.

After coaching Montana in the NWBL for four seasons, Selvig and the Lady Griz moved to the Mountain West Conference in 1982-83. Montana dominated that league for six seasons, going 78-6, winning five regular-season league titles and four postseason conference championships and earning four NCAA tournament trips.

In 1982-83 Montana made its first trip to the NCAA tournament, losing at Louisiana-Monroe, 72-53.

In 1983-84 a breakthrough for the program came when the Lady Griz won their first-ever NCAA tournament game, a 56-47 home-court victory over Oregon State.

Starting with the 1987-88 team, Selvig would take Montana to the NCAA tournament 10 of the next 11 seasons.

When the Lady Griz began Big Sky Conference play in 1988-89, the success they had in the NWBL and MWC did not stop. Montana won the first three Big Sky Conference titles with perfect 16-0 marks and has gone 230-40 (.852) in league play overall, winning 11 more conference titles.

In February 2001 Selvig was inducted into the Grizzly Sports Hall of Fame.

Selvig has been recognized often for his coaching. He won his first conference coach of the year honor after the 1981-82 season when the NWBL gave Selvig his first honor. Fifteen more league honors followed, with five Mountain West Athletic Conference and 10 Big Sky Conference coach of the year awards.

Selvig has also been named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) District VII Coach of the Year nine times.

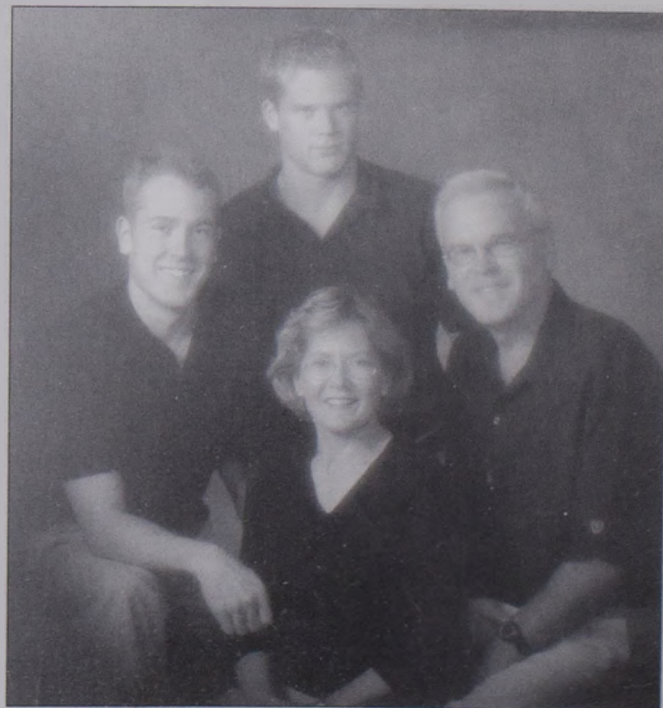

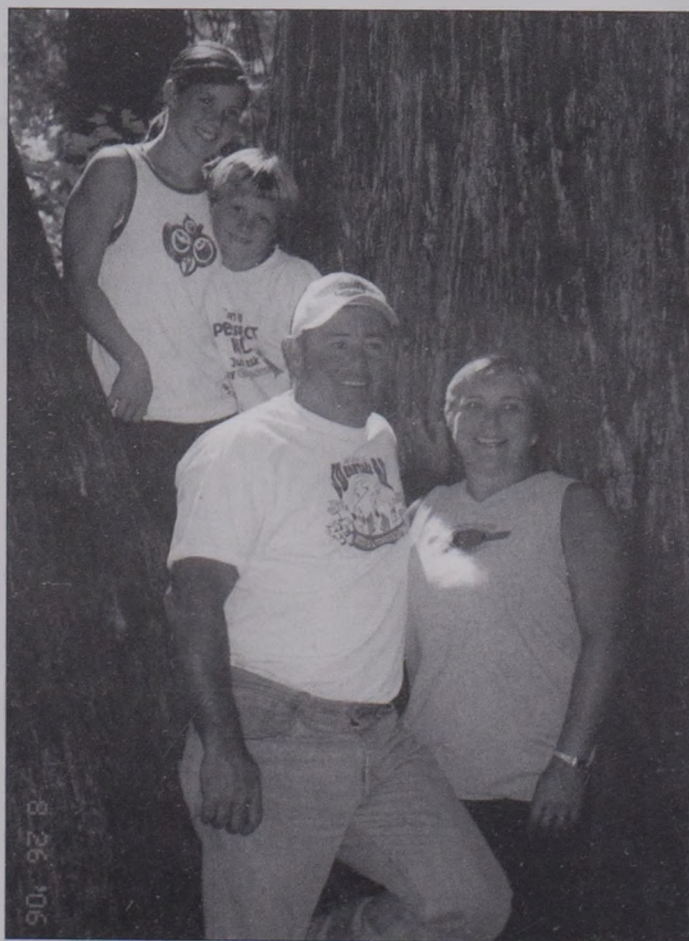

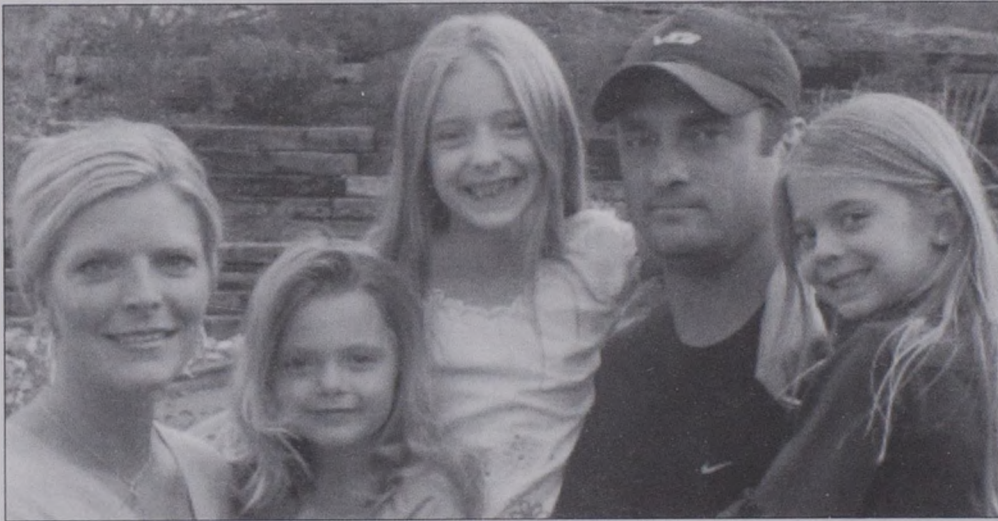

The 2006-07 season marks Shannon Schweyen's 15th year as an assistant under Robin Selvig. An All-American as a player for the Lady Griz, Schweyen joined the UM coaching staff as a student assistant in 1992 and was appointed to a full-time position in 1993.

The Big Sky Conference's only Kodak first team All-American, the former Shannon Cate led the Lady Griz to a 103-18 overall record over her four-year career. She was a three-time all-region pick, a two-time Big Sky MVP, a three-time Big Sky tournament MVP and a three-time Lady Griz MVP. She was also a four-time Big Sky all-academic pick.

Schweyen finished her career as the league's all-time leading scorer among both men and women with 2,172 career points. She still owns numerous school and Big Sky Conference records after averaging 18.7 points, 7.6 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game for her four-year career.

Duce received her bachelor's degree in mathematics in 1993 and her master's degree in computer science in 1995, both from UM.

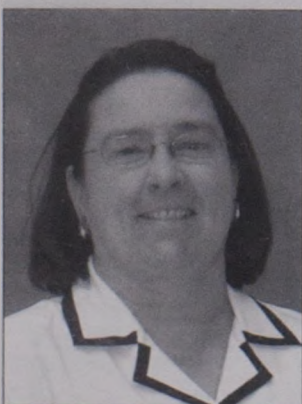

The Lady Griz have had tremendous success in the confines of Dahlberg Arena, which was named after George "Jiggs" Dahlberg, an athlete, coach and athletic director at Montana.

Dahlberg earned six varsity letters at UM in football and basketball in the early 1920s. He was the Grizzly basketball coach for 16 years (1937-54) before becoming Montana's athletic director (1954-70).

Dahlberg was inducted into the Grizzly

Sports Hall of Fame in 1993.

The Lady Griz have posted a 382-43 (.899) record at home in Robin Selvig's 28 years on the Montana sideline, including a 12-2 mark last year. Only a few teams in the entire nation enjoy more home-court advantage.

Montana has had seven perfect seasons at home and another eight with just one loss.

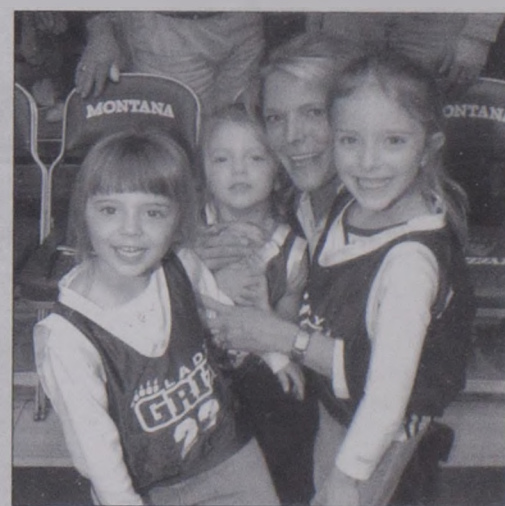
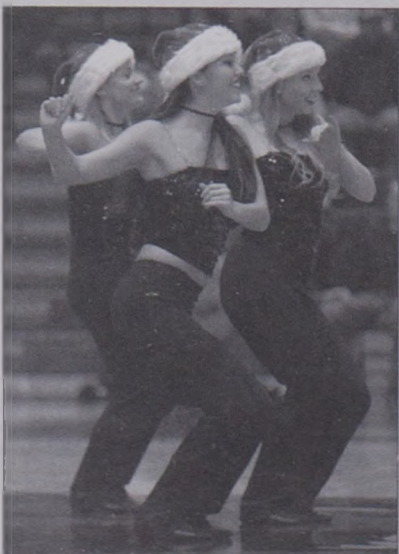
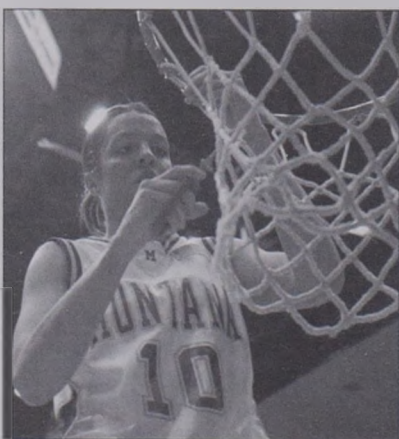

The Big Sky Conference enters its 44th year of athletic competition in 2006-07, preparing to expand its footprint across the West. The University of Northern Colorado accepted an invitation to join the Sky in July of 2005 and officially became a member in July of 2006.

The Big Sky Conference was established in 1963 by six charter members – Idaho, Idaho State, Gonzaga, Montana, Montana State and Weber State. Those six schools formed the foundation of the Big Sky before the league expanded in 1970 by adding Boise State and Northern Arizona. Gonzaga left the Sky in 1979 but was replaced by Nevada. The conference grew to nine schools in 1987 with the addition of Eastern Washington.

The 1990s saw change in the makeup of the league, beginning in 1992 when Nevada departed and put the Big Sky back at eight teams. In 1996 Boise State and Idaho left and at the same time the conference added Portland State, Sacramento State and Cal State Northridge. The Big Sky maintained nine teams for five years before Cal State Northridge departed in the spring of 2001.

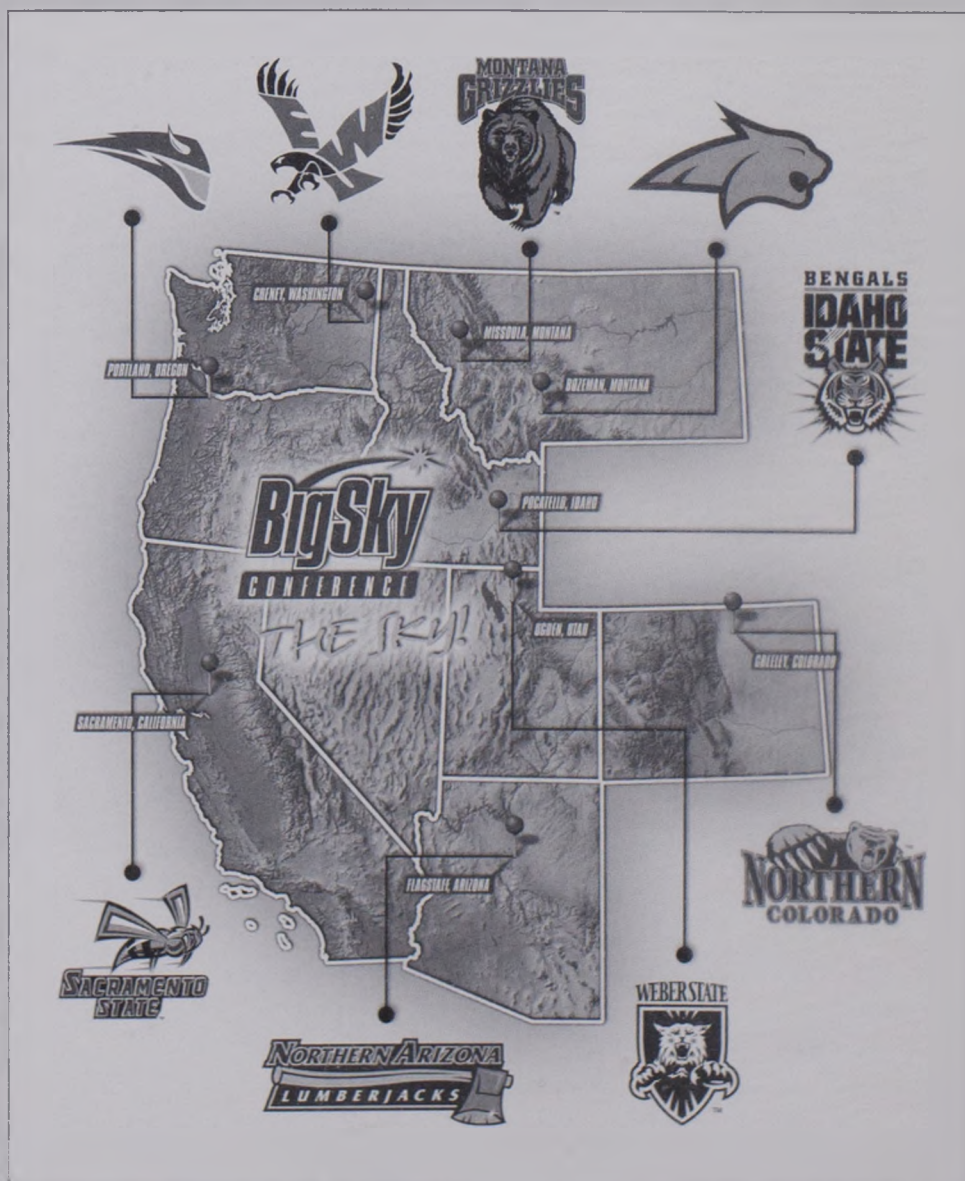
With the addition of Northern Colorado, the Big Sky will spread across seven states spanning from the Pacific Ocean to the Rocky Mountain Front. The Big Sky is represented along the entire West Coast with schools in Washington, Oregon

and California. League schools also range up and down the Rocky Mountains with institutions in Montana, Idaho, Utah, Arizona and Colorado.

The Big Sky sponsors championships in 14 sports, including men's and women's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field, basketball and tennis. In addition, there are also championships in football, and women's volleyball, golf and soccer.

The 2006-07 season will mark the 19th year that the Big Sky Conference will sponsor championships in women's sports. The former Mountain West Conference existed from 1982-88, sponsoring championships for women's sports at the same institutions the Big Sky had men's programs. The Big Sky merged with the Mountain West in 1988, forming one league for both men and women.

Doug Fullerton, the fifth commissioner of the Big Sky Conference, will enter his 12th year at the helm in 2006-07. Fullerton took over the Big Sky on July 1, 1995, replacing long-time commissioner Ron Stephenson, who had served the league for 14 years.

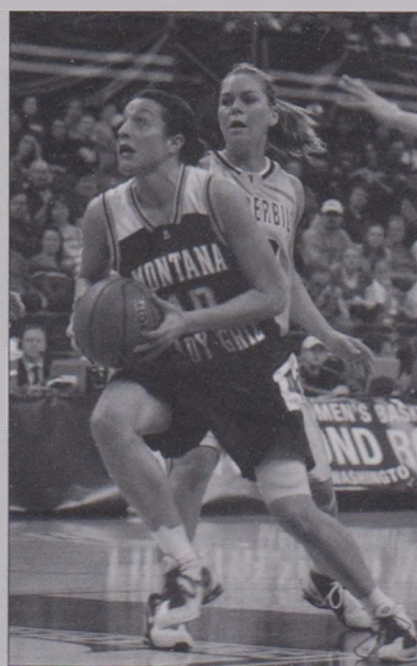

- The University of Montana -

The University of Montana provides a high-quality, well-rounded education to students and a wide range of services to Montanans. UM is a major source of research, continuing education, economic development, civic engagement, fine arts and entertainment and serves as a driving force in strengthening Montana's ties with countries throughout the world.



UM's Missoula campus comprises the College of Arts and Sciences, the Graduate School, the Davidson Honors College and seven professional schools: business administration, education, fine arts, forestry and conservation, journalism, law, and pharmacy and allied health sciences. The University also has an excellent physical therapy department. The University of Montana also includes The University of Montana-Western in Dillon; Montana Tech in Butte; The

University of Montana-Helena College of Technology; and The University of Montana College of Technology in Missoula.

UM owns and operates Lubrecht Experimental Forest, a 28,000-acre teaching and research forest 30 miles northeast of Missoula which provides the opportunity for students to learn tree thinning and harvesting techniques in addition to working on forest and ecological projects.

The Flathead Lake Biological Station, located at Yellow Bay on the east side of the lake, is a year-round research facility and academic center for the ecological sciences. The freshwater research laboratory encompasses 80 acres.

Located at the base of Mount Sentinel and on the banks of the Clark Fork River, the 200-acre campus of The University of Montana is one of the most beautiful in the nation and was named among the top "schools with the most beautiful campus in an urban setting" by Kaplan's "Unofficial, Unbiased Guide to the 328 Most Interesting Colleges" in 2004.

Campus life offers a variety of living choices for the UM student. Dormitory living provides nine halls with various options on campus: a men's dormitory, a women's dormitory, and six co-ed dorms. Pantzer Hall provides four-person suites. University Villages, family housing, can be found just three blocks south campus. Multi-student apartments were completed for the 2004-



05 school year and are located minutes from campus. Students interested in the Greek life have nine chapters from which to choose.

The University of Montana has a nine-hole golf course, located just south of campus. The Grizzly Pool is a seven-lane, 25-yard indoor swimming pool that features numerous classes and programs and has been recently upgraded. The Fitness and Recreation Center, adjacent to the Adams Center, has undergone a major renovation



also. It provides the campus community with three levels of state-of-the-art exercise equipment, racquetball, handball and basketball courts, and a two-story glass-enclosed climbing wall.

KBGA-FM is UM's student-run radio station and features seven-day-a-week, 24-hour programming of contemporary and alternative music programs including news forums pertinent to campus life.

The Outdoor Program provides opportunities for the campus community to participate in recreational activities such as rafting, kayaking, climbing, hiking, backpacking and skiing.



- Missoula -

Birthplace and hometown of author Norman Maclean, who wrote *A River Runs Through It*. Missoula is nestled in the heart of the Northern Rockies in western Montana and is 3,210 feet above sea level. A community of approximately 66,000 residents. Missoula is located where five valleys converge. It is 140 miles from Glacier National Park and 270 miles from Yellowstone National Park. In 2004 Missoula was selected as the No. 1 small town in the nation by *Men's Journal* magazine.

The search for gold in the West and the completion of the Mullan Road, which opened up travel from the Missouri River to the state of Washington, brought people to the valley in 1860. Missoula began as a settlement called Hell Gate when C.P. Higgins and Francis Worden began a trading post to accommodate the travelers. The settlement was later renamed Missoula, taken from a Salish Flathead Indian word, *lmisuletku*, "At the stream or water of surprise." (*Missoula, the Way It Was*, Lenora Koelbe, 1972).

Early settlers constructed Fort Missoula in 1877. Today the Fort Missoula Museum remains a testament to the West.

Because of its location on the Mullan Road, Missoula became a trading and commercial center, which it remains to this day. For many years Missoula's main industry was logging, sawmills and related activities. The Aerial Fire Depot Smokejumper Center is strategically located as the nation's largest training base for smokejumpers.

its 53rd season, bring performances and concerts to the community year round. The Art Museum of Missoula, located in downtown Missoula, sponsors changing exhibits and also has a permanent collection that focuses on Western contemporary art and has been recently renovated.

One of the most desirable places to live in the United States, western Montana has become an attractive residence for those looking for pristine beauty and serenity. Some of America's famous people, such as Liz Claiborne, Tom Cruise, Emilio Estevez, Phil Jackson, Huey Lewis, and Charlie Sheen, have made western Montana their home.

Missoula also serves as a center for education, health care, retail and the arts. The University of Montana provides educational opportunities for more than 13,000 college students. Two major hospitals, along with many clinics, make Missoula one of the state's premier health care communities.

The Missoula community supports the arts in all its forms: theater productions, dance, art and music. The Missoula Children's Theater, founded in 1970, is located close to campus and produces plays and musicals by national and local playwrights for both adults and children. The theater also takes theatrical productions to audiences outside the Missoula area. The Garden City Ballet and Missoula Symphony, which is in

- Hiking, biking, camping, rock climbing and hang gliding are a few activities enjoyed in and close to Missoula. Many trails are within minutes of Missoula.

- "A Carousel for Missoula," located downtown, is one of the first fully hand-carved carousels to be built in America since the 1930s. Other area attractions include Garnet Ghost Town, the National Bison Range and the Smokejumper Visitor Center.

- Missoula Parks and Recreation and the YMCA provide a variety of recreational opportunities in basketball, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball. The Missoula Osprey professional baseball team is an affiliation of the Arizona Diamondbacks and play their home games in a new downtown stadium easily accessible to UM.



Missoula is easily accessible by either Interstate 90 from the east and west or by Highway 93 to the north and south. Missoula International Airport has a number of flights daily in and out by the major airlines Delta, Northwest, United and Horizon, along with Big Sky Airlines, Sky West and Allegiant Air.

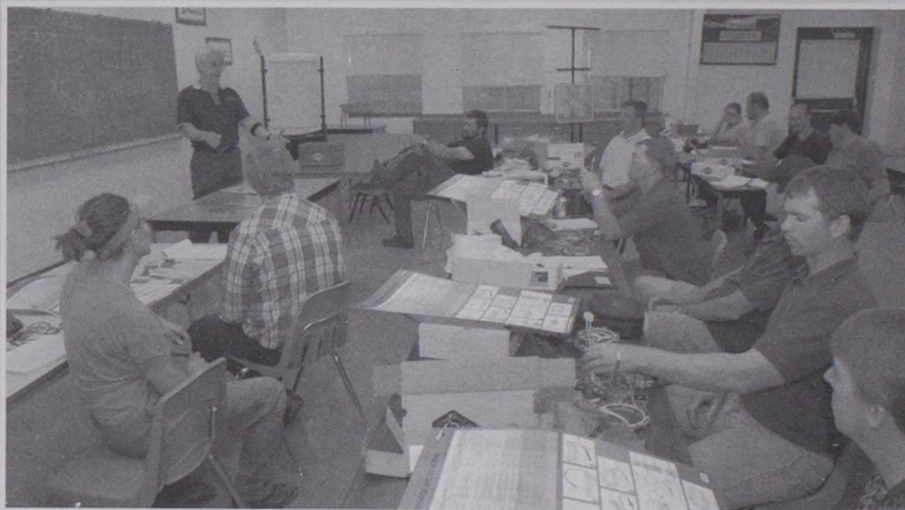

UM'S PROGRAMS

The University of Montana has had 28 Rhodes Scholars and ranks 17th among American colleges and universities in the number of Rhodes Scholars it has produced, fifth among public universities.

School of Education graduates compete very successfully for jobs. Those with bachelor and graduate degrees find teaching, administrative and other education-related positions in Montana and many other states.

KUFM, a non-commercial public radio station operated by the UM Broadcast Media Center, reaches an estimated 400,000 Montanans in central and western Montana. KUFM-TV is a non-commercial public television station also operated by the Broadcast Media Center. It is the western partner in the Montana Public Television network that serves more than 106,000 Montana households.

Ten UM students have received Truman Scholarships. The national scholarship is given annually to students committed to a government career who have superior academic ability and leadership potential.

The Department of Anthropology has the largest collection of artifacts and records of prehistory in the region, while UM's Montana Museum of Art and Culture has the largest art collection in the state.

The School of Business is one of only 480 business schools accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB International). The school has partnered with Microsoft to outfit three computer labs as a beta site, so the computers are constantly updated.

The Department of Geology has a strong nationally known program in traditional geology and environmental geoscience.

The Department of Geography has one of the Northwest's best cartography laboratories where students learn to make maps and interpret aerial photography.

The Flathead Lake Biological Station, located about 80 miles north of Missoula, is the oldest biological station west of the Mississippi. The UM research station is one of the finest facilities in the country for ecological studies and freshwater research.

The Department of Health and Human Performance is one of a handful in the country that prepares students to be athletic trainers.

The School of Journalism has had eight Pulitzer Prize winners. For the sixth consecutive year the school placed in the top 10 of the 2004 Hearst Journalism Awards Program.

UM's graduate creative writing program, started in 1919 by H.G. Merriam, is the second oldest program of its kind in the country and is consistently ranked among the top 10 programs nationwide.

UM'S ATHLETES

A significant sign of UM's commitment to athletes' academic pursuits was initiated in 1993 when former faculty athletic representative Dr. Robert O. Lindsay developed a program to honor student-athletes who excel in the classroom. Since then, UM has recognized student-athletes who earn a 3.0 grade point average or higher at the annual Lindsay Academic Awards Banquet.

Last year 159 student-athletes were recognized at the 14th annual banquet. Of the 159 athletes honored at the banquet, 70 of them maintained a GPA of 3.50 or above, and 9 had a perfect 4.0.

- Montana Academics -

The Athletic Director's Award, which recognizes the athletic team that had the highest GPA over the previous two semesters, was given to the women's golf team for the second straight year. The team had a combined GPA of 3.46.

The President's Award recognizes the male and female student-athletes with the highest GPA over the previous two semesters. This year's recipients were senior Kevin Criswell from the men's basketball team with a 3.88 GPA in health and human performance; sophomore Hanna Richtner-Ahlin, women's track and field, with a 4.00 GPA in environmental studies; and junior Krista Swanson, from the golf team, who earned a 4.00 GPA in elementary education. This was Swanson's second straight year to win the award.

The 2005-06 Academic All-District VII selections on the first team were Jasi Acharya and Krista Swanson from golf, and the 2005-06 Academic All-District VII selections on the second team were Jas Gill of track and field and Dustin Dlouhy, Shane MacIntyre and Mike Murphy (all from football).

The 2005 six-year graduation rate at UM for student-athletes was 63% compared to the general student population at 45%.

Seniors Jasi Acharya (golf) and Shane MacIntyre (football) were named 2006 Big Sky Conference Scholar-Athletes based upon their athletic and academic achievement during the school year.

To qualify, student-athletes must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.2, be a member of the graduating class and/or have completed their last year of intercollegiate athletic eligibility, have completed at least two years of intercollegiate competition at the institution and be a letter winner.

Acharya has a 3.78 GPA in business, and MacIntyre has a 3.31 GPA in biology.

A welcome addition to academic services for student athletes is the Jacobson Academic Center. Thanks to the generous contributions of Curt and Lanni Jacobson, student-athletes now have a computer lab/study room to use during the day.

The Jacobson Academic Center has 10 computers and a laser printer. A small conference room is available for group studying.

The Jacobson Academic Center is a key component in the success of Grizzly student-athletes in the classroom. In addition to student-athletes independently using the Jacobson Academic Center, Athletic Academic Services uses the facility for several of its programs.

Under the guidance of coordinator Laura Hickey, Athletic Academic Services offers tutoring and advising at the center and at the UM Mansfield Library. The Jacobson Academic Center is located on the Adams Center's ground floor, down the hall from the Athletic Performance Center.

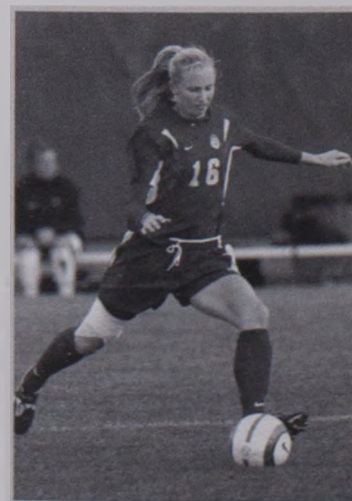

- Team had three student-athletes on the Academic All-Big Sky Conference team.

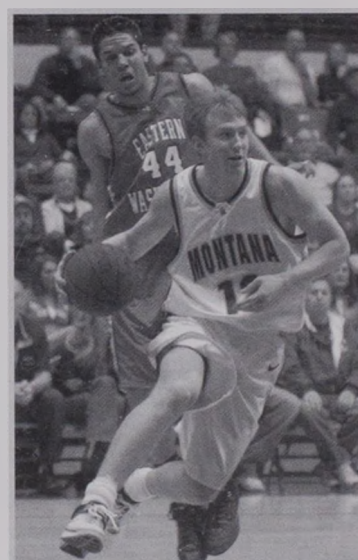

CAMPUS FITNESS AND RECREATION CENTER



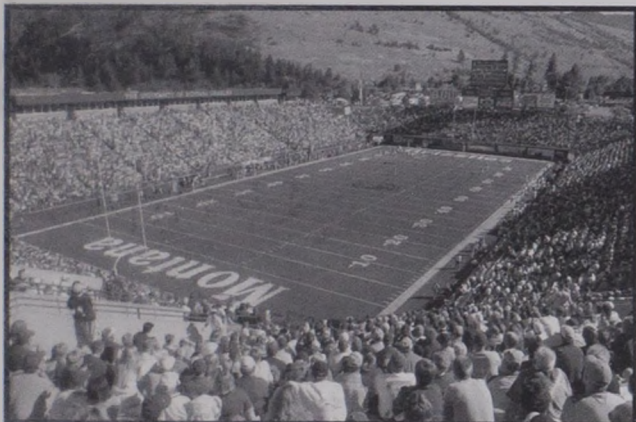

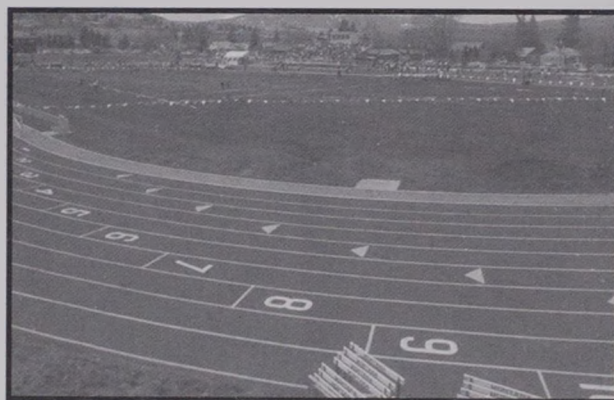

DORNBLASER FIELD



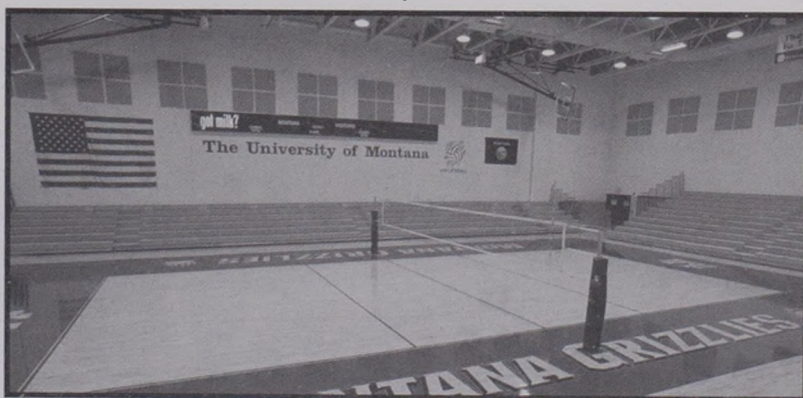
- The track & field venue also saw a recent upgrade with refurbished lanes and new seating for fans.

SOUTH CAMPUS SOCCER STADIUM



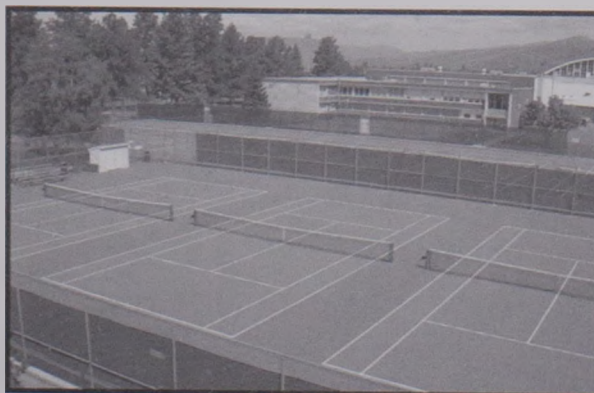
- The South Campus Soccer Stadium features a fully-fenced venue, scoreboard, locker rooms and seating for 1,000 fans.

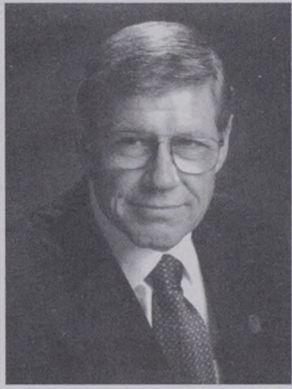

George Dennison, the 16th president of The University of Montana, begins his 17th year at the University.

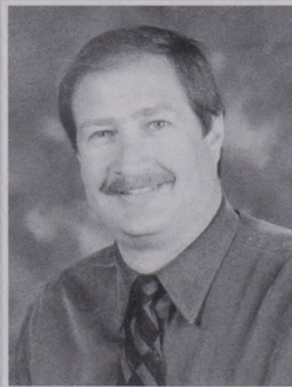
Dennison came to UM from Western Michigan University where he served as the provost and vice president for academic affairs from 1987 to 1990. He spent time at the Universities of Arkansas and Washington before working 18 years at Colorado State, where he served as acting academic vice president, associate academic vice president and director of admissions and records, among other positions.

Dennison received his bachelor's degree from UM in 1962 and his master's degree, also from UM, in 1963 and earned a Ph.D. in history from Washington in 1967.

Dennison serves on a number of boards. He chairs the Montana Commission on Community Service and serves on the Board of the International Heart Institute Foundation of Montana, the Community Medical Center Advisory Committee, the Montana Campus Compact Executive Committee, the Board of Directors of the International Student Exchange Program, the Neuroscience Institute and the Maureen and Mike Mansfield Foundation. He has been the longest acting president in the history of UM.

George and his wife Jane have two sons, Rick and Robert. The Dennisons have four grandchildren.

Jim O'Day, Athletic Director



Jim O'Day became The University of Montana's athletic director in June 2005. He was most recently the athletic department's director of development for five years and prior to that the assistant director of the Grizzly Athletic Association for two years. As director of development, he was responsible for major gift development as it pertained to UM athletics and The University of Montana Foundation.

The concept of the National Advisory Board for Grizzly Athletics (NABGA) was developed during O'Day's tenure as director of development. Since its inception, NABGA has been instrumental in establishing the Grizzly Sports Hall of Champions, the north end zone expansion project in Washington-Grizzly Stadium, and spearheading numerous other fund-raising efforts for UM athletics.

Prior to returning to his alma mater in 1998, O'Day was the owner and publisher of the family-owned *Western Breeze* newspaper in Cut Bank, Mont., for 10 years. During the period from 1982-87, he was a reporter and editor of the bi-weekly publication. From 1980-82 he was the sports editor of the *Daily Interlake* newspaper in Kalispell, Mont.

O'Day was a charter member of the Cut Bank Education Foundation and Alumni Association. He was Cut Bank's Citizen of the Year in 1992. He organized the Golden Triangle Chapter of the GAA in 1992 and served as president until

his appointment at UM. He was the 1991 recipient of The University of Montana Service Award.

A 1980 Montana graduate, O'Day received a bachelor of arts degree in journalism.
