A military spokesman in Tel Aviv says about 70 persons were killed today when Israeli Air Force jets forced a Libyan passenger airliner to crashland in the occupied Sinai Desert. He says 13 survivors were taken to a hospital. Israelis say the Boeing 727 entered Israeli air space over the Mediterranean Coast of the occupied Sinai. Sources say the plane was spotted by Israeli pilots and ordered to land. They say the airliner was forced down after ignoring warning shots.

Other AP news. The earthquake that shook the Los Angeles area this morning has been described as moderately strong, registering 5.2 on the Richter Scale. There are no reports of injuries or serious damage.--The 24-day-old Vietnam cease-fire remains tenuous. Saigon blames the Communists for 200 violations in the latest 24-hour reporting period.
