MISSOULA, Mont., Oct. \_\_\_\_ The Montana Grizzlies will be out to avenge a humiliating experience Saturday when they tackle the Denver Pioneers in the annual Homecoming game on Dornblaser Field.

Two years ago in another Homecoming tilt that many alums would like to forget, the Hilltoppers passed and ran the Silvertips into the ground, emerging from the contest a 61-13 victor.

This year, with many of the Denver players, including the No. 1 quarterback, Al Yanowich, recovering from influenza, the Silvertips are ready to strike back.

Although senior quarterback Roy Bray appears through for the season because of a severely dislocated shoulder, and No. 1 center Bill Harden has been sidelined for the Denver fray because of injuries, Montana still is in better shape physically than ever before.

Earl Keeley has been passing with authority in practice sessions this week and appears ready at last to step into the role for which he has been groomed.

The weather this weekend will be mild with scattered clouds and no severe drop in temperatures are expected by weather forecasters.

Although a capacity crowd is expected, Field House Ticket Manager Bob Dundas reported that there still are many reserved seats available for the Homecoming game. Dundas also pointed out that a large block of reserved seats for the Montana-Montana State game at Bozeman are available at the Field House.
