Whereas, the Elections Committee is the chief entity in charge of monitoring and running the ASUM Elections;

Whereas, the requirement of a two-thirds (2/3) majority for the approval of Elections Committee recommendations reduces the overall effectiveness of the Committee;

Whereas, similar committees such as the Board on Member Organizations must have their recommendations overturned by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the ASUM Senate;

Whereas, the hard work of the Elections Committee in deciding complaints and elections issues can be easily disregarded;

Therefore, Let It Be Resolved that Article IV – Committees and Boards, Section 6, Subsection D be amended to include Subsection E.

Therefore Let It Be Further Resolved that Article IV – Committees and Boards, Section 6, Subsection D, Subsection E ~~be amended to~~ will state “The Senate, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote, shall have the opportunity to overturn a recommendation of the Elections Committee.”
