SEVEN APPOINTED TO UNIVERSITY STAFF

Seven new appointees to the Montana State University faculty took up their assignments with the beginning of winter-quarter classes last week, President Carl McFarland announced.

Dr. Richard M. Smith has been appointed visiting professor of education. For the past five years, Dr. Smith has been chief of the Education Division of the Institute of Inter-American Affairs at Lima, Peru.

Richard A. Faust, newly appointed assistant professor of bacteriology, comes to the University from Purdue University, where he has been completing requirements for a doctorate while working as a research fellow under a grant from the Atomic Energy Commission.

Richard Skok, who has been working on a doctorate at the University of Minnesota, was appointed assistant professor of forestry at MSU. William H. Covey has rejoined the forestry staff as a research specialist for the next six months. He received a master of science in forestry from MSU last year.

Rom J. Markin, who has been working toward a doctorate at Indiana University, will be an instructor in business administration. Raymond J. Fox, Missoula attorney, will be a lecturer in the School of Business Administration winter quarter.

Robert L. James of the Montana State Hospital staff will be lecturer in psychology, succeeding Dr. Sam Buker. Charles Mattill, on leave from the Helena High School staff, will be visiting instructor in education winter and spring quarters.
