10       Students of The University of Montana (ASUM) goal;

12       Whereas, Professor Peter Koehn has been an outspoken advocate for bicycle  
13       transportation at The University of Montana for the last 40 years;

15       Whereas, Professor Koehn advocated on behalf of the Montana University System  
16       advocated for bicycle transportation and parking accommodations be added to the  
17       Collective Bargaining Agreement with University of Montana administrators;

19       Whereas, Professor Koehn has advocated on behalf of bicycle transportation as a means  
20       to use less energy, and has encouraged bicycle use amongst his students;
