A revised overview of the committee's activities is due tomorrow. The Chairman said he was going to write to President Graybill and inform him that the problems outlined before still remain and are not yet resolved. Two additional issues have arisen which are: (1) the delegate proposal with reference to establishing a wage commission; and (2) Delegate Kelleher is going to introduce a proposal to establish a parliamentary system of government.

Mention was made that Saturday the committee would hear all delegate proposals that pertain to the Executive Committee that have been introduced to date.

Lengthy discussion then commenced concerning the problem of a recess and a date on which the new constitution would be voted on. No conclusions were reached.

Lt. Governor Tom Judge then spoke concerning the duties and recommendations pertaining to his office. His prepared statement is attached as Exhibit A and forms a part of these minutes. He also left a file of other supporting date which is on file in the committee office.

Following testimony the committee questioned the Lt. Governor concerning duties of his office and those that could be added if the office were made full time, his duties when the governor is absent, comparisons with Lt. Governors of other states, and the possibility of the Governor and Lt. Governor running as a team.
