The TENTH meeting of the General Government and Constitutional Amendment Committee met at 10:00 a.m. Saturday, January 29, 1972 in Room 410. Chairman Etchart called the meeting to order. Roll call was taken and the minutes were read. The minutes were approved as read.

Mr.Bob Durkee, lobbyist for the Montana Taverns Association, testified on lotteries. His organization agrees with Proposal No. 24 that there be no mention of gambling in the constitution as there are adequate laws on the books concerning gambling. Mr. Brown asked if the people are against gambling but not against removing the mention of gambling from the constitution, would Mr. Durkee mind if this section was delayed in being put into effect? He said no. If it is deleted there wouldn't be any stand on solving any financial problems of the state. It was stated that this would be up to the legislature. Mr. Brown is going to check on the legal position if this section is taken out of the constitution as to whether the old laws would be in effect. (See attachment #1).

Mr. Frank Freeburg, lobbyist for the Montana Coin Operators, testified regarding Section 2 of Article XIX that it be amended so as to permit certain forms of lottery and other games of chance. (See attachment #2 for written testimony).

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 11:45 a.m.
