Introduction

The purpose of this study was to provide the organizers of the first Montana Dragon Boat Festival with an understanding of their attendees and the total money spent by those surveyed in the area (Kalispell, Columbia Falls, Whitefish, Bigfork, and Polson). The population of interest was participants and attendees of the 2012 Montana Dragon Boat Festival. Surveys were completed on-site as well as through a web survey. The final response rate was 395 completed surveys.

Methods

Responses for the survey were gathered in two ways. First, two surveyors were stationed throughout the festival to intercept spectators for on-site completion of a paper survey. Surveys were given to festival goers by random selection so as to attempt to represent the whole population. Surveyors were stationed near parking areas, spectator seating areas, and vendor areas. People willing to fill out the survey were given a clipboard, pen, and a survey and completed the survey on site. No documentation of the number of refusals was recorded.

A second method of data collection involved sending a web survey to participants of the race. An email containing a link to the survey was sent to all email addresses of participants in the race provided to ITRR from the Kalispell Convention and Visitor's Bureau. There were approximately 150 large amount of emails "undeliverable" from the list provided resulting in many participants who could not complete the survey. In both cases, paper and web, the survey consisted of 31 questions (see Appendix C). In total, 395 surveys were completed.

Results

Of the 395 respondents, 66% (249) were from Montana and 34% (126) were from out of state or country (see Table 1). Of those who were from Montana, 56% were from Flathead County while 11% were from other Montana counties. The mean age of respondents was 48.20. The mean group size was 8.86. Of those who responded to the survey, 36% (143) reported that they spent a night or nights away from home. Of those who spent a night away from home, the average number of nights was 3.9. The average number of nights spent in Montana was 3.9 while the mean number of nights spent in the Flathead area was 3.9. Results of all other questions in this survey can be found in Appendix A.

Expenditures

Expenditure information was asked of all respondents. The survey asked that they report their best estimate of the total amount of money they and their family (if applicable) spent in the Flathead area in the following categories: accommodations, food, transportation, retail/services, gratuity, entertainment/recreation, and licenses/entrance fees/admissions.

Table 2 presents the expenditure data of only the respondents who reported spending money in the categories. The mean expenditure of those who spent money for each category can be found along with the percentage of people who reported that they spent money in that category. The last column provides the total dollars spent by respondents who reported spending money in each category. The total reported expenditure for respondents who spent was \$74,929.00

Could we get more boats with more practice times? I would like to see the Friday night event have a bigger room that accommodates sitting and mingling. Did not know there was a program, but thought it was a drop in venue. When I got there, it had already started and it was hard to listen to valuable information and connect with my team.
A little disappointed that the rule of having at least 8 women in the boat was not followed by all teams.
Abrupt hold hard at finish, lane markers, hard to hear sound from tent area, the captains meeting, the conclusion at mashing.
Access to the race site
Afternoon schedule (championship race heats) got bogged down and finals were seen only by a small percentage of attendees. Most people had left by the time the finals were staged. Might need to have more boats available for 5 boat heats.

It felt unfair because everyone else had been out at the start line for at least five minutes and we had to rush out there and race immediately.
General public allowed in team tenting area. We have to leave our valuables when out on the water and they make docking are too crowded.

I have no negative feedback, beyond slowness of getting people parked around 8 a.m.

Someone should be there when the boats load up to make sure the teams are set up with the right amount of men/women ratio to keep things fair.
I wish we could have set our tent up the evening before so we were not so rushed to set up and compete simultaneously. Also, more toilets were needed or else at least someone tending them and replenishing toilet paper.

If you want to get picky, it didn't happen to us, but I heard a tiny bit of grouching about inexperienced coaches/steerers who couldn't keep the boat going straight and scuttled a few team's chances. I'm guessing because of the over-flow demand with 56 teams signing up, a few steerers got drafted who didn't quite know what they were doing.

Fix the registration process so that teams cannot register as recreational nonprofit vs. competitive nonprofit. Also, announce the teams in the finals sooner so that teams have time to prepare rather than having it sprung on them one moment before boats needed to be loaded. There was also confusion about the winners...Some thought the awards ceremony would be at the dinner. Others thought it would be at the event site. Clarify that.

You are going to have lots more entries next year so you need to figure out how you can fit them all in. Put some kind of buoy system to keep the flotilla of spectators out of the way, dangerous situation with them zipping around. get brand name alcohol for the after party, that local stuff was awful, pure moonshine.</p>
<p>That the best two timed teams didn't have a head to head shoot out at the end.</p>
<p>The bathroom situation was inadequate. The port a potties ran out of toilet paper. Parking was a huge pain. And my team didn't finish until 7pm we were in the final competitive heat so it was a long day.</p>
<p>The bathrooms ran out of toilet paper and paper towels</p>
<p>The boats encroaching on the race lanes. Our team was joined into an event where we were racing against our academic competition and we did not have a drummer.</p>
<p>The boats in the lake were too close and not advised to move back and stay out of the track.</p>
<p>The concessions were very expensive. I would rather pay a little more for parking and bring the food prices down. Also, the Bash needs to start much later so the teams that are in the finals don't miss the beginning. The Bash did not live up to expectations. The acoustic country band, while good, wasn't lively enough for a "Bash". We were expecting a party, but it was more of a low-key dinner. Any one of the bands who played at the Lake would have been a better, local choice and people would have partied. More attention should have been paid to the teams present at the Bash, in particular the winners, even having them stand to be recognized. It felt like an event for the organizers from Lethbridge, rather than a continuation of the day's events and a celebration of having the Race in the area. Also, the Bash doesn't need a theme. The theme is the Race itself.</p>

The gun shot sound to start the races. Our team was one of the last at the lake so the time we got back to the hotel in Kalispell, showered, changed and got to the dinner, it was 8.00 pm. Most teams were finished eating. The food had been sitting there for 2 hours. The food was very poor value. I was expecting a few more choices and a meal of higher quality. Only 1 desert choice (pie) and only 2 kinds were very unexpected. As a vegetarian, there were very few things I could eat, corn that was so overcooked that I couldn't eat, vegetarian beans were unpalatable I was lucky there was chef salad and was very lucky to find an extra one. I was very disappointed with the meal.

The lack of experienced steersmen.
The lack of steerspersons which made the day long. Also, it would be nice for the teams to e in specific divisions (women/mixed/competitive wtc as opposed to where they are from (international) as this put teams racing against ones that not comparable. Finally, the employees of the venue appeared to not be impressed with the amount of people or the event itself.
The length of the entire day.
The only negative was the down time we had from one race to the next. I know the boats were constantly running and there were a ton of teams to get through, so that was the reason. Not sure there is a way to fix that. Had a great time regardless and will be there again next year.
The only thing I was disappointed in was not being able to hear my daughter sing the Nathonal Anthem, I was getting ready to race.
The only thing was the parking and bathrooms. Should have been more of both.
The out-houses got nasty as usual.
The parking really sucked. The tents where really cluttered together to where you couldn't walk.
The parking situation wasn't great. It took too long to get cars from the highway into the parking area. Also, the bathroom situation was not good. Porta-potties filled up too quickly, there was no toilet paper in them, and the smell got bad by the end of the day.

The port-a-potties were full (i.e. not full of people) at the end of the day and many had no tp.

<p>The races were well run until the final heat - including 5 boats into the lanes appeared to be problematic. Lining up for the race start was chaotic with no assistance for those who did not know how/where to line up. As a result it took a painful 20 minutes to get everyone pointed in the right direction and in the correct lanes. Other boats drifted into our lane during the race - one boat collided with 8 of our paddles [twice!] and another boat went completely in our lane so we could not pass. When we mentioned this to the officials the response was "we didn't see that". Personally I find this alarming. I actually do not care whether another team was awarded with 1st place but what I do care about is that the judges could not see the race in it's entirety. That is a safety concern! There should be boats following the racers and the judges should be able to see every single foot of the length traveled. Finally, the participants should not have been made to step through one and two boats in order to climb into theirs for the final heats. Again a huge safety issue. There were boats [unused] tied up to the dock and yet we had to climb between boats - this should have been reversed - unused boats tied in tandem and the participants have access to a docked boat adjacent to the dock - not 3 deep.</p>
<p>The racing area on the water was not wide enough.</p>
<p>The restrooms weren't adequate... The vendors were spread too far apart. Inadequate parking.</p>
<p>The sound system at the stage was not loud enough, not the loud speaker that announced the races, that was OK. The song sang at breast cancer ceremony could not be heard out at the doc and where the cancer servivors where as they waved their roses.</p>

Beer garden events to raise \$\$, etc..Porta potties were clean and they have staff come through at one point but then they ran out of toilet paper and they were gross by end of the day. Beer cart closed too early. Tough to have key positions in boats filled day of- drummers or weak steer people. Don't race 5 boats- too many collisions, etc. Days of mandatory practice- parking was a nightmare. No organization and a total free for all and it was a nightmare. The location was awesome but being reminded we were not paying guests was a little</p>
<p>Unsafe methods of loading participants in the dragonboats. A team had to climb over two boats to get into their boat for the race.</p>
<p>Very dangerous loading & unloading boats when you have to climb over 1 or more boats to get into your boat. Also very dangerous trying to load when the front or back of the boat is not right by the dock area. Very bad parking availability, some people had to walk more than 1 mile to get to site.(appeared to be field area that was not utilized for parking) Buses left before end of the races which left many people stranded. Should not have vendors at the same place that teams are marshalling up to be ready for the next races, makes the small area very congested. Also people involved in the races, paddlers, volunteers etc. should not be allowed to drink alcohol during the races (never allowed in Canada at a race) plenty of time for drinks afterwards if needed.</p>
<p>Very disappointed on how finals have gone. We bought tickets to banquet which we will not make by time finals over. Time it took to post final races, well over an hour behind.</p>
<p>Waiting for the participants for the finals to be announced. It seemed to take quiet a bit of time, and then the time between races really increased.</p>

It was known well in advance that only two teams signed up for competitive nonprofit - it should have been consolidated before the event or moved to another competitive division.</p>
<p>We had paid for going to the event in town...The Dragon boat Bash; but were unable to attend as the race ended so late and we had to pack up our boats...</p>
<p>We have not gotten the final results for the last races. Final results are very important.</p>
<p>We were the group which brought the boats! We were told we would be supplementing coaching and steering which we had no problem with. As it turned out, we were pretty much the ONLY coaches or steerspersons at the practices. We were under the impression that Dynamic Dragon Boating LLC was furnishing the coaching and steering and was paid to do so? With the exception of race day, where Dynamic brought in someone to run the finish line video, they were absent from the event? We have attended many festivals in 12 years and have never seen such lack of event staff at an event. Had our club not stepped forward the event would not have gone well!!!</p>
<p>Would like to have a little more practice time, however I know it would be difficult to do. The parking was a bit slow. I don't know if more room is available for that.</p>

Question #31: What suggestions do you have for improvements to The Montana Dragon Boat Festival?

You mean you honestly can improve? Kudos to everybody in your community who made it happen! I attended a festival that was going on its 10th year 2 years ago, and they were still unorganized! We were collecting our awards after the sun went down! The races were 30-90 minutes apart!(why they took all day for the races) I liked the fact that it was close to Glacier National Park, and we got to visit it for one day. By now, you've probably heard about the porta-potties and parking ad nauseum. My only suggestion: have more shuttles and please, please ADVERTISE them. It was only by chance that I saw the shuttle while I was in the lobby that I knew about it! Of course, we took the shuttle; the driver was nice enough to wait for us! THANKS!

You may have had it, but I didn't know about the arrangements that needed thought from the crews, like naming a captain, roll of the drummer, placement in the boats based on size & weight. I think people might have been more willing to move if they were prepared. Thank you!

You had nine boats and we were running 5 boat finals? either more boats, or less per final would speed up everything

Would have liked to seen some bleachers, and maybe shuttle from top of hill for people who could not park in the pastures.

Would have been nice to have more food vendors to choose from with a bigger variety of food. Would have loved to start the final placement racing rounds sooner. It seemed like there was a lot of down time in between the heat races and the finals. Would have like more information on fundraising efforts and ideas for Breast Cancer.

Work better with non-profits from the community. Allow them to sell raffle tickets, fundraise at event. Don't limit non-profit focus just to Save A Sister (they have lots of help with fundraising around the country). Allow all tents to be set up the night before the event begins (so that we don't have to lug our equipment in at 7am).

<p>When the teams arrive with their load of equipment they should be able to drive to the site, unload, and drive back out. If you need to "tag" them then do that, but our equipment guy had a broken foot, arrived early so he could drive to the site and ended up carrying tents, coolers, tables, and decorations. Just because he didn't have an oversized logo truck he wasn't allowed to drive to the site.</p>
<p>Whatever number of boats we get next year, they should plan the finals to coincide, for example in some of the finals there were 5 teams. Since we only had nine boats, we had to wait until the previous race was finished till we could load the boats. If they had just adjusted the finals to only 4 teams, we could have been loaded in the boats at the start and got on our way. No doubt you have heard this from others. That is all that I can think of.....all in all great job done. The talk of the town. We hadn't out of state people visiting and they were overwhelmed in a very positive way!</p>
<p>We would pay more for experienced helmsmen to steer our boat. Hire people out of the Seattle area with experience to do the job right.</p>

Not sure how it was advertised, but there's no way to identify any other team, except for Pink Phurree, as we wore or team gear. Additional, it could've been away to promote the downtown business, most of which were closed by the time we arrived at the festival. If they would've done more than post the flyer, but actually stayed open later than 5 or 5 pm, I'm sure they would've made some money. Instead every place was pretty much closed, so we left very early.

Race and competition enhancements: -Expand the practice times available to participants throughout the summer, maybe have scrimmages. -Message board on the website for interteam communication, this will be a needed tool in creating a local following to the event. Building the community of competitors locally will increase support and funding/advertising for the event. -Make it possible for team resources and sponsor tents to be set up in advance. -Have a way of communicating race times that is more organized and faster than laser printed sheets, a light board for instance. Tourist/event enhancements: Have a separate event for the teams and the crowd, the teams will want something simple and fun and nearby to the event (everyone will be tired from the competition), the crowd will want something big, with pomp etc. That way the energy at both events will work well with their respective crowds. Theme the event with something less stereotypical than "Country". Many of the participants work at tech saavy companies and are not "Country", in fact they're trying to get beyond that stereotype. Plus, an exclusively country western themed even cuts down on the number of possible participants, a mix would broaden attendance. And really do we need one more event that touts how rural we are? Minimize delays in the program for the races to help keep the crowds attention. Have a bus handy to parking areas in Bigfork, even if it's only a field, and other places that have available lots so that nearby parking is available and people don't leave due to congestion. Shuttles only from Kalispell aren't quite enough. Small events with exhibition races throughout the summer to build interest, support and core community around the races.
Provide more t.p.
Provide individual medals for the first, second, third place in each division.
Provide accommodations to rent nearer to the venue. I did not like decorating our rented tent the morning of the races. We like to focus on the race, not building a tent. It was also difficult to find the spot our team was to set up in. A map given to captains ahead of time is a must. Also, start times should be given to captains a week in advance. I heard there was a professional photographer taking photos of teams, however, my team did not get one taken. She was in an area that was not well-marked. Captains need this info ahead of time so they can make sure their team goes to the photo-tent for the official photos. If services like the moose-ages are available then the teams need that info along with a map to the location of the tent. Many teams did not just wander between races but rather worked to disseminate information from their tents to passers-by. The mandatory captains meeting the night before needs to be held in a location that is not filled with extra people. The information needs to be conveyed in a quiet room where questions can be asked and answered. This should be separate from the area where teams are coming to socialize. I very much enjoyed the food provided by Flathead Lake Lodge but I wish there had been more options for food vendors. I didn't even know ice cream was available until afterwards. Have ALL edible items in one area so it's easier to find. Finally, honor the contracts signed by staff for the vendors. If someone has a contract signed to be there don't go around them to invite some other vendor promising an exclusive. It was inappropriate that Cold Stone was excluded given that they signed a contract with the event staff 6 months in advance. The staff should have called Sweet Peaks and explained the situation allowing them to still come if they wanted but not with an exclusive. Contracts signed first need to be honored first regardless of the personal relationships of the staff with the owners of the businesses; especially when the first business IS and HAS BEEN a chamber member for years and years while the other vendor had to join just to be eligible for this event.</p>
<p>I would extend the event to 2 days. When people travel a long distance, they want to participate in more than 1 day. Also, you could add different race options....250 meter, 500 meter and 1,000 meter. Just a thought!</p>

For the teams there was not an easy way to get your team tent stuff to its location - it would have been nice to have a couple of gators to run the stuff back and forth from the drop off site and/or allow teams to set up the day before. Signage for the team tents was terrible...we had to wander around forever just to find our location - a map would have been useful. Signage for the event out on the main road could have been bigger.</p>

For myself, I will not participate next year, just paddle my own boat and join the party.
First of all we had a great time and it was a wonderful event. However, our captain was told that most "everyone" was entering in the competitive division. I feel there should be competitive, recreational and breast cancer survivor brackets -- I don't see a need for academic, financial, etc. This again made for the finals to take way too long. If the brackets were pared down, maybe there could be runoffs for six teams. Also, it would be nice if there were shuttles from Big Fork and boat docking capabilities so those on their boats could come ashore to enjoy some of the festivities. I honestly had a blast and will do it again.

Finish by 5:00-competitors and organizers and spectators lost interest into the early evening. Don't worry/mention about male to female ratio-it is not enforceable and was not enforced and makes getting a team together too/more complicated and a huge hassle-it is the single reason I would perhaps skip getting a team together-people have so much going on and a few teammates (women) had to leave to go pick up kids etc...so it was difficult to find replacement paddlers- especially female paddlers.
Financial, academic, etc - break them up so that they all can start and finish within a smaller section of time, so people can come and go instead of be there the entire day.

Also, starting the races 30-45 min early, made it difficult to gather the team and be on stand-by without a guideline. We were caught off guard with our first heat and felt frazzled finding everyone who had scattered. Steerers were rather assertive and sometimes gave conflicting tips from what we had learned at previous practices. This caused some last minute confusion. Also, we were waiting for boat that was being repaired and in an attempt to get us to the starting line quickly; we paddled full out and immediately began the race. Other boats had rested for over ten minutes. We were worn out before we ever started. Overall, the positive far outweigh the negative and these are just suggestions. Thank you so much!
