UM REPS TO VISIT HELENA SEPT. 5

MISSOULA --

University of Montana President James Koch and 35 UM representatives will visit <u>Helena</u> Tuesday, Sept. 5, as part of a Sept. 5-8 bus trip to central and northern Montana.

The tour will also take in Great Falls, Lewistown, Fort Benton, Havre, Cut Bank, Browning, Kalispell and smaller towns along the way. The group aims at fostering better relations between UM and residents of those communities as well as strengthening ties with UM alumni and other Montanans.

In Helena, the first stop on the bus trip, the UM delegation will have breakfast with high school counselors and UM alumni. The breakfast will be at 7:30 at Jorgenson's Restaurant, and the bus will leave Helena for Great Falls at 9:30.

Accompanying Koch on the tour will be UM faculty and staff members, administrators and students. Among them will be Vice President for University Relations Sheila Stearns; UM alumni Director Bill Johnston; and student government President Aaron Aylsworth.

During the tour, Koch will address high school students and join UM faculty members in teaching high school classes. Other activities for the group will include main-street visits, press conferences and get-togethers with alumni and friends of the university.
