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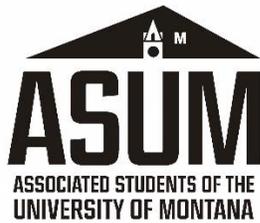

**ASUM Senate Minutes**  
**Wednesday, October 17, 2018**  
**UC 225, 6:30 p.m.**

Chair Welch called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. Present: Senators Akmal, Anderson, Belcher, Brown, Carpenter, Cohen, Corkish, Cowley, Davis, Gregory, Grewell, Hall Hanley, Hiatt, Iverson, Koch, Koerber, Pablo, Parsons, Paz, and Willmus; Business Manager Schafer; Vice President Welch; President Butler; and Advisors Deboer and Renner-Fahey. Absent: Senators Borstad and Hohenstein. Senators Haggart and Liechty arrived late.

The minutes from the October 10, 2018 meeting were approved.

### **Roll Call**

### **Public Comment**

- a. Jeanne Loftus, GLI and President Bodnar's Inauguration Committee
  - a. Theme of service
  - b. Friday, October 26 at 12:30 on Main Hall steps
  - c. 8,000 meals for Missoula community
  - d. The meals will be made Friday from 1-4 in UC Ballroom. Need volunteers to assemble them, but don't have to stay the whole time
  - e. This food will be counted as part of Can the Cats
  - f. There is a sign up link on posters around campus
  - g. United Way has created a Facebook event
- b. Ethan Holmes, President of Young Americans for Liberty
  - a. FIRE has updated the UM Free Speech policy's rating
    - i. There are 5 policies that he would like to see updated
    - ii. Would like to meet with Senators to talk about updating the UM Free Speech policy
- c. Eli Brown, Humanities student
  - a. President Bodnar has emphasized the importance of the humanities and being interdisciplinary
  - b. Provost Harbor has emphasized that student success is the motivator for all the decisions they make
  - c. The financial situation of the University means that someone must be cut, but this system of allocation isn't right
  - d. The administration has not been clear enough about its decision-making process for strategic investments
    - i. Communities of Excellence
      1. College of H&S fits in several of these communities
      2. The cross-listing process at UM devastated the Humanities. Former cross-listed credit hours are not taken into account sufficiently
    - ii. Demand around the state

1. UM fills a need in the state, since other campuses are offering fewer humanities focuses
- iii. External support
  1. Subjective
  2. Emphasizes donations made by alumni. This benefits professional schools because their alumni make more money.
  3. At the H&S meeting last week, Harbor said that criteria were not up for discussion
- iv. UM Core
  1. 75% of Gen Ed courses are offered in College of H&S
  2. English, Math, MCLL, and History departments are receiving cuts, despite being a part of the general education core
  3. Most of the cuts over 20% are to departments in H&S
- v. Too much action has been taken without clear justification, and we need more transparency from the administration
  1. Students, faculty, and community need to work together to focus on the mission of UM
- d. Kaden Harrison
  - a. UM is in a unique situation that FIRE, a national organization, has made recommendations
  - b. The dedication of a non-senator to bring this forward means that senators should look at the resolution seriously
- e. Dakota Hileman, SAL
  - a. Administrative transparency is important

### **President's Report**

- a. Camp Howard, UM Dining Director
  - a. Meal during Orientation to welcome students and families to campus
    - i. Free to families. Focus on local food
  - b. Refining meal plan options
    - i. Food Zoo Unlimited and All Campus
    - ii. Want to accommodate preferences for quantity vs variety
    - iii. Faculty and staff meal plans
      1. Encourage student and faculty/staff interactions
    - iv. Graduate student and off campus plans
  - c. Location changes
    - i. Changed the organization of the Food Zoo
    - ii. Tried to make it more friendly
  - d. Expanded mid-day options in the Food Zoo
  - e. Corner Store has increased Montana offerings and tried to make the environment more welcoming
  - f. UC Food Court
    - i. Noodle Express left
    - ii. Big Sky Burgers and Fries replacement
      1. Students like it
    - iii. Eson Gib is back in the UC

- g. Coffee operations
  - i. UM Coffee Club sticker
    - 1. Funds go to scholarship for students interested in sustainability
- h. Can the Cats
  - i. Collection in Corner Store, Market, and UC
  - ii. Will sell Can the Cats buttons and donate the proceeds
- i. Anderson: students really like the graduate student meal plan. Will you expand options for commuter students?
  - i. Hoping to improve this for next fall and make more options
- j. Cowley: Many campuses take unused meal plan dollars and put them toward helping hungry students. Is this a possibility?
  - i. Hoping to set up a survey to measure the problem on the campus
  - ii. Meal plan costs don't just pay for food but also for overhead costs
  - iii. Even with limitations on the swipe option, there are other options
    - 1. Students can buy food with their meal plans and donate it
- k. BM Schafer: No option for guest passes on the Food Zoo Unlimited plan
  - i. Students with that plan can still use flex dollars for guests
  - ii. In the future, would like to look at guest options with more meal plans
- l. Grewell: The lines for the middle area in the UC Food Court are very long because there is only one person working there
- m. Belcher: big fan of Big Sky Burgers and Fries, and the coffee club program
- n. Hiett: number of flex dollars on the All Campus plan have been decreasing over time
  - i. They will be increasing next year
  - ii. Considering allowing students to add more flex dollars onto their plans
- o. Davis: Are you considering going strawless?
  - i. They are looking at options
  - ii. Maybe going just to straws by request or paper straws, other alternatives
- p. Akmal: vegan and vegetarian students really like the options in the Food Zoo
  - i. Other options can be made vegetarian, but they are looking at how to advertise it more
- b. Kenzie Carter, ASUM Student Group Coordinator
  - a. Replacing student group liaisons
  - b. Sends out regular update emails to student groups
  - c. Will have the office in the old UMP area
  - d. Brown: thanks for your work for student groups
  - e. Hiett: The emails are fun, so thank you
  - f. Cowley: student groups are already responding to Can the Cats email
  - g. BM Schafer: very helpful to have an SGC for student group info sessions
- c. Jaz Dier, UM Allies Coordinator for SIN
  - a. This is a condensed version. Full Allies trainings are coming up soon, and senators are encouraged to go
  - b. Full Allies training is 2 hours long and will be offered on November 2, 12-2pm
    - i. The full training also offers many opportunities for questions
  - c. If many senators wanted to set up an Allies training, they could set it up

- d. Grewell: last summer, all Campus Rec employees took an Allies training and updated the intramural policy to let all students play under the gender they identify with
- e. Email VP Welch if you are interested in attending a separate training
- d. Every 2 years, mandatory fees come up for discussion at May BoR
  - a. Fees must come through us and be approved before they are passed on
  - b. VP of Admin and Finance Rosi Keller will come to a meeting to discuss the process
  - c. Anderson: Does BoR also discuss non-mandatory fees?
    - i. No, they don't have to go through the same process
  - d. VP Welch will send out an email with details about upcoming budgeting meeting
  - e. Cowley: Would like to know if auxiliaries will do their fee increases all at once or over several years
  - f. If senators have questions about the ASUM budgeting process, they can talk with the execs

### **Vice President's Report**

- a. Committee updates
  - a. Koerber: Move to add Carson Cantrell as an SAL for Marketing and Outreach. Motion passes
  - b. Motion by Cowley to approve committee updates. Motion passes unanimously
- b. SPA is looking for information about Senators' hometowns so that they can write letters to the editor during the legislative session
- c. Halloween meeting
  - a. Execs need the list of costume names so that placards can be made
  - b. UM Days breakfast 8:30-9:30 on Friday in UC Ballroom to talk with prospective students
    - i. Send your name to VP Welch if interested
    - ii. Everyone on Enrollment and Retention should go
- d. Everyone should be nice to the ASUM receptionists
  - a. They will only mark you present for your office hours if you are present for your office hour
- e. Committee attendance must be updated in the Drive by Friday
- f. Committee minutes must be updated by Friday also
  - a. It is the Vice Chair's responsibility to take minutes
- g. Library update
  - a. The library hours will be extended, as a result of ASUM input
  - b. The hours are not extended yet, but will be once the position is hired

- i. At the student group info sessions, BM and Cowley gathered responses about what student groups would most like to have in the Student Group Center
- j. Student group info sessions have just finished, and some make up meetings will be scheduled

- a. At least 90/122 groups attended these info sessions
- b. Student group coordinator was also there
- c. Student groups that are not yet approved can still attend info sessions
- k. Final budgeting forms are due on February 1<sup>st</sup> this year, which is earlier than the past
  - a. Hanley: What is the timetable for budget information in the Spring?
    - i. Going to start work on scheduling before winter break
- l. Website update
  - a. Website should go live by the end of this week
  - b. UC marketing office has been looking at it to make sure everything is good

### Committee Reports

- m. Anderson: Childcare is looking at Best Beginnings payment system and looking for SALs
- n. Cowley: UC Board talked about Alpha Graphics and student concerns. The UC Director is looking at these concerns
  - a. Family weekend is coming up and it is a good opportunity to talk with students and their parents
    - i. Sign up sheet is in the drive so please use it
    - ii. Costco family night is happening and will also include a food drive. Friday, October 26<sup>th</sup> in the evening
      - 1. No membership is required
  - b. Can the Cats is looking for student groups to participate
    - i. 213 students have used the food bank this year
    - ii. UM Pantry got a grant from the Montana Food Bank network
      - 1. Also have funding from the Provost office
  - c. Director Howard perpetuated some stereotypes about college students that aren't always true. Not all students have their tuition paid for by their parents and not all students can't manage their budgets. It is dangerous to normalize hunger this way.
- o. Davis: SPA student survey will be sent out at the end of the week
  - a. Tuesday, October 23<sup>rd</sup> is the candidate forum
  - b. October 30 is the student voter day
- p. Hanley: R and A will meet Friday at 5pm
- q. Parsons: Legal forum is November 9 from 6:30 – 8. Search committee is starting for new legal director
- r. Hiett: UCSA met. Mentorship with Renae Scott will focus on online student football tickets. Looking at Cyberbear issues
  - a. UM Forward heard from Enrollment and Retention, and faculty and staff are interested
- s. Grewell: Transportation will meet on Friday at 12. DiverseU is November 1&2.
- t. Gregory: Motion to approve Student Athlete Advisory Committee and UM Emerging Ceramic Artists student groups as a slate. Unanimously approved.
- u. Haggart: Met with Brian French and discussed the goals of university advising. The College of H&S advising center is a new model with professional advisors for freshmen and sophomores and more faculty advisors for upperclassmen.
- v. VP Welch: University Academic Advising Council met. Advising technology across campus is irregular. Looking for an ASUM senator to chair for a subcommittee.

- w. Corkish: Movie event went well. Friday 3-4 in the Branch Center will look at strategic plan and next project. Rick Curtis wants to hear what kind of health professional Curry should look for in the future.
- x. Belcher: Interview committee will meet soon; applications closed today. Enrollment and Retention should attend the breakfast and then discuss advising. Agency committee chairs need to make sure that agency heads can access UC marketing request system.
- y. Carpenter: Met with Provost Harbor yesterday. The Masters in Social Work at University of Michigan is combined with the Peace Corps. Interested in pursuing that at UM.
  - a. Discussed UM Core pilot program and the gen ed philosophy
    - i. She will bring questions to their next meeting
  - b. ASCRC work group is another way to talk about advising concerns
  - c. Sustainable Campus Committee is looking for sustainability stories to publish in their newsletter
    - i. Send her ideas
- z. Paz: Diversity Advisory Council met today and discussed the 5 points of excellence. DAC has 3 openings and is looking for a student co-chair
- aa. Butler: Search committee for campus entertainment director has been decided. Will meet next week to schedule interviews and should be decided in December.
- bb. Pablo: Met with Drew from SARC. Looking for ways to recognize SARC employees and the work that they do on campus
  - a. Has been an increase in people coming in recently
- cc. BM Schafer: Zoom interviews for Admissions and Financial Aid will be coming soon. Open student sessions with candidates will happen and be publicized. Senators should attend.

### **Unfinished Business**

- a. SB09-18/19 Resolution Regarding Administrative Transparency
  - i. The strategy for budget changes needs to be communicated to current and future students
  - ii. Senators must know the motivation for strategic investments
  - iii. Faculty have also informed this resolution. Collaborated with Matthew Semanoff. H&S is not the only college to face these issues. This is not just about the College of H&S but instead about how these investments were decided.
  - iv. Cross-listing policy especially affected College of H&S. See Corrections from Data Office page 12
    - 1. This feedback did not change the data calculations
  - v. APASP report scores do not seem to correlate with strategic investment amounts
  - vi. The title of the resolution may be inflammatory
  - vii. Friendly amendment to change the title to “Resolution Requesting Elaboration on the Provision of Strategic Investment in the Instructional Budget Targets 2021”
  - viii. Carpenter: encourage senators to vote down this resolution because APASP information is not relevant to the instructional budget targets 2021

1. Inappropriate way to request information. A resolution is not the correct way.
- ix. Cowley: WGSS and AAS were both listed as insufficient evidence because neither had been a major for 5 years. It doesn't have to do with how they're being considered now
- x. Belcher: Opportunity analysis is considered in APASP reports and often considered for strategic investment. Their final APASP scores is not a good way to take this into account.
  1. This resolution is too broad to cover the issues brought up. We should look at the issues specifically. Interested in cross-listing issues
- xi. Akmal: This is a broad resolution, so what specifically are you looking for in terms of answers?
  1. I can't know what I would be looking for and I can't make it more specific, because I'm asking for something I don't know about. Want to know the criteria for strategic investment
- xii. BM Schafer: Background information on APASP and UPC
  1. APASP used multiple criteria. Reports were reviewed by several people, but there was a lack of campus confidence in the process. UPC only used specific, uncontested metrics from the APASP reports so that the data was more accurate.
- xiii. Brown: In Harbor's memo, he said that APASP info was considered, so it was used. We don't know which APASP data was considered in UPC analysis because that information isn't clearly available
  1. Faculty senate requested elaboration last spring and last week and hasn't gotten it
  2. Brown has tried to sign up for Provost office hours and has emailed him and has not heard back from him. This is a last resort.
  3. These strategic investments are related to faculty jobs. The faculty feel that they have a hard time advocating for themselves.
  4. Even if students can finish their degrees, the quality of the programs may go down. Will affect current and future students.
- xiv. Carpenter: This doesn't have a clear request, it only asks for clarification. Senate should vote down this resolution and bring forward more specific requests. This resolution won't do anything if it passes as is.
- xv. VP Welch: If senators want to see more clarification, they should not just kill this bill, but could move to postpone or table.
- xvi. Cowley: Why is there no evidence in lines 18-20?
  1. Brown: The people this is going to already know the evidence I am referring to
- xvii. Anderson: Graduate council has also asked for more clarification about this and has been upset with Provost Harbor's responses.
- xviii. Corkish: We all know that students are confused and we can't ignore that. This is a step in the right direction toward getting more information for students.

- xix. Grewell: This resolution may not have a specific request, but I don't think it hurts to ask for more clarification for students. It shouldn't be more specific because we don't know what we're looking for.
- xx. VP Welch enacts recency
- xxi. Hiett: In the past, senators have often worked together on this issue. Why didn't Senator Brown approach Senate and look for help from others on this topic?
  - 1. Brown: Didn't see much interest. A committee is not the right answer. I don't know what we could do other than a request.
- xxii. President Butler: Will vote in favor because it is specific enough. Doesn't know where strategic investment is coming from and doesn't think it's clear enough.
  - 1. We should know how the notes are weighted, since some similar notes result in different levels of strategic investment.
  - 2. Will support the resolution more for clarification than because of concerns about the results of budget cuts
- xxiii. Willmus: makes amendment to strike further, and replace with extensive and detailed
  - 1. Called friendly by author
- xxiv. Senator Brown makes an amendment to line 8. Following provision of strategic investment, insert in parenthesis
  - 1. Seconded by Gruell
  - 2. Brown: I'm giving evidence, so they know what I am referring too
  - 3. Hanley: we need a citation in the footnotes.
  - 4. Brown: Would a senator want to propose and amendment including the citation
  - 5. Hanley: I don't know what citation to use.
  - 6. Belcher: I like the direction this amendment is moving us in.
  - 7. Corkish: Question of privilege, May I use my phone to make a citation?
    - a. Welch: Sure
  - 8. Iverson: I support this resolution
    - a. Welch moves speaker to main speaker list
  - 9. Corkish Makes motion for two minute recess
    - a. Seconded by Brown
    - b. Unanimous
  - 10. Corkish moves to amend the amendment to add hyper link to provost harbors memo in footnote
    - a. Seconded and called unanimous
  - 11. Butler: If we have footnotes we need a more clear title. Also include a title of document being added for those who are looking at hard copies of the resolution
  - 12. Belcher: I support this amendment, and it is the only change that should be made to the resolutions
  - 13. Amendment passes with a placard vote
- xxv. Butler makes a grammatical amendment, called friendly by author

- b. Iverson: I support this. You don't know what you don't know.
- c. Belcher: Like the direction of the discussion. I am still, unless it goes back to committee, I will vote this down. Need a better citation, hyperlink is unprofessional. I was convinced by the author, and think those arguments need to become language and we need to collaborate and work together.
- d. Gruell: Parliamentary Inquiry? Read the speakers list
- e. Akmal: Agree with previous sentiments. I am also convinced by the author. This is very important. We should not kill this. We should pass this, and then move forward with more specific resolutions to dig into the issue. If someone wanted to postpone this or refer back to committee that would be good. I don't want to kill this.
- f. Paz: This needs to go back to committee. Fine tune, and get to where it needs to be, this has support but needs more work
- g. Carpenter: Motion to send resolution back to R&A
  - i. Unanimous consent called by Hiett, Discussion called by Corkish
  - ii. Carpenter: Multiple senators have requested to collaborate and make changes, including citations. This is not appropriate to pass as is.
    - 1. Agrees that the question should be asked but the process is continuously going on, so if we ask we should do it in a convincing and specific way
  - iii. Corkish: If this is sent back to committee, she expects to see senators come to R&A for discussions
  - iv. Brown: It took 15 minutes to explain the complexity of the issue to Senate, which can't fit into the resolution
    - 1. Bodnar and Harbor have already heard this speech from Senator Brown
    - 2. There is not much more information available
    - 3. There is a time constraint on this issue. Other things will come up before this can be addressed if we wait. Senate has to do something tonight or a resolution will not be effective.
  - v. Hanley: Refining the resolution is a good idea. The author clarified what he would want to see specified, and those things should be in the resolution. R&A can amend this resolution to make it effective.
  - vi. Anderson: Agrees with the need for specificity, but if Faculty Senate, etc, can't get answers, doesn't know how ASUM could get answers. Sending it back to committee is an unnecessary delay.
  - vii. Hiett calls previous question. Motion fails.
  - viii. Paz: I understand the time constraint, but this needs to be addressed properly. This resolution is not just about what's happening right now, but will also hold the administration accountable in the future.
    - 1. The author's information was helpful, and highlighting those examples in the resolution would make it more powerful
  - ix. Belcher: In the past ASUM sent too much back to committee, but there are circumstances where it is appropriate, and this is one. The time constraint was not made clear earlier on.

- x. Koerber: Can Senator Brown clarify the interaction with President Bodnar after the speech at faculty senate?
  - 1. Brown: He congratulated me on my training but that was the extent
- xi. Willmus: If we get this turned around within a week, it will be ok
- xii. Carpenter: Time constraint or not, a better and more powerful resolution can be sent forward
- xiii. Grewell: Not worried about a time constraint, but is worried that this can't all be done in a week.
- xiv. Hall: What is the point of sending this back to committee? The committee cannot put in enough work and should not doubt the work of Senator Brown.
  - 1. We don't have enough information to know what to ask for
- xv. The motion to send back to committee fails 9-14-2.
- h. Motion to remove a space between lines 7 and 8.
- i. Akmal: A lot of students are stressed out about what is going on, especially freshmen who have 4 years left in their programs. Students need answers so we know what to ask next.
- j. Iverson: What are the time constraints on this?
  - i. Brown: last week, the Provost told faculty senate that there would be no further discussion. Departments will move into deciding what faculty will leave.
    - 1. The longer we wait from the release of the budget targets, the less attention that will be paid to our resolution.
- k. Cowley: I am uncomfortable with, but not necessarily opposed to, making such strong statements without containing evidence.
- l. Koerber: Freshmen will be able to graduate from their programs.
- m. Parsons will abstain from this vote because he participate in a Faculty Evaluation Committee.
- n. Iverson: This is to serve students and that cannot be a bad thing.
- o. Hanley: Senators should prepare statements about the specific flaws that they do see in the UPC process so that we can bring those to Provost Harbor and President Bodnar. These might include credit cross-listing and budget percentage discrepancies.
- p. Akmal: Just because students can finish their degree, doesn't mean the program is the same as when they started. The quality and content of the degree may have changed. This can also affect retention rates.
- q. Brown: Most dissent is about how this resolution is not the most effective thing to do. I recommend that we take some action, and this is a start.
- r. Abbigail makes an amendment:
  - i. Called friendly By the Author
- s. Hanley: Will predient butler yield to a question: has cabinet discusses this
  - i. Butler: Not in cabinet, but it was Discussed at ECOS
- t. Koerber: Where would you like to receive the description of the criteria?
  - i. Brown: I would like explanation in any way it comes.

- u. Belcher: Will not vote for this resolution. A significant portion of the discussion is about budget cuts, which is not the same as the strategic investment component. This resolution does not address both problems.
- v. Carpenter: If we move forward with this, I would like to see a specific mention of the medium for the explanation. I want the resolution to hold these people accountable. Just because we pass it doesn't mean we will get an answer.
  - i. There should be an actionable amendment in the resolution.
- w. VP Welch has contacted Provost Harbor about coming to another meeting. If this is passed, she will make sure they come to another meeting.
- x. Brown: We have to ask the question before we can say how we want the answer to come.
- y. Koerber: Amendment: insert "at a future ASUM Meeting" Called friendly by author
- z. Akmal: Love the Amendment
- aa. Hall: This still doesn't address where the strategic investments are going to be placed. VP Welch has said that she will hold the Provost accountable. There is no reason not to take this first step.
- bb. Corkish: If we don't get what we want out of this resolution, the conversation won't end. This is a way to start the conversation.
- cc. Carpenter: This is not a new process. We are not starting a new relationship. Don't just pass things.
- dd. Hall: This question has been asked and answers have not been giving.
- ee. Grewell: Maybe this process isn't new, but these specific targets and questions are new.
- ff. Resolution passes 12-9-4.

### **New Business**

- a. Corkish: Resolution Regarding Open Space Bond and City Stewardship Levy to be sent to SPA.
