Three 1958 high school graduates have been awarded Montana State Press Association \$100 scholarships for study in the School of Journalism at Montana State University.

The winners, announced by Dean Nathan B. Blumberg, are Patricia Hunter of Shelby, Wes Toepke of Dawson County High School in Glendive and John Schulz of Loyola High School in Missoula. They are the second group of high school graduates to receive scholarships since the Press Association established them in 1957.

The scholarships are awarded on the basis of high school records and promise in the fields of journalism.
