Two additions to the staff of the affiliated School of Religion at Montana State University, Missoula, were announced Thursday by Dr. Gordon B. Castle, acting president of the University. They are the Rev. Dr. Toshima Tatsuyama, who will be an assistant professor, and the Rev. William C. Crouch, who will be an instructor.

The Rev. Mr. Crouch has been associate pastor of the First Methodist Church, Missoula, since 1956. He received a B.A. degree in history and English from Southern Methodist University in 1953 and a bachelor of divinity degree from Drew University in 1956. His wife, Deborah Norris Crouch, is also a graduate of Drew University. They have a son, Timothy, born July 25, 1958.

The Rev. Dr. Tatsuyama was born in Hawaii. Last year he was New Testament lecturer at St. Andrew's College in Saskatchewan, Canada. He has also taught at the University of Hawaii, Hamline University, and Andover-Newton Theological School. He has written a series of articles on St. Paul for "This Generation," published by Westminster Press. He has held pastorates in Hawaii and been active in civic work and athletics there.

He earned a B.A. from the University of Hawaii in 1940, a B.D. from Garrett Biblical Institute, Evanston, Ill. in 1943, and a doctor of theology degree from Boston University School of Theology in 1958. He has also held scholarships for study at Union Theological Seminary in New York and the American Friends Society International Seminary at Guilford College, Greensboro, N.C.
