PEOPLE IN EDUCATION -- UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA

Law school Dean Martin Burke and Brenda Desmond, a visiting assistant professor in the school, will use \$45,000 from the Montana Legislative Council to conduct a bill-drafting project.

Professor Devon Chandler, director of Instructional Media Services, will use \$21,962 from the U.S. Forest Service to provide film library services to the agency in 1990-91.

Social work Professor Frank Clark will administer \$14,135 to provide field instruction to master's of social work students from Eastern Washington University.

Terry Conrad, a media programmer at KUFM, will administer an \$83,180 community service grant and \$31,062 national program production and acquisition grant from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

Dennis Kern, UM's curator, and Bryan Spellman, the administrative officer for the School of Fine Arts, will administer \$2,000 from the Montana Arts Council to conserve the Fra Dana painting collection.

Forestry Professor Robert Ream and Associate Professor Daniel Pletscher will use \$95,000 from the National Park Service to continue their wolf ecology project in Glacier National Park.

Forestry Professor Steven Running will use \$19,000 from the U.S.

English Professor Lois Welch will administer a \$7,632 grant from the National Endowment for the Arts to conduct a writers-in-residence series.
