Council of Churches Observing Legislative Analyst Observing Citizens for Constitutional Government Great Falls The Chairman stated the dates and times for joint and regular committee hearings and meetings. It was mentioned that we will have joint committee meetings with the Education Committee regarding Mrs. Erdmann's proposal about school elections. Mrs. Blend's proposal to have welfare financed on a state level was referred to the Public Health Committee. It was mentioned that "recall" should be on our agenda.

It was decided to take the present Constitution section by section in Article 16 and find out which should be retained, deleted, or revised. The consensus of the committee was as follows: Section 1 - revise; Section 2 - revise; Section 3 - delete; Section 4 - revise extensively; Section 5 - revise; Section 6 - Revise; Section 7 - revise extensively; Section 8 - revise. Article 19, Section 6 - delete but place somewhere in Article 16.

A discussion followed on the possibility of combining some of the present sections. The opinion of the Committee is to wait until all the proposals and testimony is in. The major point is to have the new Article flexible enough. Mrs. Blend proposed that whatever the Committee comes out with it should include "initiative, referendum and recall." There was also a discussion on giving counties legislative powers in the manner that cities now have them.

Mrs. Payne's statement regarding previous meetings is attached. There being no further business the meeting adjourned. Time of Adjournment: 4:05 p.m.
