Two tax experts from the State of Washington are among the speakers on the opening day of the sixth annual Montana Tax School, sponsored by the Montana State University School of Law, Prof. Lester R. Rusoff, Tax School director, announced. The tax sessions will be November 13, 14 and 15 in Great Falls.

Paul A. Wallace, Jr., an attorney associated with Bogle, Bogle and Gates, Seattle, will discuss private annuities, and Francis J. Butler of Castoldi & Butler, Spokane, will speak on the impact of the Small Business Tax Revision Act of 1958 on tax planning.

Opening day speakers previously announced are Joseph S. Persha of Great Falls, chartered life underwriter, Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States, who will deal with income taxation of commercial annuities; Carl C. Burgess, Missoula attorney and insurance underwriter, who will speak on estate taxation of commercial annuities; Carl Zurmuehlen, Helena certified public accountant, on net operating loss carry-back and carry-over; George M. McMillan, Salt Lake City lawyer, on multiple corporations and the acquisition of loss corporations, and Keith H. Stokes, Chief of the review staff, Internal Revenue Service, Helena, on bureau procedure problems and irritations.

Information about registration for the Tax School is available at banks throughout the state and at the MSU Law School, Prof. Rusoff said.
