BEYOND ART SCHOOL

Course Description: Introduction to professional practices and standards in the visual arts. Emphasis on: portfolio, presentations, resume, web development, exhibition opportunities, grant writing, resources and artist residencies.

Additional topics will cover transition and progression from graduate study into the workforce. Topics will include; career opportunities, resume development, CAA, preparation of job applications, interviewing and public speaking.

Course Objectives.

- Understand application process to professional activities.
- Understand the world you will be moving into when you complete graduate school.
- Professional development for visual artists.
- How to develop a professional packet for applying for exhibitions, galleries, museums, grants etc.
- Professional Portfolio development.
- Professional development for those pursuing teaching in the arts.
- Develop professional application packets.
- Develop Interviewing and public speaking skills

Each week we will have group discussions and one on one meetings to review presented materials and assignments. There will be assignments due just about every week – it is important to keep up with this timeline. Please keep an eye on the calendar of upcoming events. We will go on field trips throughout the semester, so keep in mind that sometimes the class may run over past the assigned time.

Materials: all materials for this class will be handed out or listed on the Moodle page. A working lap top or computer is a must.

Communication: Often during class discussions ideas will come up during discussion that can lead me to change to order of assignments, or send additional information. I expect you to check your email (university or other) every day but Saturday. This is your responsibility – help each other out with this. I know these are busy days – however, please be agile.

Grading and Assessment: It is understood since this is a graduate class, every assignment will be handed in complete on time. If you need an extension, please request it before the deadline. I do understand that much of the paperwork we are doing over this semester is tedious, boring and down right mind numbing. My goal is for us to set the ground work for your professional activities in the future so when you leave the University, you have a firm foundation to work from. Be patient, be organized, be on top of it and remember that this is investing in your future and becoming comfortable with how to move through the world. However, the official policy for this course is if you have more than 2 unexcused absences or unexcused two late assignments, that will drop your grade by one letter. There is no extra credit for this course. I will suggest that you redo assignments until they are acceptable. My job is to push you to complete everything so you have a full tool box when you have completed school.

Policy: In this class we will be working towards 'what's next' and getting you ready to be finished with school. This can cause great anxiety in some students. Please take good care of yourself and do whatever it is that you need to do to keep calm, attentive and engaged.
