#### DISCUSSION:

The first witness to testify was Fletcher Newby, Executive Director of the Environmental Quality Council, who read a prepared statement. (See Attachment #1)

Mr. Fred Wetzsteon of Sula, Montana, then testified in behalf of the Montana Farm Bureau, reading a prepared statement. (See Attachment #2)

Professor Albert W. Stone of the University of Montana at Missoula then spoke to the committee on water use in Montana. He said that he would be available to them for further discussion of this subject if they so desired. The Chairman requested him to appear at the Romney hearing on Thursday, February 10, 1972.

Elmer Cox, President of the Montana National Farmers Organization then appeared before the committee and read a prepared statement. (See Attachment #3) He gave the committee a copy of a booklet entitled "A NEW WATER RESOURCE PLAN FOR THE GREAT PLAINS" for their study.

Mr. Charles Bowman, head of the Agricultural Experiment Station at Bozeman, told the committee that the present statement on water use in the Constitution should be kept but there should be added a definite definition of the state ownership of water and a statement recognizing the prior appropriation doctrine.

DISCUSSIONS (Continued):

The next witness was James Stewart, representing the Montana Quality Commodities, Inc., read a prepared statement. (See Attachment #4) He agreed with the statements of Professor Bowman, the previous witness.

Alex Mogan, President of Montana Quality Commidities, Inc., read a prepared statement supporting the statement of James Stewart. (See Attachment #5.)

The next witness was Clyde Jarvis, President of the Montana

Farmers Union, who read a short prepared statement. (See Attachment

#6) Mr. Jarvis offered to appear again if he could be of any help.

Mr. Fred A. Johnston, a rancher-lawyer from Great Falls, then appeared as a witness on water rights.

Senator Gordon McGowan of Highwood, Montana, stated that, in amending that portion of the Constitution dealing with water, a centralized filing system should be set up, but leaving it to the legislature to set up the actual machinery for this. (See Attachment 6A) He gave the committee 3 more copies of the booklet "A New Resource Plan for the Great Plains".

Maurice Hickey, representing the Montana Education Association, read a prepared statement to the committee (See Attachment #6B) and stated that they were concerned about the state's right to underground water.

Rep. Kosena of Anaconda, Montana, representing the Montana Legislative Council, appeared before the committee but did not testify as he was not prepared to do so at this time.

Senator McOmber then appeared as a private citizen, stating that he did not like recreation being a beneficial use without a diversion.

DISCUSSIONS (Continued):

The next witness was Mons Teigen, Secretary of the Montana Stockgrowers Association, who read a prepared statement. (See Attachment #7)

Mr. David A. Smith, Secretary-Treasurer of the Montana Wool
Growers Association, the next witness, gave a prepared statement
(See Attachment #8) to the committee as he was not able to be present.

Delegate Earl Berthelson of District 15 told the committee that he had introduced his proposal (Delegate Proposal No. 2) to stir up sentiment on the pollution of streams by land owners. He told the committee that he supports Delegate Proposal #127 rather than his own proposal.

At this time, two representatives of the Montana Weed Control
Association testified on the use of pesticides. They were Philip
& Missoula
Donally and Jim Kallin of Superior/ Montana. Mr. Donally read a
prepared statement which is attached. (See Attachment #9)

Two foresters from Missoula, representing the Montana Wood
Products Association, Larry Blazing and Marvin McMichels, appeared
before the committee to answer any questions of the committee on
forest land management.

There being no further business, the committee adjourned. Time of adjournment: 5:40 p.m.
