SILVERTIP SLANTS. . . . .

Mike Shelby, younger brother of MSU center Dave Shelby, was among 6,000 spectators Saturday who watched Big Dave tally 23 points against Montana State. Mike returned from Oregon with the Grizzly squad and spent a week with his older brother and wife, returning to his home at Albany, Oregon early this week.

Among other ex-Grizzlies viewing the Saturday game were Ray Howard, now a physical education director in Red Deer, Alberta; and former All-Skyline center Russ Sheriff.

Center Duane Ruegsegger, Billings sophomore, rejoined the squad last week after missing one game because he was temporarily ineligible. Duane made up some classroom work that he missed on road trips and received passing grades in a course in which he first had received an incomplete.

Montana's All-Skyline end, John Lands, saw his first basketball action of the season Saturday, playing briefly against MSC. He hauled down one rebound.

Curt Barclay, major league pitcher from Missoula, has been working with Grizzly Charley Moore the past few weeks and has straightened out several kinks in Charley's delivery. Moore will put in his senior year with the Grizzly baseballers next spring. Also expected to be back in the box is portsider Larry Schultz, who was injured in a car accident two summers ago and missed action with the Grizzlies last season.

Saturday's crowd of an estimated 6,000 was the best of the season at the MSU Fieldhouse. Two previous home games drew about 3,500 fans.
