BUS TOUR BRINGS UM FACULTY, ADMINISTRATORS TO KALISPELL AREA MISSOULA --

University of Montana President George Dennison and 45 other UM representatives will visit **Kalispell** and other area towns Monday through Wednesday, Oct. 12-14, on a whirlwind bus tour that will cover 15 northwestern Montana communities in three days, offering workshops to students from 21 high schools.

A wide variety of luncheons, receptions and other special events is scheduled to allow UM administrators, faculty and students to exchange ideas with community members and give presentations on economic development, the University and higher education in Montana.

A no-host luncheon for <u>Thompson Falls</u>-area alumni and other community members is planned at Rimrock Lodge for noon Monday. Management Professor Richard Dailey and Paul Svrcek, acting director of UM's Small Business Institute, will discuss how the SBI can assist area small businesses. The lunch will cost \$6 per person, and reservations are required; call the UM Alumni Association, 1-800-862-5862, by Thursday, Oct. 8.

At 7 p.m. Monday, Dailey and Svrcek will discuss the SBI at a free public forum and reception in <u>Libby</u>'s Champion Community Room. The reception will be hosted by the Champion International, Champion's Libby Plant Manager Dan Larson and the UM Alumni Association.

Also in Libby Monday night, UM will host a reception for prospective students from 7:30 to 9 p.m. at the Venture Motor Inn. UM students, faculty members and representatives of the

University's New Student Services and financial aid offices will be on hand to share information with prospective students and their parents.

In <u>Whitefish</u> Tuesday, Dennison will address "Looking Ahead to the University's Second Century: The Future of Higher Education in Montana" at a no-host luncheon for alumni and community members. The luncheon, scheduled for noon at Grouse Mountain Lodge, will cost \$9 per person. Reservations are required by Oct. 8; call the UM Alumni Association, 1-800-862-5862.

A free reception for Flathead Valley alumni and friends is planned for 7 p.m. at the Kalispell home of Moose and Shirley Miller. Dennison will present a University update and refreshments will be served. Call the Alumni Association for reservations by Oct. 8.

Also in Kalispell, UM will host a prospective student reception from 7:30 to 9 p.m. Tuesday at Cavanaugh's Inn, and UM administrators and faculty members will meet with their Flathead Valley Community College counterparts and tour the FVCC campus Tuesday afternoon.

A no-host continental breakfast is scheduled from 7:30 to 9 a.m. Wednesday at Cavanaugh's Inn. No reservations are required for the breakfast, which will feature a joint presentation on higher education's role in economic development by FVCC's Small Business Development Center and UM's Small Business Institute.

At noon Wednesday in **Polson**'s KwaTaqNuk Resort, Dailey and Svrcek will discuss the SBI and its resources for area small businesses during a no-host luncheon for alumni and community members. The lunch will cost \$8; call the UM Alumni Association for reservations by Oct. 8.

On Wednesday afternoon, the bus tour will visit Pablo, touring the Salish Kootenai College
