8       Whereas, The Freshman Wilderness Experience (FWE) is a program that is run by Campus  
9       Recreation and The Wilderness Institute with the aim to promote peer networks, community  
10      learning, and leadership for incoming freshman;

11  
12      Whereas, This past summer 70 incoming freshman and 20 student leaders spent four days in the  
13      mountains and on the rivers of western Montana learning more about the great Montana outdoors  
14      as well as becoming more engaged with the University of Montana (UM) community;

15  
16      Whereas, Of the 70 students who participated, 96% agreed that the FWE allowed them to build  
17      interpersonal relationships, 90% agreed that they felt better prepared to be a student at UM and  
18      100% would recommend the FWE to incoming freshman;

19  
20      Whereas, Continuing this program may be vital to retention at UM, evidenced by a study of a  
21      similar program at Sam Houston State University, which indicated that such programs could  
22      increase retention rates by about 10%;

24      Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, that the Associated Students of the University of Montana  
25      (ASUM) supports the continuation of the Freshman Wilderness Experience;
