Price - Thompson moved to approve the minutes of the March 6, 1991, meeting as written.

President's Report

- a. Warden reported on the student status of the Kaimin Business Manager.
- b. Warden announced that the auxiliary resolution presentation will be made at the next Regents' meeting, which is Friday, March 22.

On Wednesday, March 20, ASUM will host a "kick 'em out" party from 2-4 p.m. in the ASUM office.

- c. Warden announced that he has almost completed moving his things out of his office and thanked his fellow executives, office manager, directors and senators for a good year.

Vice President's Report

- a. Women's Rugby requested a \$300 Special Allocation to enable them to attend and represent the U of M at the National Collegiate Championship in Washington, D.C. (Exhibit A). Motion carried.

- a. Mark Vessar announced a meeting between the Auxiliary Services Committee and the administration at 5 p.m. Thursday, March 14.
- b. Krystin Deschamps reported that SLA will sponsor a letter-writing campaign to legislators regarding capping of enrollment. Packets will be ready next week.

- d. Paula Rosenthal said that FIC will have a report on computers to the senators by the end of the week.

New Business



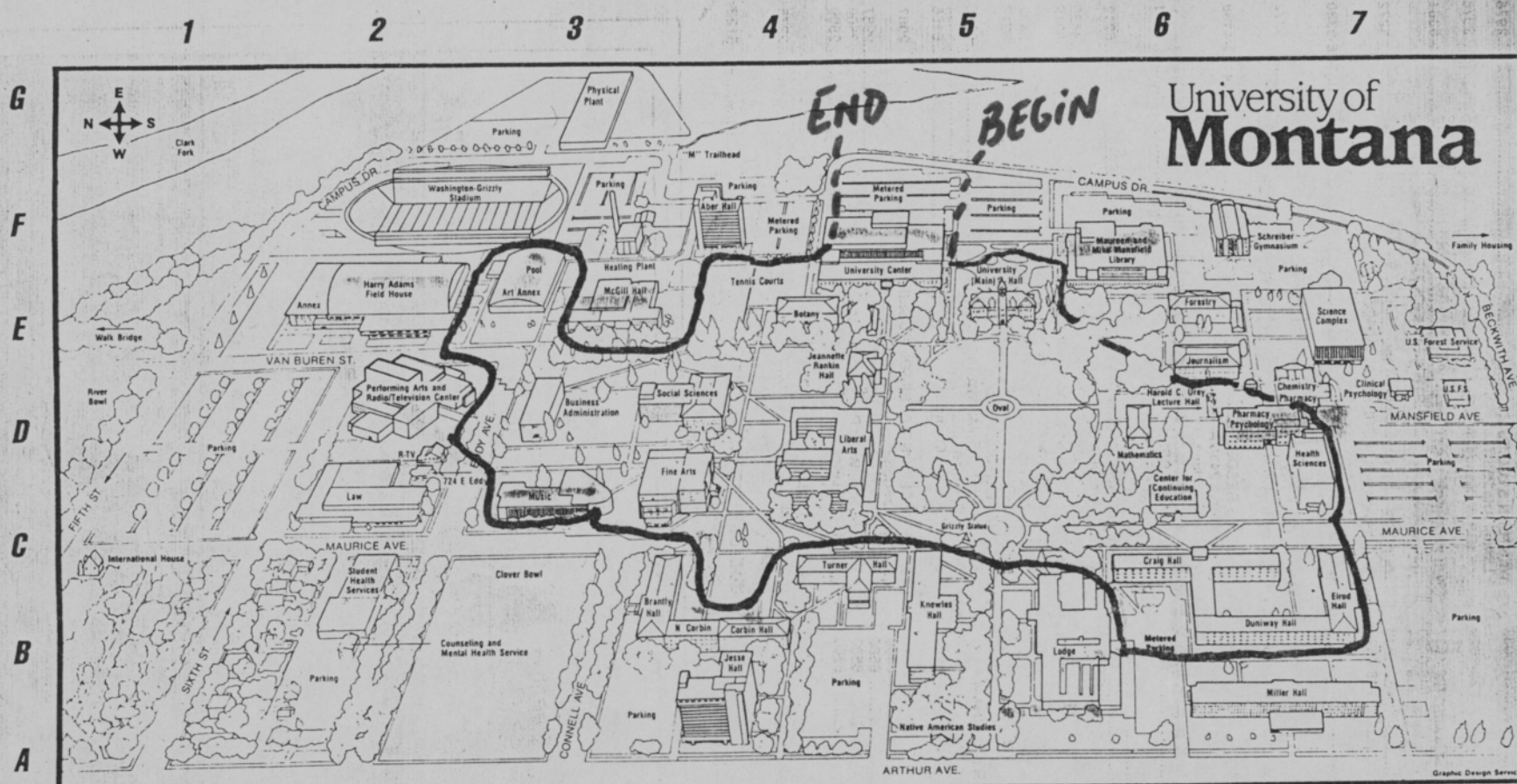
