The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Margaret Warden in the absence of Mr. Toole.

Mr. Rick Champoux stated that he was appearing before the P.I. Committee not as a Committee member but as a disturbed college professor on behalf of a group of interns who are being denied the learning experience they were promised, referring to the interns in the Public Information Office, four of who were present at this meeting.
