MUSI 102A, Section 21 Register for 1 credit, which is a half-hour weekly lesson.

Overview

Students receive weekly one-on-one voice lessons from an instructor where they develop vocal technique and musicianship that will give them more confidence and appreciation of their singing. In lessons, students will learn exercises to improve their singing as well as songs in a variety of styles. The instructor will select songs based on the student's skill level and tastes, but also to broaden their understanding of different musical and vocal styles. The selection of songs can also be done collaboratively between the student and instructor. It is very important for students to practice their singing and study their songs outside of the weekly lesson. Just as you would study for academic classes, musicians must take the information covered in lessons and apply them in individual practice. Practice rooms are located on the lower level of the music building and are accessible through a key code, which can be obtained from the Music Office.

Goals/Learning Outcomes

In addition to developing technique and artistry, the primary goal of these lessons is to build upon each student's strengths and individuality. Regardless of the repertoire you will sing, all students learn a technique that is based on healthy, efficient singing and beauty of tone.

Your main goal, simply put, should be to improve at a steady rate. Certain aspects of singing take longer to assimilate than others. Therefore, you should approach your lessons and practice sessions with a blend of diligence and patience. Simply put, you should finish the semester a better singer than you were at the beginning. You should notice definite improvements in all aspects of vocal technique (posture and breathing, range, beauty of tone, flexibility of style, control of registration and dynamics, and freedom from tension) as well as artistry (character and communication, confidence, emotive ability).

Making music is one of life's greatest joys. Making music will not only give personal satisfaction, it will unleash your creativity, enhance your collaborative and communicative skills, and improve readiness for a variety of careers. Singing is universal and an important aspect in all cultures, and can deepen your appreciation of the human condition. Singing is also physical and will heighten your awareness of how your body coordinates posture, breathing, phonation, and articulation.

- A strong desire to learn and improve.
- A willingness to try new things.
