Course outcomes, objectives and activities:

In this course a student will develop and practice skills needed for performing in the lyric theater.

They are asked to show *discipline* and *demonstrate professional responsibility* by learning their individual assigned roles. This work will demonstrate their *preparedness*. Classroom time is then devoted to the joyful task of *collaboration* and developing *creativity* and *initiative* as music is rehearsed together and staged. A consistent process of assessment throughout allows students to reflect on their work and strategize with colleagues on further steps towards a desired result.

Students will perform the scenes they have learned, exercising their skills at artistic communication.

Students rehearse and perform assigned scenes and roles from opera, operetta and musicals. Students also assist in assembling and preparing costumes, props and set, and serve as stage crew.

Students are required to learn their individual assignments outside of class, so that rehearsal time is devoted to developing good ensemble with other members of the scene. In order to maintain *accountability*, tudents must abide by given deadlines for notes learned and memorization, or grade will be lowered.

Rehearsal schedule will be posted on Moodle. Check ahead of rehearsal time to see *where* rehearsal will be...sometimes sessions are moved because of events such as Concert Band Festival.

If you miss a costume fitting without calling the costume shop *in advance* (243-5271, STD 728-1911, MCT) your grade will drop to a C (if you have an A otherwise).

Attendance:

Any absence may result in the lowering of the student's grade. To be excused, you must speak to Professor Basinski before the class/rehearsal in question – she will then decide, based on your reason for missing, whether the absence is excused or not. Missing a dress or tech rehearsal or performance will result in failing grade, except in extreme cases.

All students are required to help with strike and clean up after performances.

Students are expected to be prepared, respectful, polite and cooperative. If not, this is grounds for possible failure/expulsion from group.

Every cast member is required to help clear after performances, and strike after final performances.

Grading:

Memorization by required date: 25%

Performance: 25%.

Conduct: Poor conduct can override other components of grade

Unexcused missed rehearsals will result in lowered grade.

Missing performance or strike will result in failing grade
