The Law School Admission Test, required of applicants for admission to the Montana State University Law School, will be given on the MSU campus, Missoula, on Nov. 14, 1959, and again in February, April, and August 1960, Dean Robert E. Sullivan announced.

The test will be given on these dates at more than 100 testing centers, the dean said. Most American law schools require applicants to take the test, which is prepared and administered by the Educational Testing Service of Princeton, N. J.

A candidate must make separate application for admission to each law school of his choice and should inquire whether the school requires him to take the Law School Admission Test, Dean Sullivan said. Candidates for admission to next year's classes are advised to take either the November or February test, he added.

The test is made up of objective questions measuring verbal aptitudes and reasoning ability rather than acquired information, according to the dean. Test results give a student an indication of whether he is suited to the study of law and likely to succeed in it.

Sample questions and information about registration for the test are given in a bulletin of information that can be obtained from the MSU Law School or from Educational Testing Service, 20 Nassau St., Princeton, N. J.

Dean Sullivan said the bulletin, which includes an application form, should be obtained from four to six weeks in advance of the test date. Completed applications must be received by the Educational Testing Service at Princeton at least two weeks before the time of the test.
