■ **EYE ON THE LEGISLATURE** -- Recent news reports have said that modem-enhanced computers have made it easier than ever before to follow the Montana Legislature. But does that mean the state's technological neophytes will be left unaware? Not necessarily, says Chris Mullin, special collections librarian at the Mansfield Library at The University of Montana - Missoula. Mullin can access the state bulletin board from the computer at his desk in the library's Montana Room. As his schedule allows, Mullin can help patrons who need assistance following pending bills. Operating the state bulletin board is more difficult than it sounds, and even experienced computer users may need help, he says. And for those who aren't ready for high tech? Paper copies of all bills are available at the library one or two days after they're posted on the bulletin board, Mullin says.
